Helpful Suggestions:

Washing Cars - Don't

Dishwashing - If dishwasher is used be sure it is filled to capacity and use only on normal cycle. Better yet wash by hand.

Wash Clothes - Wash only full loads

Bathing - Have more than one use same water. Cut amount of water for each bath to half. Use shower if available - Use plug when water gets to ankles - turn off. Use water saver device in shower head.

Hot Water from Faucet - Save run-off for other uses such as watering house plants.

Personal Usage - When brushing teeth use half glass of water or run water just when necessary. Shaving - draw water in basin.

Toilet - Put two bricks or quart jar in the tank.

Restaurants - Serve water only when requested.

The Port Orford Chamber of Commerce continues planning for the big Labor Day racing weekend at Cape Blanco State Airport. They are currently selling 3 day advance ticket sales passes at The Downtown Fun Zone, Chetco Federal Credit Union, Buck's Sentry Market and the Wheelhouse Restaurant. The advance ticket passes are \$15 for adults and \$10 for children 13 and under. Tickets purchased at the gate for the daily racing schedule are \$7.50 for adults and \$5 for children 13 and under. The racing T-shirts and sweatshirts are expected in by Friday of this week and will be on sale in advance at The Wheelhouse Restaurant and the Chamber of Commerce Visitor Center. They will also be on sale at the main ticket booth at the racetrack.

The race dinner, scheduled for Saturday, September 4, at the Port Orford Community Building will be catered by the Port and Starboard and Braolett's Cafe. The Chamber is pleased to announce there will be some space for the public at the dinner. Advance tickets can be purchased at either of the two restaurants and are \$5 per person for a barbecue chicken dinner. Following the dinner there will be a dance featuring live music by the band Timberwolf with a no host bar. Admission to the dance and music is \$2. The race team has expressed a genuine interest in meeting with and getting to know people from our area.

The race course will be set up on Thursday, September 1. The next day Team Continental conducts driver training for interested members of the public at a cost of \$70.00. The following day, Saturday, the racers hold their time trials and follow those on Sunday and Monday with competitive racing. By Tuesday afternoon the bleachers, concrete barriers, tires and other fixtures will be removed and the airport will again be available to aircraft landings. United Airlines take notice.

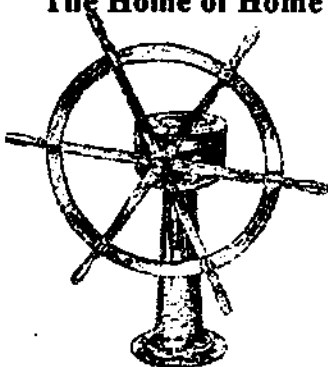

Dinosaurs and Ancient Whales

Were dinosaurs warm blooded? Did they live in herds like buffalo? Did dinosaurs once live in Port Orford? You have a perfect opportunity to ask an expert all these questions when paleontologist Dave Taylor Ph.D. presents a slide show Saturday evening in Port Orford. Dr. Taylor has spent the last 25 years excavating fossils and he knows a lot about those popular creatures, dinosaurs.

Dr. Taylor is curator of an extensive collection of marine mammal fossils in Portland and promises to bring some bones with him. He will include one from the largest fossil ever found on the

Oregon coast, a one and one half million years old whale found near the mouth of the Elk River.

City Council Meeting

The Port Orford City Council met in regular session on Monday morning, August 22, at the Wheelhouse Restaurant. The council barely achieved a quorum needed to conduct business. Mayor Delaine Kennedy, councilors George Kennedy, Martha Weaver-Britell and Carl Eskelson were present when the meeting began. A call was placed to Tim Sparks who was working and he came to the meeting making for a quorum.

The council made three appointments to the Bed Tax Committee. They are Alan Mitchell (Bed & Breakfast), Rosy Roselius (Motel) and AJ Affonso (RV park).

The council agreed to renew a lease with Port Orford Ambulance for their space at the City Hall complex.

Councilor George Kennedy was appointed by a unanimous vote to represent

the City on the Oregon Coastal Zone Management Association, Inc.

The council voted to upgrade their utility billing software at a cost of \$450.

A motion was passed to pay for a survey to determine the percentage of low and moderate income residents of the City. In order to qualify for a OCDBG grant, the city must have 51% low and moderate income people. The 1990 census reported 47.7%. The survey will cost \$3500 and be conducted by the University of Oregon Census Department.

Matt Gray attended the meeting representing H.G.E. which provides engineering services to the City. He spoke about the work being done on the Bussman property as part of the stipulated order. The Oregon Department of Forestry has determined the wrong type of material was being used in correcting the slide area and has issued a stop order on the work. All repair work on the property was to have been completed by September 15.

Gray encouraged the council to contract with S.R.I. to conduct a study on groundwater in Garrison Lake. The study would require divers to look for underground springs, take measurements and do a spot check of the weed and algae growth. City Manager Dotti Myers suggested the City resolve the problem of weed growth in the lake before we spend money looking for a source of groundwater in the lake.

Several local residents around the lake have been conducting studies of the lake and it was decided to give their names to Gray.

Dear Editor:

In Port Orford Today on 7 July 1994, Bob Wilson replied to T.J. Efferson's letter about individual's rights and our Constitution. He juxtaposed individual's rights mentioned in the Declaration of Independence and "the common good", whose inimical opposite is furthered by "special interests".

By "the common good", he means the rights of society as a whole. Here he errs. Society comprises individual people, each of whom has identical and equally protective rights. To exercise those rights, people interact freely and voluntarily with others, thereby forming "society". To

protect those rights, people hire public guardians, including legislators.

Mr. Wilson fears untoward consequences if people unite to influence legislators, because they thus form a "special interest". Special interests exist to grab lawmakers' attention. The citizens then tell them about problems that the legislators can prevent or redress, thereby supporting the citizens' rights. Unfortunately, special interests sometimes ask legislators to violate some citizens' rights in order to benefit others. The trick is to limit the legislators' power so that voting to injure anyone's rights is impossible.

The Founding Fathers wrote our Consti-

tution and its Bill of Rights to do just that. Those safeguards are under attack today, and "special interests" do ask their legislators to help them by hurting us. The solution is not to abjure our philosophical foundations, but so to restore them that our rights will be secure.

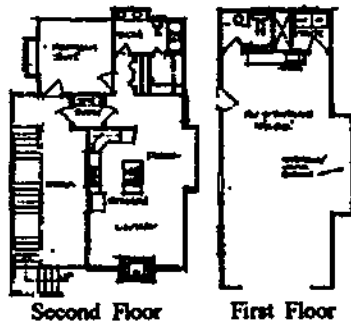
