Port Orford Welcomes Team Continental by Evan Kramer

Labor Day weekend racing has arrived in Port Orford. The race track at Cape Blanco State Airport will be set up this Thursday. The race car drivers, families and teams are arriving and getting set for three days of racing at the second annual Port Orford Grand Prix sponsored by the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce and Team Continental. Racing action starts this Saturday and continues through Monday, Labor Day.

Friday Team Continental conducts driver training on the race track. Race registration for Team Continental members and tech inspection begins on Friday afternoon at 3:00pm.

Group practices begin Saturday morning at 9:00am. There are seven different race groups. Qualifying trials begin at 2:00pm on Saturday. Sunday morning features more qualifying trials while the races begin at 1:00pm. Qualifying trials resume Monday morning at 9:00am with races starting at 1:00pm.

Tickets are available at the gate all three days of racing. You can still purchase three day passes at Sentry Market, Downtown Fun Zone, Chetco Credit Union and the Wheelhouse Restaurant through Friday and at the gate on Saturday. Individual day tickets are available at the main gate. The racing T-shirts and

sweatshirts will also be sold at the main gate and are available prior to the race at the Wheelhouse Restaurant and at The Downtown Fun Zone.

One important announcement from Team Continental is that there is absolutely no alcohol allowed at Cape Blanco State Airport at any time during the racing weekend. However, there will be plenty of food and non-alcoholic beverages for sale both in the grandstand area and in the pit area. Food will be provided by the Port Orford Lion's Club, Lightin'Bugs, and two privately run food concessions.

Tickets are still available for the dinner and dancing at the Port Orford Community Building on Saturday evening, September 3. Admission to the dinner and dancing with music by "Memphis" is \$6.00 while admission to just the music and dancing is \$2.00. The dinner menu consists of BBQ chicken, salad and baked beans. This would be a good opportunity to meet the race car drivers and crews.

More Weather News

The last day any measurable rain was recorded in Port Orford was on June 26, 1994 when .07" fell. The month of June saw 3.46" rainfall. We've now completed two rainless months and are heading into a traditionally dry month. Last year the City recorded 0.00" of rain in September and only 1.33" in October. The City of Port Orford has asked residents to voluntarily conserve water. We

heard from Mirleen O'Hearn who told the Watershed Council the creeks on the Wilkins property which feed into the North Fork of Hubbard Creek are dry. The city's reservoir is located on the North Fork of Hubbard Creek. Next thing you know Curry County will get known as a dry county.

Two firefighters from Port Orford, Dennis Gehrke and Darryl Thomas returned from the Hull Mountain Fire on Sunday night. They were representing the Port Orford Fire Department as part of the South Coast Task Force which was sent to fight the fire north of Medford on Thursday of last week. This fire claimed the life of Sydney Mapleaden Jr., a 25 year old cat operator from Central Point, along with several homes and over 7,000 acres of trees and brush. Please remember, there is NO burning allowed now. We hope you will all be more careful and considerate than the person we saw throwing a lit cigarette out of a car last Saturday.

Speaking of safety, remember that school has started so please watch out for children crossing streets on their way to school. Drive safely and have a great holiday weekend!

Meanwhile the grey whales are back and frolicking off of Battle Rock just in time for the auto races. Don't be surprised to see lots of people down there looking transfixed at the ocean.

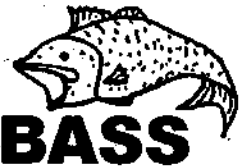

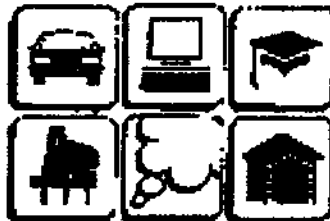

Bed Tax Committee

The Bed Tax Committee met twice last week. They held sessions on Tuesday, August 23, and Thursday, August 25. The committee was presented with written applications and oral testimony on the behalf of eight groups competing for the limited amount of funds of \$16,000. The committee had received requests totaling \$49,000. The committee consists of Alan Mitchell, Jim Grantland, Rosy Roselius, Dottie Myers, George Kennedy, Al Affonso and Al Luis.

