Things To Do

Summer vacation begins for local students on Saturday and with it the number of things to do multiplies. This Saturday night the Port Orford Jubilee Committee holds their annual auction at the Community Building. It starts at 6:00pm. Funds raised from this auction go to paying for the fireworks used on the Fourth Of July celebration at Battle Rock Park. Over three thousand dollars is spent annually on the fireworks display which is the grand finale of the Jubilee Celebration. The pyrotechnic display is set off from the beach and atop Battle Rock. Many, many area businesses have donated items for the auction Saturday night and it would well be worth your while to take part in some of the bargains.

One of the highlights of the Jubilee Celebration this year is the presentation of the melodrama entitled "Oregon Country" or "No Father To Guide Her" by the Port Orford Community Theater. The play was written by Jerry James and is being directed by Michael Hall. One big difference this year is the melodrama will be presented at the Star Theater rather than the Community Building. The play will be presented three times, starting on Saturday July 1 at 7:00pm and repeating on July 2 at 2:00pm and July 4 at 7:00pm. Ticket prices are \$3.50 for adults, \$2.00 for children 3-12 and under

Fish Tagging

Fingerling salmon are being tagged at the Elk River Fish Hatchery this week. The hatchery born fingerlings can then be traced years later when they are caught. A company named Express Services has been contracted by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife to apply the coated wire tags and clip the top fin of the sardine sized fish. The current batch of juvenile salmon being tagged will number around 200,000 and are being processed at the rate of 25,000 a day. It takes two eight hour shifts to accomplish this goal. They will be released into the river when the fall rains bring the water level up. The coated wire tag that is inserted in their snout includes a bar code which when extracted from the adult fish can be "read" to determine where the fish came from and how old it is.

Curry Education

Southwestern Oregon Community College, Curry Education Service District Community Education, and the Brookings Harbor Community Response Team are cooperating in a survey being mailed this week to all county box-holders.

Purpose of the survey, according to Peggy Goergen, Curry Community Ed Director, is to assess the training and education needs of Curry County for any eventual. "Although the picture remains cautiously optimistic for annexation funding, planning must begin now for a Curry fall program," according to Goergen.

In statements made during the Curry annexation vote, Dr. Steven Kridlebaugh, SWOCC President, promised an immediate needs assessment if the measure passed. At the same time, the local Workforce Development Committee of the Brookings Rural Development Initia-

tive CRT group, decided upon assessment as one of their goals. "Three instruments are planned, including the high school students piece which was sent out this week, the mail-out to community, and an employer survey, perhaps in cooperation with the Regional Workforce Quality Committee," said Goergen.

As an added inducement to encourage participation, several tuition scholarships for the cost of 1 credit (\$34) will be drawn from the pool towards any SWOCC/Curry class beginning next fall. Those who did not receive a survey, or who need additional forms for other household members, are encouraged to call local Curry Community Ed offices at 332-1325, 469-5017 or 247-2741. No postage is required for returned assessments.

Teen Health Problems by Valerie Jean Kramer

What are the three biggest health problems facing America's teens? It's not measles, car accidents or acne. According to an article in the Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) it is violence, substance abuse, and the consequences of unprotected sex.

How bad is it? The article's authors cite research showing 25% of children age 10-16 had experienced an assault or abuse in the previous year. 10% of 8th and 10th grade students (ages 12-14) had experienced forced sex or sexual abuse. Marijuana use among 12 year olds has more than doubled since 1991 and there is an overall increase in teenage drug use. Finally, the United States ranked highest among developed nations in teenage pregnancy with 1,100,000 girls age 15-19 becoming pregnant in 1991.

It isn't just "those poor inner-city folk" either. Another study showed a higher violence rate among suburban boys than inner-city boys! These problems are very much with us in Curry County and particularly in Port Orford.

Yep, it's a problem but what can I do? I'm glad you asked because you can do several things.

First and foremost is education. Parents need to be aware that children are getting into trouble awfully young and that the kids need guidance BEFORE they get into trouble! Children need to understand what is acceptable and what isn't. What the dangers are and how to protect themselves. Most importantly, they need to feel comfortable talking with their parents about their concerns and problems so that they won't be afraid to seek advice or help before it's too late.

Second is to make your feelings known. One very strong human drive is the drive

to be accepted by others. Those behaviors that society accepts will continue. Those it does not accept will diminish. It seems to be in vogue to "understand" people's problems but unfortunately, "understanding" often appears to be "acceptance." It's time to draw some lines about what is acceptable behavior and what isn't. Don't be afraid to say what you think.

Finally, you can set a good example. Whether you get drunk every night or go to church every Sunday, your kids will probably grow up to consider your behavior normal. It's hard to raise kids to be good if you don't set an example and show them you think it's important.

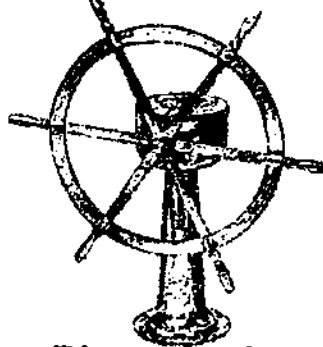

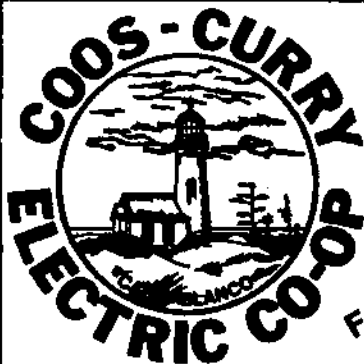

It's not too early to start your spring cleaning. The City of Coquille will once again host a household hazardous waste turn-in sponsored by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality on Saturday, June 10. Event hours are 10 am until 3:30 pm at the Coquille High School parking lot.

There are several places to look for household hazardous wastes. In the garage, you may find antifreeze, motor oil, engine cleaners, or transmission fluid. Your yard may be the place to find insect sprays, weed killers, and pesticides. Workshops and hobby areas may contain paint and paint products, art supplies, or photographic chemicals. Examples you may find in the home include oven cleaners, drain cleaners, moth balls, aerosol sprays, floor wax, medicines, and furniture polish.

Usable paint collected at the event will be recycled by the DEQ. There will also

be a table where you may leave hazardous wastes which have not been opened. The DEQ will screen these products and determine if they are usable. If so, they may be available to the public free of charge.
