### Leaving London

Folk Singer Tom Paxton wrote a great song titled, "Leaving London." It was on his "Outward Bound" album in 1966 and republished on "The Compleat Tom Paxton" in 1971. Perhaps he'll even play it for us when he performs in Port Orford's Community Building on October 16. (Blatant plug. Get your tickets early. Personally, I'm expecting a sell-out! You'll find more details elsewhere in this issue.) As our travel saga continues from last week, we leave London heading west but without the haunting melody and words of Paxton's song.

### Day 4 (Sunday, Aug. 18) London - Salisbury - Looe - Plymouth

*Greetings from our Tour Director before driving via Hampton Court, Henry VIII's Palace, to Salisbury Plain and ancient Stonehenge. On to view Salisbury Cathedral before travelling past Exeter and Dartmoor to cross the river Tamar into Cornwall and the 12th century smuggler's village of Looe. Then to Plymouth for our overnight stay. Before dinner this evening, enjoy a welcome drink with our Tour Director. (CB D)*

By Sunday we were ready to leave the crowded streets of London and head out into the countryside. After a continental

breakfast, we checked out of our hotel and met our tour director, Rona Fitzpatrick, and our driver, Norman. We kept the same bus, driver, and tour director until our return to London eleven days later.

On the way out of town, Rona pointed out various buildings and places of interest including Runnymede. Runnymede wasn't much to see - just a grassy field - but it was very important historically. It is where a gang of barons forced the unpopular King John to sign the Magna Carta limiting the powers of the king. It was the birth of rule-by-law under which a person's liberty or property could not be taken from him except by due process.

Our first major stop was at Stonehenge located 8 miles north of Salisbury, England. Stonehenge was constructed in three stages beginning around 3100 BC with the digging of a circular ditch and a ring of 56 pits known as Aubrey Holes. Construction lasted until 1550 BC. Huge pillars of rock were brought from southwestern Wales. The upright stones are known as Sarsens. The cap stones as Lintels. The outer circle is 97 feet across and 15 feet high. It is known as the Sarsen Circle and is made up of 30 Sarsens and their 30 Lintels. Inside this circle is a U-shaped formation open to the East composed of five structures each

shaped roughly like the greek letter  $\pi$  (pi). These structures are called Trilithons (Tri = three, lithons = stones). The main trilithon is over 25 feet tall. (To learn more about Stonehenge, visit the world web site at: <http://bbs.gaiainet.net/nowakl/1mankek.html>)

People still speculate on what the ancients were up to at Stonehenge. Evan claims they were signaling to lifeforms elsewhere in the galaxy. He's also still trying to figure out how they moved the massive stones to the site and set them on top of each other.

The site is an extremely popular one. Because of vandalism and looting, people are no longer allowed close to these huge stones. Valerie managed to rest her back by lying on the grass outside the ditch but the sun was shining and she didn't get any psychic messages.

We drove on to Salisbury and one of the more beautiful cathedrals. We had lunch in the Kings Arms Hotel Pub.

We continued east to the seaside town of Looe where we were released from our cramped bus seats and spilled out into the postcard infested streets. Evan tried a concoction he'd never heard of - ice cream with clotted cream on top. It was

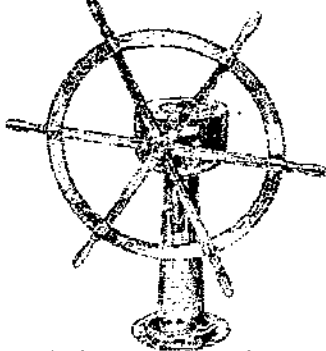

Historical Society

A preview of the famed "Custer's Last Stand" almost took place in Curry County during the closing days of May in 1856. Captain Andrew Jackson Smith and his reinforced company of Dragoons were surrounded by hundreds of well armed Rogue Indians and the situation looked bleak indeed.

The soldiers with their musketoons were surrounded, outnumbered out-gunned, and without water. Each hour the Indians tightened their grip around the 96 men who had been sent to the Big Bend of the Rogue River near Illahe to accept the Indians surrender.

The war had raged intermittently for close to six years as the whites moved onto the lands the native inhabitants had lived on for years.

With 10 soldiers killed and 19 wounded and the Indians moving in, the situation looked desperate for Capt. Smith and his men. But just as the Indians prepared for their final assault, Captain Christopher Augur and his company of 54 infantrymen came to the rescue. The Rogue River War was essentially over when that battle ended.

