Council Chooses Martha Weaver-Britell By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council chose Martha Weaver-Britell to fill the vacancy on the council created by the resignation of Jim Gray. Mr. Gray taught at Pacific High School the last two years and he and his family are moving to Antioch, California where he will be teaching this fall. The council made their selection from six applicants including Jim Grantland, Robert Warring and Walter Kaplan who were in the audience. A short moment of suspense arose when councilman Todd Smith went up to Mayor Delaine Kennedy to review the ballots and the vote totals. Mayor Kennedy then announced the voting had resulted in a tie and Martha left her council chair and returned to the audience. The council voted again and Martha won and moved back to her chair. She was not given the oath of office because no one had a copy of it at the meeting.

Weaver-Britell served as secretary of the 1994 Jubilee committee and is president of the Point Orford Heritage Society which placed first with it's booth at the Curry County Fair. Congratulations to Martha!

She will not, as previously printed, serve out the rest of Jim Gray's term which would have run through December, 1996. Her councilor position (#5) will be on the ballot this fall and will cover the next two years. Three other councilor terms of

office are up for election this Fall including Carl Eskelson, position #2; Gary Doran, position #4; and Tim Sparks, position # 6. The deadline for filing for these four positions is August 26, 1994. In order to get on the ballot you need to go down to City Hall and get a nominating petition which you then need to fill with a minimum of 25 valid signatures of registered voters. There is no filing fee. The councilor positions are non-partisan and there is no primary. The election is scheduled for Tuesday, November 7, 1994. You must have lived within the City of Port Orford for at least 6 months at the time of the election to run for councilor.

The council heard from Matt Gray, representing the city's engineering firm, H.G.E. He showed up with a change order for Wikish Construction Company asking for more money for items connected to the sewer project in the amount of \$7,149.80. The council passed a motion approving the order but not without first questioning the additional expenses. Councilman Kennedy told Gray the corrections should be the responsibility of H.G.E.. Gray updated the council and the audience on the Bussman property on the North Fork of Hubbard Creek. He said Bussman's engineer Ed Reilly has completed a plan for the repair work required by the stipulated order and submitted it to the Oregon Department of Forestry. O.D.F. met with Bussman last Thursday though Gray mentioned no one

was invited from H.G.E. Representatives from Forestry discovered a split culvert on the property which needs to be replaced. Gray stated the work could impact the condition of the water and temporarily disrupt the water supply (increased turbidity). He noted work necessitated by the stipulated order was to be complete by September 15.

Gray spoke to the council about yet another lake survey. The reasoning behind this survey is the search for a better water intake on Garrison Lake. The survey would include monitoring parts of the lake for year round supply of ground water springs. Gray estimated the cost of the survey and spot checking of weeds and algae in the lake at \$8,000. Norma House told Gray many studies of the lake had already been done and skin divers had already gone looking for the ground-water springs. While they're at it, why not look for the Loch Ness monster?

Ellen Warring, speaking as a private citizen and not as a member of the watershed council, brought up the idea of using water from Garrison Lake for the needs of the dock and the cannery while using water from Hubbard Creek for the rest of the city. There was no response to her idea one way or the other.

The council formed an ordinance review committee consisting of Dotti Myers, Ann Shepherd, Tim Sparks and one per-

Bed Tax Committee Meets

The Port Orford Bed Tax Committee met on Tuesday night, August 9, in what turned out to be an abbreviated meeting. Chamber of Commerce Janelle Haller took the floor and challenged the legal standing of three of the committee members including Alan Mitchel (Bed & Breakfast), Rosy Roselius (Motel Owners) and Ed Beck (RV owners). Other members of the committee include Jim Grantland (Chairman and committee member at large), Dotti Myers (City Manager), Al Luis (Chamber of Commerce) and George Kennedy (City Council) who was absent. The committee

accepted the challenge which meant they lacked a quorum and could not conduct business. The challenge was based on a draft revision of the original bed tax ordinance of Section 25, subsection (2) involving length of terms of office and commencement of their terms.

Chairman Jim Grantland had done a lot of work and prepared a thorough spreadsheet of the grant requests for the 1994-95 fiscal year. He listed eight non-profit organizations including the Beautification Committee, Port Orford Arts Council, Port of Port Orford, Jubilee Committee, Heritage Society, Light'In Bugs, Chamber of Commerce and the Port

Orford Parks Department who submitted requests for \$58,740. The committee anticipates allocating \$27,919.00 in funds to these groups.

The Bed Tax Committee will reconvene on Tuesday, August 30, in the City Hall council chambers. The Port Orford City Council's next breakfast workshop meeting, scheduled for Monday, August 22, will include an official city council meeting. The council will then deal with accepting applicants for the three positions on the bed tax committee. Applications will be accepted until Friday, August 19 at City Hall.





only other Coos/Curry school known to have taken this step is Marshfield High School in Coos Bay.

Good news for pre-schoolers: There will be preschool at Driftwood Elementary. An estimated 40 students aged 3-5 years (must be 3 years old on or before Sept. 1, 1994) will be enrolled in this program which will have sessions two days a week. For additional information, please contact the district office at 332-5241.

Cooperative Venture: The approvals are in. Bandon will join Pacific High School in their soccer program this year. Reportedly more than four Bandonites plan to join the PHS Pirates as these scholars use

their heads in more than just the classrooms.

Profitable Plan: Larry Minnick of Gold Beach spoke to the board about the drive for Curry County to join with SWOCC (South Western Oregon Community College.) It will mean college classes available locally. Not just adult ed, but the ability to earn an AA degree without having to move! How much would you pay for this? Well our county BSD will have to give up some \$60,000+ and each school district will bear some cost (About \$2,700/yr for Port Orford-Langlois 2CJ) but SWOCC will bring back into the area something like \$800,000! A pretty good trade! It means more local jobs, more educational opportunities, and a better, more interesting area for us all. Larry will be soliciting 500 signatures on a petition to start the process.

Help Wanted: We need another victim (pardon me, volunteer) to apply for the 2CJ budget committee. This is actually a pretty painless way to learn a lot about how the school works and what it plans to do in the coming year. Contact the District Office at 332-5241 or Valerie Kramer at 332-6565. Superintendent Wold also mentioned he needs painters.

More meetings: The board will hold workshop meetings on Monday, Aug. 15 and Aug. 22 at Pacific High School from 6:00-10:00pm. The next board meeting will be 8:00pm Tuesday, Sept. 13 at Pacific High School.