The following is a listing of the amounts of money and the priority level the committee decided on for each of the eight groups. This is only a recommendation which will be sent on to the city council where they can either concur with the bed tax committee or make changes to the list. The priority level was set by how soon the different groups would need their money.

Those people who attended the meetings understand the difficulty the committee had. They had to trim many of the requests severely yet all the groups felt their projects were important. As one committee member put it after the second meeting, it isn't pleasant watching sausage being made.

An additional problem the committee faced was with the City Of Port Orford's request for \$5,000 for playground equipment. A letter was circulated by city manager Dotti Myers from former acting city manager and councilor Jim Grey authorizing the expenditure of \$4,100 for playground equipment for Buffington Park. The problem is the \$4,100 was to have come from the 1994-95 bed tax funds. In other words money was spent before it was authorized. As you can see from the above recommendations the bed tax committee allotted \$1,000 to the Port Orford Parks Department.

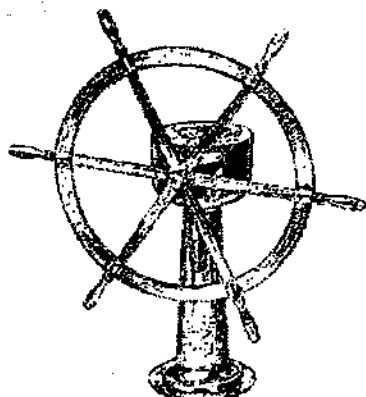

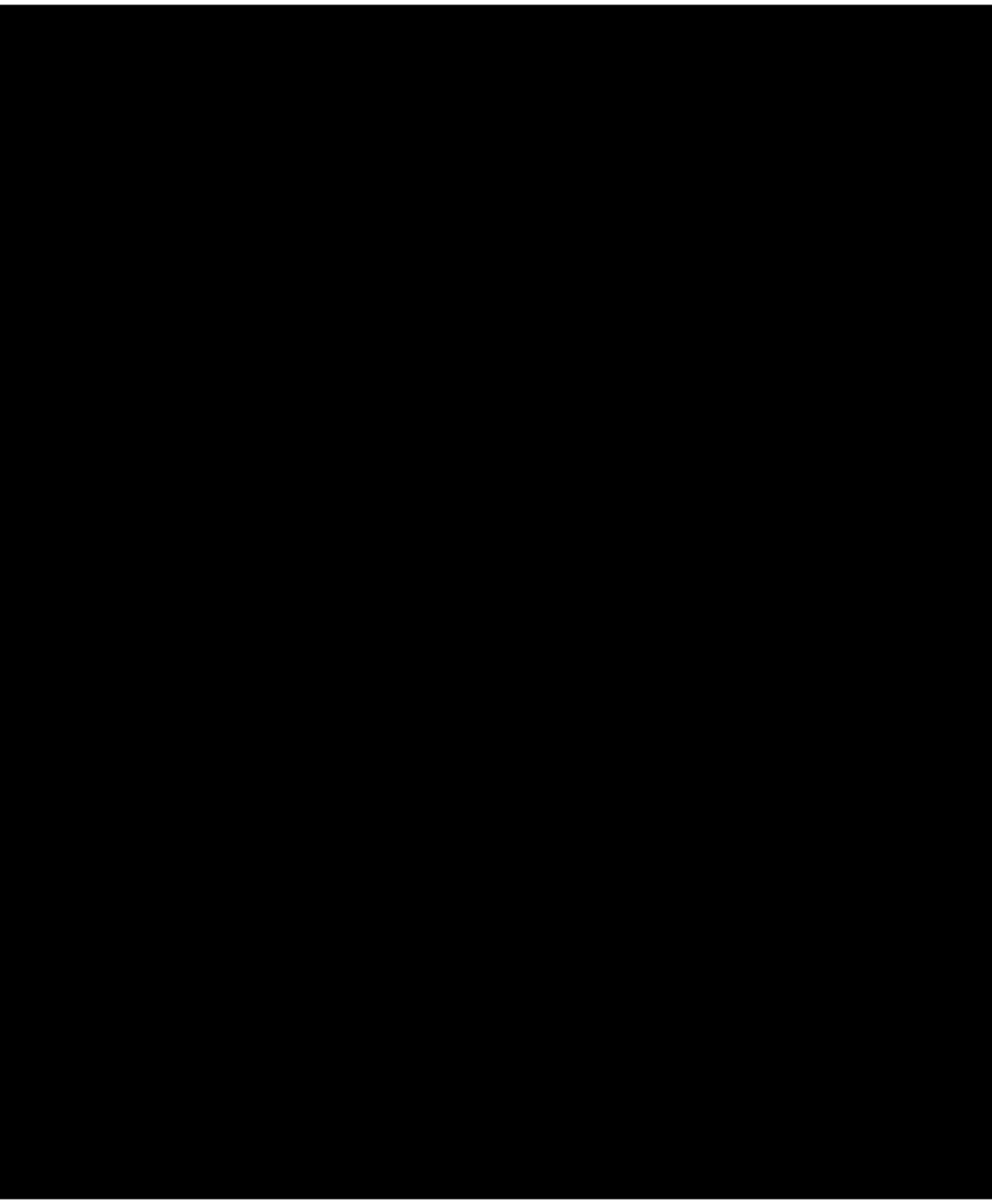

COMPUTER BUYING TIPS

CPU TYPES

The Central Processing Unit (CPU) is a single chip that acts as the brains for the entire computer. It determines the speed of your system. All of our systems are fully capable of running almost any MS-DOS or Windows software, although the SX systems may require an optional math co-processor chip for programs such as AutoCAD. Because there is about a 6-1 speed difference between the high and low end systems, some programs such as digital video presentations may not operate at an acceptable speed on the slowest systems.

A low end system (80386SX-40, 80486SX-33) will be fine for DOS applications and light Windows use. They are particularly useful for word processing and moderate database or spreadsheet work.

Mid-range systems (80486DX-33) are fine for general Windows use including word processing, database, spreadsheets, etc.

Faster processors (80486DX2-66, Pentium) should be chosen for intense multi-program applications, desktop publishing, CAD, etc. or for use as a network file server.

HARD DISK SIZE

