Port Orford Arts Festival '93 by Evan Kramer

It's been a year in the planning and this weekend the tree bears fruit. The three day festival of the arts takes place at 21 sites from the Roaring Sea Gallery just south of Port Orford to the Rain Coast Arts gallery in Langlois on the north.

Eight of the locations taking part in Arts Festival '93 are north of Port Orford starting with two sites along on Elk River Road. They include wood carving demonstrations at the Jerry Stoope's studio and a whole host of goings on at the Steelblue Chameleon Lodge including the junk sculpture exhibition and some mighty good eating at the bistro. Continuing up Highway 101 our next stop is the Hughes House located on Cape Blanco Road. The restored Victorian home keeps getting better every visit and this year is no exception. Continuing into the Sixes area a nice automobile trip 8 1/2 miles up the Sixes River leads to the glass studios of Chris Hawthorne and the recently opened James Nowak studio. Both will be open for glass blowing demonstrations and are the kinds of events people talk about for a long time. Another new addition to the Arts Festival is the Sixes River Hotel where there will be a pastel painting exhibition. Back out on Highway 101-headed north you can stop at A&T Myrtlewood for wood carving demonstrations and pine needle basket weaving demonstrations. A special treat is in store for Arts Festival patrons as they

head up to Langlois to Rain Coast Arts for weaving demonstrations and performances by the Fabulous Bandonics on Saturday.

Here in the heart of Port Orford there are enough Arts Festival sites to sponsor our second annual Art Walk. This is for those who enjoy strolling around town and don't mind wearing out that shoe leather. There are 10 Festival locations all within easy distance of each other starting with the Grantland Mayfield Gallery on the south. The gallery is a new addition to the Festival this year and has an eclectic and ever growing mix of artists on display. Jim and Linda Grantland have created an exciting new art center for Port Orford. Among the many things going on at the gallery are stained glass demonstrations and jewelry making. A couple doors down is the Lichtig Law Office where the "My Other Life" art show takes place. This is an art showing of non professional artists. Flo Lichtig says so far 18 artists are scheduled to exhibit and there will be an informal gathering of these people on Saturday afternoon at 2:30. Everyone is welcome.

Just stay on that side of the street and head north a couple of blocks and you'll come upon the relaxed atmosphere of the 'Neath The Wind Basket Studio run by Ellen and Bob Warring. You can stop in and see many of the baskets they've woven and new ones being created. Walking across the street head over to the

Cook Gallery where the James Nowak "Under Water" show continues. This show is a must see as well as the rest of the gallery. Owner Rick Cook is the godfather of the Port Orford arts scene having been at it for over 15 years. For people who enjoy Sonja Wold's design of the Arts Festival '93 sweatshirt she has three paintings on exhibit at the Cook Gallery. The Cook Gallery's next door neighbor, Gwendolyn's Bed and Breakfast will have an open house on Saturday afternoon. Gwendolyn has turned her Bed and Breakfast into one of Port Orford's most eye-catching showpieces. Across the street is Knutson's Handcrafted Clocks where there will be tours and an open house. From Knutson's head back a few feet to 101 and north a block and a half to Port Orford Pottery. This gallery and studio is new to Port Orford and the Festival this year. I finally got around to visiting Rory and Keith last week at their pottery shop and was pleasantly surprised at the quality of items they had and the low prices attached to them. They have wind chimes, coffee mugs, plates, tiles and bird feeders among other things, some of them with the famous living glaze on them.

Continuing north along the south side of 101 our next stop is the Twilight Zone...just kidding. It's the Wooden Nickel where you can see myrtlewood turning demonstrations. Now you can cross the street (look both ways, the

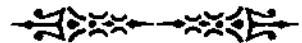

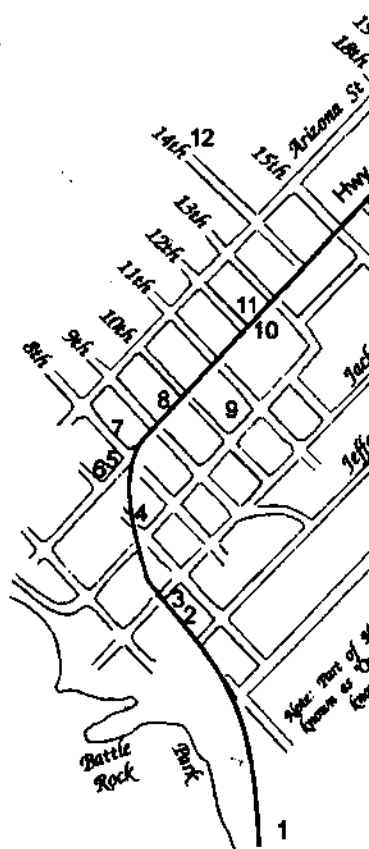

School Report

The 2CJ School Board met Tuesday night at Pacific High School. The most significant action was a vote taken on the superintendent Dick Wold's contract. His current contract, which expires June 1994, was cancelled and he was awarded a new four-year contract by majority vote. He did not get the rumored raise, however. Instead, he lost a 7% raise which had been in the cancelled contract, but he will get an additional week's vacation.

Although there is still a lot of controversy in the school district, much of it results from incomplete or incorrect information. Many things that seem strange are done to comply with state or federal laws. For example, state law requires music education for all K-6 students. It was decided locally, based on state recommendations, that students should begin band in the 5th grade. This has required bussing band members from Driftwood but this won't be necessary next year when the 5th grade moves to Blanco and the new building is open at that site.

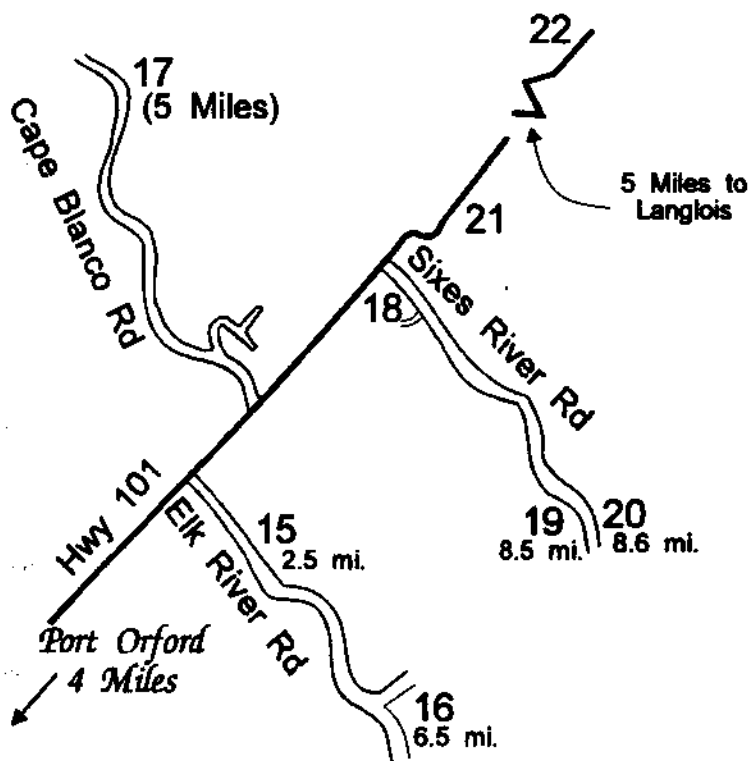

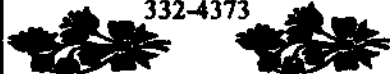
