Many people helped out with the first Port Orford Volkswalk. Every walker received a 16.9oz bottle of Oregon Pacific water. We thank Roy, Eric and Niels Martin for donating twelve cases of their locally bottled water to the volkswalk. A person wishing to remain anonymous donated some fine quality coffee for the volkswalkers. Frank Smith of the Port and Starboard Restaurant let us use his large coffee urn in which we made the much appreciated coffee. The Port Orford Arts Council in the form of Rick Cook helped organize and promote this event while Tobe and John Porter from the Arts Council took the lead in that organization's presentation of storyteller Will Hornyak.

Hornyak was well received by the audience who showed up on Saturday night for an evening of old fashioned but never out of style evening of storytelling. The only props he works with are his expressive hand and facial gestures and different voices for the characters in his stories. He started by talking a little about storytelling and came up with the interesting comment that a writer is a failed storyteller. One of his most pleasing stories concerned a fish who had been caught and instead of being thrown into

the frying pan was trained by its new owners. The fish grew lungs and even learned to walk and talk. Hornyak did an impression of the fish walking to much laughter. It's obvious from Hornyak's skills as a storyteller and the audience reception that storytelling is not a lost art form.

The Yachats Coastal Gems volkspport club did the majority of the work. They checked in all the walkers and issued them their start cards. They arrived in town on Friday and starting that afternoon laid out the arrows and tape for both walks which totaled 13.4 miles. The idea for the Volkswalk came from Carl Miller, owner of the Castaway Motel. If he hadn't got the ball rolling there would have been no Volkswalk.

Yachat Coastal Gems member Phil Hanson told me on Monday afternoon they had counted approximately 150 walkers who signed in. Most of them completed both walks or at least the 5K alternatives. Hanson was enthusiastic about the Cape Blanco walk. He said he felt it was the best Volkswalk in the state. He told me many of the other volkswalkers were really impressed with that walk and the sheer physical beauty of that area. Volkswalkers spotted bear, deer and an otter along their walks as well as enjoying the springtime blooming of the

rhodies, wild irises and azaleas. While we're on the subject of plants thanks to the Sunset Garden Club for holding a plant sale at the Community Building during the Volkswalk and the Master Gardeners for setting up a table and dispensing advice and written information.

We don't know yet if this Volkswalk is going to become a yearly event. Anyone have any comments?

Court Is In Session

The Port Orford City Council approved the interim appointment of a municipal court judge at their Wednesday, May 22 meeting. The judge selected was recommended by city manager Dotti Myers. The name of the interim judge is Lee Forrest. He is a retired Los Angeles police officer currently living in Brookings. Forrest was on the oral review board which interviewed the candidates for Port Orford police chief. The motion to hire Mr. Forrest as interim judge stated that the appointment was for a period of time not to exceed 6 weeks. 

Post-Grad Scholarship

Senator Brenda Brecke announced today the availability of a scholarship for individuals entering graduate study to commence in the fall of 1996. The scholarship will be awarded to persons pursuing an advanced degree in political science, public administration, public policy or a related field.

All of our fry are ponded now, and the hatch house is empty. We have a total of 592,000 fall Chinook fingerlings for Elk River, Chetco River and Hunter Creek. We also have 78,000 winter Steelhead fry for the Chetco River. They are growing quickly and have lots of energy. We are still feeding frequently and everyone is invited to help feed them with us. The coded wire tagging of our fall Chinook fingerlings started on May 21st and will continue until June 4, 1996. Two shifts are working in the tagging van on week days 6am until 10pm., so come out and see how it is done!

This year Oregon will have a free fishing weekend on June 8th and 9th. On Saturday June 8th we at Elk River Hatchery will have a fishing pond for youths seven years of age and under. This pond will have lots of catchable 8-12 inch rainbow trout in it, and we will provide the fishing poles to catch them with. The pond will be open from 8am to 5pm, or until all the fish are caught. Each youngster will be allowed to keep the first 3 fish they hook and land! We will help clean and package your trout for the trip home. Bring your kids out to experience the excitement of catching a fish! And its all free!!
