Busy as a Beaver

Getting Busier by Evan Kramer

The south coast is coming out of winter hibernation at a quickening rate. We have been flooded with information about all kinds of upcoming activities in our area.

On Thursday, March 4 the Common Good holds its annual meeting starting at 4:30pm in the Port Orford City Hall council chambers. The meeting is open to everyone and is a good opportunity to learn more about the workings of this most worthwhile of community organizations. That same evening the Port Orford community theater group holds its second meeting at 7:00 pm at the Port & Starboard. They're planning to put on a play during the Fourth of July Jubilee.

This Saturday evening Rick Cook presents his first art show of the year at the Cook Gallery. Entitled **Exiled** the show runs from March 6 through March 21 starting with an artist reception on March 6 from 6:00-9:00 pm. Cook spoke about the theme for his first show of 1993. He said we've all come here from another place, that in a sense we're all exiled from other communities and lifestyles by choice. Then again, there are many exiles in our society, including Native Americans, who are where they are but not by their choice. The artist is often the social consciousness of the community and, therefore, is exiled from the mainstream community, though Cook thinks this is less true now than in past years.

A dozen or so artists are participating in

this show including Kirk Day, Julie Hawthorne, Sharon Leahy, James Nowak, Walter Nicoles, Karin Richardson, Eden Vale Stevens and Sonja Wold among others. This is a good opportunity to see what many of these artists are doing and meet them in a relaxed party like atmosphere.

The Curry County Fairgrounds in Gold Beach is also presenting a full schedule of events. Next Saturday, March 13, they're presenting indoor outlaw carts exhibition races. The following day they've got a biggie for Gold Beach! Noted country recording star **Dan Seals** will perform at the indoor pavilion arena at 3:00 pm. We've been told the limited number of reserved seats are already sold out but there are plenty of general admission tickets at \$10 per person available. Tickets are available locally at Chetco Credit Union or in Gold Beach at the Jumpback Deli. This concert has been put together by Sharon Adcock and is a recovery benefit concert for the Sheriff's Search and Rescue unit. The Search and Rescue unit

recently put on a benefit concert starring the Marcy Brothers. It drew nearly 900 well-satisfied people but failed to make a profit for search and rescue. This time around I hope they can pack the arena to the rafters for Dan Seals and put some money in the bank for needed supplies for the volunteer unit.

The following weekend the Fairgrounds hosts the horses. On Saturday, March 20 jackpot barrel racing takes place starting with sign-ups at 9:00am. There will be pre race activity the previous evening from 6:00-9:00pm.

Closer to Port Orford, Project Graduation presents Auction 93 and **All You Can Eat Dessert** on Saturday, March 13, at 7:00pm in the Port Orford Community Building. The proceeds are used to fund the 1993 Pacific High School senior class **drug and alcohol free graduation party**. They deserve this party. It marks the end of their 4 years of study at Pacific High and the beginning of their college years and continuance of work experience.
