Emergency Dredging Begins by Evan Kramer

One of my favorite places in Port Orford is the dock at the Port of Port Orford. Whether it's whale watching off the jetty or observing the boats come into port and unload crates of urchins, crab, or ling cod, it's the most interesting enterprise around here. However, there are a large group of hard working people who make their living from the ocean and to whom our port is their lifeblood.

Heavy winter storms have increased the sanding-in process adjacent to the dock and made it impossible for boats to be hoisted into or out of the water unless it is a high tide. Emergency dredging began at the dock on Tuesday, January 24, where the boat hoist is located. The Army Corps of Engineers has contracted with Nehalim Dredging who have set up a series of pipes extending from the boat hoist area to a settling pond located on the beach near Blue Water Harvester's processing plant. While I was at the dock on Tuesday afternoon I watched as three boats, the *Elaine M. Capricorn* and *Humbug* lined up waiting for the tide to rise enough to get under the hoist. The first boat to attempt it made it but not without bottoming out.

The breakwater was built in 1969 by the Army Corps of Engineers to protect the dock from winter storms. However, the dog-legged shaped breakwater has caused

a massive sanding problem. The current breakwater is the second breakwater built at the Port. The first one was constructed in 1935 from rock from the hill adjacent to the port and lasted one winter. Pat Masterson's book *Port Orford: A History* has a chapter on the Port of Port Orford. He mentions the large lumber schooners which used to take on cargo at the Port. One photo that hangs on the wall at the Port office shows a 420 foot long lumber hauling ship anchored alongside the dock.

The difficulty with the breakwater is the shoaling it has caused. This is why the Corps of Engineers dredging boat, The *Sandwick*, is brought in every year around March to dredge out the accumulated sand.

Larry Dell, an employee of the port, told me the current dredging effort would result in 200 yards of sand a day being removed from the ocean floor. The sand and water slurry is being piped down the length of the dock to a settling pond adjacent to the cannery. Port Manager Gayle Paige told me the dredging would be going on for eight days with the removal of 1,600 yards of sand putting the situation back to normal. Paige said this is the worst condition she has seen in her five and half years as port manager. She also said the dredging job last year by the *Sandwick* may have contributed to the current problem.

The Port is extremely important economically to this area. Gayle Paige loaned me a study the Port did on the economic benefits from the Port. Gayle told me 3 million dollars worth of fish are hoisted over the Dock on a yearly basis. The economic study using 1989 as a base, estimated annual regional benefits from Port activities at \$6,000,000 resulting in 320 jobs! Blue Water Harvester's urchin co-op at the Port is the largest non-government employer in the area. The Port is host to a large number of urchin divers, crab shrimp, ling and black cod, halibut and salmon fishermen who do their best to make a living under very difficult circumstances. The Port is the subject of endless fascination to many area residents including myself. I just got my first opportunity to see Merle Hassett's salt water aquarium located in the Cal-Shell office. The 135 gallon tank is the home to several crabs, clams, squid, fish and urchin among other sea critters.

The Port of Port Orford is the only non-estuary port in this state. Fishermen entering it do not have to cross a river bar. It was at one time a deep water port but the breakwater changed all that to where now the port is an extremely shallow water port.

One big project the Port of Port Orford board of directors is now studying is a major renovation of the entire dock facil-

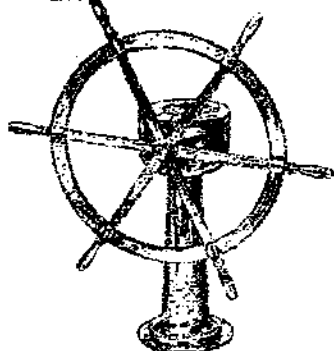
Memorial Benefit

Perinatal Program

Ninety-two pregnant women and mothers received perinatal care through the Curry County Perinatal Program in 1994, according to a statistical review cited by Jan Melde, R.N., Curry County General Hospital obstetrical supervisor.

Participants included 48 women from the Brookings-Harbor area, 29 from the Gold Beach area, and 15 from northern Curry County.

The program's intent is "to provide a comprehensive service for prenatal care, delivery, post-partum, and well-baby care for Medicaid and low-income mothers unable to obtain care through private

means," said Pat Westling, R.N., perinatal nurse and obstetrical-gynecological nurse clinician with the Curry County Health Department. In existence for about five years, the program is jointly supported by the Curry County Health Department and Curry Health District.

Physicians providing services are Reginald Williams, M.D. and Ted Taylor, D.O., of North Bend Medical Center Gold Beach; Michael O'Gara, D.O., West 4th Street Medical Clinic, Gold Beach; and Michael McKeown, M.D., North Bend Medical Center in Coos Bay.

Neonatalogists Richard Farmer, M.D., and David Jackson, M.D., of Sacred Heart Hospital in Eugene, offer consulting services.

Of the total women participating, 50 delivered their babies at Curry General Hospital. Eleven infants were delivered by Caesarean section.

A total of 49 women entered the perinatal program during the early stages of their pregnancies, and that's good news according to Nancy Hooker, R.N., director of nursing at Curry General.

In 1994, the program included two mothers who gave birth to low-weight babies. Both were transferred to medical facilities equipped to handle high-risk births, Hooker said. In the past, the number of low-weight babies "has been quite a bit more."

Some of the reasons for high-risk deliveries include use of tobacco, drugs or alcohol, poor prenatal care, and teenage mothers, Hooker said.

In 1994, a total of 38 program participants used tobacco, 25 had a history of drug or alcohol abuse, and 28 were teenage mothers.