Hard disks are like closets where you store your programs and data, waiting for use. Like closets, you never seem to have enough available space in them, so it is better to get a large disk drive than to get one too small!

Your computer will need about 5-10Mb of space for DOS. Each DOS application (word processor, spreadsheet, database, etc.) will typically require 5-15Mb. Windows requires about 10-15Mb and each Windows Application requires 15-35Mb. A single full-screen 24 bit picture may take 1½Mb to store. Digital video needs about 20Mb per minute or more! This can add up fast!

Applications tend to get larger with each new release. Who knows how big these packages will be two years from now? Plan ahead and make sure you have enough room to grow with.

RANDOM ACCESS MEMORY (RAM)

If hard disks are compared to storage space in a closet, RAM can be compared to the workspace on top of your desk. It's a much smaller area but much faster to access and it's the space you actually use when you are actively working on a project. When you "run a program," you are actually getting a copy of it from your hard disk and putting the copy into RAM for immediate use. The amount of RAM available will limit the size of programs and data on which you can work.

Our minimum of 4Mb of RAM assures you that you will be able to run a wide variety of Windows programs. And will probably be adequate for most home users and many small offices.

If you frequently need to run multiple applications under Windows (for example, you like to keep both your word processor and your spreadsheet open at all times) then you should consider upgrading to 8Mb. You will notice a substantial speed improvement. You should also consider 8Mb if you run large or graphics-intensive programs such as Corel Draw or Aldus Pagemaker.

If you run several applications simultaneously and especially if any of them are large, you may want to upgrade to 16Mb. This will also prepare you for next year's new operating environments which work best with 12Mb or more of RAM.

VIDEO MONITORS

Beware of video monitors that do not specify .28 or .26 dot pitch. They will not give nearly as sharp a picture and will tire your eyes more quickly. If you will use your computer many hours a day, consider a 15" or 17" monitor to reduce eyestrain. This becomes more important if you work in SVGA resolutions such as 800x600 or 1024x768 instead of the VGA standard of 640x480. You only have one pair of eyes! Treat them kindly!
