You might be wondering why I'm writing this column instead of Evan. He just got back from a week in Los Angeles. Unfortunately, his journey was something of a trip to Hell. Meanwhile, the City of Port Orford made a bit of a stir with an official notice (shown below) about city water quality or lack of it. Before you run off in a blind panic and fill your house with Sparklettes, let me bring you up to date.

I spoke with City Manager Dean Medi-

son this morning. He said that state and federal regulations specify how long the water must remain in the chlorination stage. The time required varies depending on the water temperature, Ph balance (acid or base), etc. The city was off by a few minutes here and there but there is little cause for major panic. The city is installing an additional stage and, if it isn't already operating, it will be in service very soon.

I also spoke with Bonnie at Curry Family Medical and was told that they have not seen any unusual increase in the number of health problems that could be caused by the city water.

The City's notice was required by law but the evidence so far indicates the water has remained satisfactorily healthy. Sorry to disappoint those of you who like a good panic.

Curry General Hospital

A public meeting to explore fund-raising options for the Curry Health District is set for 7 PM, Wednesday, March 16, in the Curry General Hospital conference room.

Gordon Ensley, hospital administrator, emphasized the hospital's economic impact on the community.

"The contributions coming into the hospital — from sources such as Medicare, Medicaid and other medical insurance monies — add up to approximately \$3 million a year for the community," Ensley said. The majority is used to employ people in the area while the remainder is used for supplies and other costs. "About 70 percent is expended locally," Ensley added.

"The hospital used to be a place where you came to occupy a bed for awhile. No

more. Gall bladder surgery used to mean a week in the hospital; now it's 24 to 48 hours," Ensley said. "Many other procedures that required hospitalization for at least three days now are routine day surgeries." Still, the potential for inpatient business is good, he noted.

"In 1990, Curry County residents accumulated \$20 million in hospital charges with about \$12 million of that for inpatient services," Ensley said.

"Physician recruitment" is a key in bringing more patients to the hospital, he said. And recruiting specialists to Curry County is one way that North Bend Medical Center (NBMC) has offered to support Curry General Hospital.

Recently, NBMC purchased offices from two Curry County medical groups — that of Dr. R.G. Williams, L.E. Taylor and Maciej Druzdziel in Gold Beach; and that of Dr. Jay Patel in Brookings. While the physicians still own their own medical practices, their businesses now fall under the larger NBMC umbrella. While some NBMC-member specialists already treat Curry County patients in Curry County, Ensley said additional specialists are soon to come.

"North Bend doctors are very excited about serving their Curry County patients closer to home and working at the hospital," Ensley said.

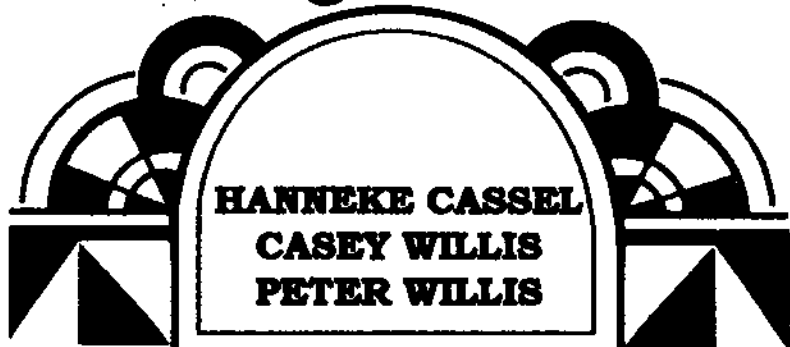

Meanwhile, he continued, the hospital is seeking additional capital funds to supplement revenues generated by taxes. Examples of capital needs include expansion of the ultrasound facilities, relocating the CT scanner from a trailer to a permanent wing, repaving the parking lot, and purchasing surgical instruments to accommodate specialty surgeons.

Mayor Schafer identified three areas for further discussion: Recruiting specialty physicians, building the hospital's image, and raising capital for specific needs.

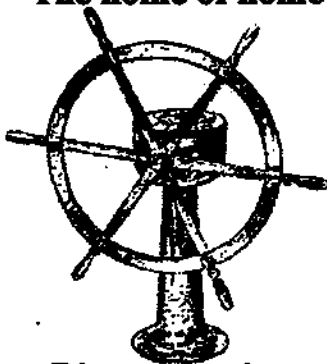

Dear Editor:

I used to think that murder was something that only happened to other people. It only happened to bad people. It only happened in big cities. It only happened to drug addicts and gang members and people who didn't deserve to live anyway. I remember thinking that it would never happen to me or to anyone that I love, because as long as you live a good life and stay out of trouble you will be safe. I know now that nothing could be further from the truth.

Three years ago someone murdered my mom, Judy Kangilaski. She didn't do drugs. She wasn't a criminal. As far as I know she was a nice lady who minded her own business, worked in her garden and walked along the beach. Her only "crimes" were her weakness for alcohol and bad taste in boyfriends. Someone

walked into her home and shot her while she was sitting in her living room.

The police don't know why she was killed. They don't know who killed her. And for the past two years they haven't been too worried about trying to find out. After all, she really wasn't anyone important, just an average tax paying citizen. (I was finally told recently that they would have a detective re-examine the case.)

If I were a citizen of Port Orford I would be a little nervous, because it seems that someone has gotten away with murder in Port Orford. Maybe they'll try it again and maybe this time it will be you or someone that you love.

You can help make your town safer by strongly encouraging the sheriffs department to solve this case. I am offering a \$5,000 reward for information

ers from Driftwood to Blanco next year. This would free up space at Driftwood for preschool classes - something badly needed since the state yanked our Head Start program. It would also give our 5th graders some company at Blanco where they are often left out of events that include all the other grade levels. By juggling staff and classrooms Driftwood would wind up with a state-required health room, better library/technical space, and better storage space while Blanco would utilize its space more fully and a modular unit wouldn't have to be transported from Blanco to Driftwood.
