## Senator Bradbury Resigning by Evan Kramer

State Senator Bill Bradbury is resigning his office as of April 16. Bradbury made the announcement at a press conference held in Coos Bay on Thursday, March 30. Bradley was elected to the State Senate District 24 in 1984 and reelected in 1988. He served as Senate President for the 1993-95 legislative session. He was elected to the State Legislature in 1980 and reelected in 1982.

Bradbury will be replaced by a candidate chosen by the Coos and Curry Democratic Central committee precinct persons as well as members from the precincts in Douglas and Lane County which are within Bradley's district. They will meet on Sunday, April 9, at the North Bend High School multi-purpose room, starting at 12:30pm. The high school is located at 1600 4th St., adjacent to Pony Village Mall. The public may attend. They will pass their recommendation(s) on to the Coos and Curry County commissioners who will make the final choice. That choice must be a member of the Democrat party. The weight of each county's commissioners recommendation is determined by population with over 50% of Bradbury's district in Coos County.

The last time Curry County faced a similar situation was in 1991 after Commissioner Dave Werschkul was removed

from office. The Curry Democratic Central Committee met and interviewed several candidates to replace Werschkul before forwarding three names to the two remaining commissioners. Sam Wilson was the committee's number one choice but withdrew his name less than a week after going through the selection procedure. Commissioner Peg Reagan at the time was vacationing in Chili. A call was placed to her at a public meeting whereupon she then ignored the second and third choice recommendations of the central committee and selected Terry Hanscam to fill Werschkul's position. Rocky McVay amiably deferred to the Democrat Reagan and concurred with the choice of Hanscam.

Bradbury is resigning at mid point in this year's legislative session to accept a job as executive director of the group For The Sake of Salmon funded by the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission. The program is designed to coordinate existing government efforts to save salmon runs and restore watersheds. Bradbury will earn \$55,000 a year in his new position. He will begin work on April 17, the day after his resignation becomes effective.

Bradbury visited Port Orford a couple of months ago at the invitation of private citizens to discuss local water issues. He spent most of the afternoon watching a video of the watershed, visiting the city's reservoir on Hubbard Creek along with

city council and watershed members as well as speaking with them and hearing their concerns.

At Bradbury's press conference he summed up his feelings about serving as our representative these last 14 plus years. "I can't tell you what an honor and pleasure it has been to serve the people of my district. They have been incredibly willing to tell me their concerns and get involved in the process. I'm truly humbled by how much there is to learn and how willing my constituents have been to educate me on their issues."

The Ingram Book Distribution Center in Roseburg held an open house on Sunday for bookstores, libraries and other businesses involved with books. The huge new blue and white building opened in October, 1994 and contains 285,000 square feet of space on the main floor with another 65,000 square feet on the free standing mezzanine. Ingram needs the space because when the building is fully stocked it will house 270,000 different book titles. The company receives and ships out approximately 50,000 books a day. They will ship approximately 70,000,000 books a year from this location. Who says nobody reads anymore?

The new building was built by R.D. Noah Construction of Roseburg using local workers and sub-contractors! Company President John Ingram thanked the Douglas County Supervisors as well as the Oregon Economic Development Department for their assistance in getting the project completed.

The company currently employs 140 people with more being hired all the time. Beginning employees start out at over \$7.00 an hour and also receive health benefits, sick leave and paid vacation. All but a couple of workers, or "associates" as they're called, were hired from the economically depressed Roseburg area. The associates who fill out the customer orders are know as pickers and walk 8-11 miles per day up and down the aisles filling their carts. (Roller skates are considered unsafe.) Supervisors navigate the building on three-wheeled bicycles. The distribution center is about as clean an operation as possible.

John Ingram pointed out in his talk that the company doesn't produce or manufacture anything. He said the company's only "product" as a distribution center is service. He thanked the booksellers who attended the open house and emphasized how important they were to the company.

Ingram Book Company has six other distribution centers in the United States. The company is the largest distributor of books and videos in the world. The Ingram Books building in Roseburg is their second biggest, exceeded in capacity only by their center in Nashville, Tennessee. They are, no doubt, a welcome addition to the Roseburg community.

Would you quit smoking for a million dollars? We took a quick poll and you said, "Yes!" two to one. Well, I can't write you a check, but I can show how to turn your cigarette money into a million dollars.

\$1,000,000 in 26 years 10 months. A light smoker saving only \$25 per month at 14% will reach \$100,000 in 28 years 10 months. At 17% our \$25 per month saver will reach a million in 38 years 7 months.

How can you get 14% interest? Actually it isn't hard. The stock market has historically had an average growth of about 9%, so almost any good stock plan can meet this goal. Mutual funds have historically averaged about 14% annual growth. Many such funds have had 20% per year growth over several years although fast-growth funds may also experience serious losses when the market falls. Since you will be investing for a long period, you won't mind so much if the market falls because it has always gone back up and always to a much higher value. I recently sent \$24.95 to "Money" magazine and got a year's subscription and a book that explains about the various kinds of investments, the meaning of some of the various financial terms, how to read a stock page, etc. It gives lots of helpful information to get a beginner started.

I wish someone had told me all about this stuff when I was just finishing school. It would have been difficult to force myself to put \$50 a month away but if I had started when I was 22 and fresh out of college, I'd be worth over \$100,000 today and just 16 years away from one million dollars assuming 14% interest. Since I'd have been investing for the long term, I might have accepted riskier 18% return investments and be only 9 years away from a million dollars.

Even if you never make a nickle, or worse, lose all this money, you'll be in better health and no poorer than if you continued to smoke! And, after all, what's more important than your health?

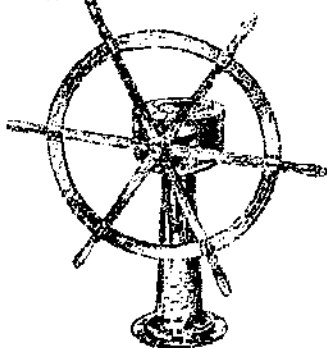

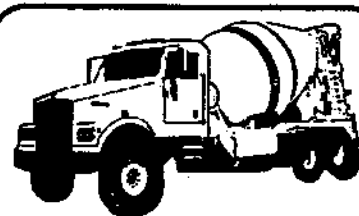
