musical numbers was directed by Kelli Basey and featured many members of the church from very young to adult.

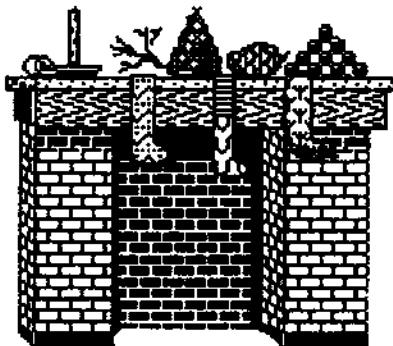

council, please submit a letter expressing your desire to serve, to the Port Orford City Hall, no later than 5:00 PM, Wednesday, January 5th, 1994. At the City Council meeting of Jan. 10, 1994, the mayor will appoint members to that council

The City attorney has prepared a draft Watershed Management Plan or consideration by the city council. This will be discussed at the next council workshop which will be held at 7:00 AM, Monday the 3rd of January at the Wheelhouse Restaurant. The public is invited.

Once the city has reviewed the draft plan, and made what changes it thinks are warranted, the plan will go to the newly formed watershed council for their consideration and further action.

The City Attorney has also sent a letter to the Bussmann's asking them to reimburse the City for all direct costs associated with changing from Hubbard's Creek to the lake. As that letter just went out, we have of course, had no response as of yet.

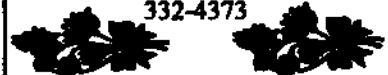

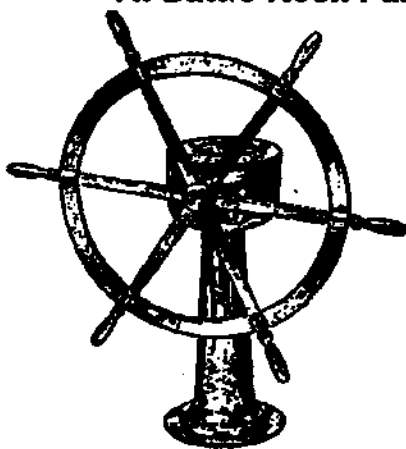
FAX Back's

Drinking Water Update

The City of Port Orford is still taking it's drinking water from Garrison Lake as the recent storms made Hubbard's Creek to muddy to use as a water source. If the good weather continues, we may go back to the creek in the near future.

We have sent samples of the lake water to a independent testing lab. The results should be back within week or so and will be available at City hall for those interested.

The Oregon Department of Forestry has issued Mr. Bussmann four (4) separate citations which include orders to repair damage done by his road construction. From what officials at Forestry told Mayor Keenedy and me, the Bussmann's have complied with all of the repair orders. Copies of those citations and repair orders are also available at City Hall for those interested.

The Mayor and I were told that Forestry will be making periodic inspections of Bussmann's roads throughout the winter. Inspections may occur as frequently as once a week. If, during one of these inspections, Forestry finds other areas of concern, further repair orders will be issued.

We were told that the Bussmann's will have to file a written plan with Forestry prior to the commencement of any logging activity. The written plan will apparently go into considerable detail about any proposed logging activity. Forestry will provide us with a copy of the proposed plan and allow us an opportunity to comment on it.

The City Council has authorized the formation of a Watershed Protection Council for Hubbard's Creek. The Main purpose of this Council is to develop

guidelines for future development in the water shed and will also identify properties having an impact on the water shed.

The City intends that the council be composed of a wide range of interested parties, including but not limited to: The City, affected property owners, interested State and County agencies plus local citizens residing both inside and outside the city limits. No one organization, including the city will dominate the council. Membership in the council will be limited to 15 members. All meetings will be advertised and open to the public. Non-members will be allowed to speak at those meetings and to express their opinions.

Whale Watching Workshop

Port Orford's second whale watching seminar was an exciting success. Sixty people attended the 2 day class. Don Gilea, marine educator from Newport, had a great time and expressed his gratitude to Port Orford for its support, enthusiasm and generosity.

I would like to thank everyone who attended. A special thanks to all those who helped out with refreshments. Oregon State Parks has been a great help, and will soon take over sponsorship of the program, which is currently co-sponsored by the Hatfield Marine Science Center.

Twenty eight sites along the Oregon coast will be staffed by trained volunteers from 10:00am - 1:00pm, December 26 through January 2.

We will be helping visitors spot whales, answer questions, share information and distribute handouts.

The gray whales are enroute to Baja California (A 5,000 mile journey from the Arctic waters) where they will calve or breed. They will migrate north in the Spring.

Last Spring, 825 guests visited Battle Rock and Cape Blanco. They came from 17 states and 8 countries. This was during the "slide", when Highway 101 south was closed! In addition to Battle

Rock and Cape Blanco, the kioak will be staffed by local volunteers. So come on down, say "Hi", and watch the parade of whales! And, you can help us invite our guests back so they will be here to enjoy our resident whales.

They're At It Again

Interest ran high at the Monday meeting of the Curry County Commissioner's in Port Orford because of business pertaining to our local justice of the peace court. An administrative action declaring the

Justice of the Peace Court III a half time court was on the agenda. The "forgotten north" as Port Orford was referred to by one speaker was about to get another reduction in county services.

Our Justice Court is served by Richard AuFranc who is elected to his position and his clerk, Will Bagley. The court handles several hundred traffic cases a year in addition to small claims court cases, nuisance cases including barking dogs, landlord tenant disputes and marriages. Despite the importance of this court to the "forgotten north" County Commissioners instigated by Peg Reagan took a monetary budget axe to it five days before Christmas. Bah Humbug! No one

bothered to tell the three commissioners our justice court is already a half time court. Take a look at the court's posted hours for proof (though it should be noted Judge AuFranc is on call day and night.)

Had Commissioner Reagan's original motion passed Judge AuFranc's salary would have been reduced to \$1,006.50 a month. However an amendment offered by Rocky McVay set the base line salary of our our local court at 50% of the salary of the Brookings justice of the peace court. This amendment passed but the new salary which will include a pay cut was not available.