The Curry County Historical Society is sponsoring a tour of the battle site and the sites of other battles along the Rogue River on Saturday, September 28 starting at 8:30am at the Museum at the Fairgrounds in Gold Beach. The tour is free and all are welcome. A vehicle caravan will proceed up the Rogue River stopping at some of the important sites of the Rogue Indian War that can be seen from the road.

In July this year, the U.S. Forest Service conducted an archaeological dig at the Big Bend site and found musket balls and a few other evidences of the battle. The dig was a project of retired Marine Lt. Colonel Jeff Applen, a graduate student at Oregon State University.

Applen and Janet Joyer, Siskiyou National Forest archaeologist and Tex Martinek, Gold Beach and Chetco archaeologist will meet the Curry group at Cougar Lane store at 10:30am with a group from the Rogue Valley. We will then travel to the treaty site at Oak Flat on the Illinois River, have a sack lunch at Illahe campground, and then go to Big Bend. One the way to Agness, Frank Walsh, author of several books on the Rogue Indian War, will share his knowl-

edge of battles at Lobster Creek and at the Mikonotunne village.

At the base of the hill at the Big Bend battle site will be a "sand table" model of the battle. Then the group will hike up the gentle slope to the actual location of the battle.

September 28 is the annual meeting of the Curry County Historical Society and a very short business meeting will be held during lunch. Be sure to bring a sack lunch and learn more about Curry County history.

After the Big Bend stop, those who wish will stop as the group goes by the Indian petroglyph site at Two Mile Creek.

George Kennedy made a motion to put the visitor center lease on the September 23 council agenda. It died for lack of a second.

## Presidential Ballots Available

Renee Kolen, Curry County Clerk announces that Absentee Ballots for the November 5, 1996 Polling Place Election will be available on September 21.

"Many of you are calling and wanting to know when ballots will be mailed for this November 5, 1996 General Election," Kolen said. "We want to remind voters that this General Election is a Polling Place Election and not a vote-by-mail election," Kolen added.

Kolen also informs voters who are not on file with the county clerk's elections office to vote an absentee ballot permanently, can simply request an absentee ballot form her election's office.

"In the 1994 General Election, we set a new record in issuing absentee ballots. My election's office issued more than 2,500 absentee ballots and we expect to break that record in this November 5, 1996 General Election," Kolen added.

When requesting your absentee ballot, give your residence and mailing address and sign your name. Mail your request to Curry County Clerk Renee Kolen's Elections Office, PO Box 746, Gold Beach, OR 97444. A lecture on "The Late Reformation, in the 16<sup>th</sup> century after the Death of Luther", will be given by Dr. Oliver K. Olson on Sunday, Sept. 22 at Zion Lutheran Church, Port Orford at 4pm and will be followed by a coffee hour and discussion.

Dr. Olson has been for several weeks a guest of his seminary classmate, Reverend Lionel B. Simonson, pastor of Zion Church. He has recently retired from his position as professor of Luther Studies at Marquette University of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, a Jesuit school.

Prior to his professorship and Reformation research, in this country and in Germany and Croatia, Dr. Olson served as a parish pastor in Seattle and for six years as a chaplain, with the rank of Commander, in the United States Navy. Serving as editor of "The Lutheran Quarterly", a theological journal, Dr. Olson is also working on the second volume of a biography of Matthias Flacius, a 16<sup>th</sup> century figure who studied under Luther and helped bring the Reformation to Croatia.

very rich. The Looe River is a tidal river and a startling one at that. The tide was out and just coming back in when we arrived. The fishing fleet was stranded in the river on platforms built to hold them up when the river was out.

We stayed in the port town of Plymouth and saw the pre-Revolutionary War Smeaton's Eddystone Lighthouse standing sentinel over the harbor. It is no longer in use unlike our "modern" 1870 Cape Blanco Lighthouse. The Eddystone Light was made famous in the folk song by the same name which begins:

My father was the keeper of the  
Eddystone light

And he slept with a mermaid one fine  
night

From this union there came three  
A porpoise and a porgy and the other  
was me!

Chorus:

Yo ho ho, the wind blows free,  
Oh for the life on the rolling sea!

We also saw the place at the Plymouth Harbor where the Puritans set sail for America. As with Plymouth Rock in Massachusetts, it was impressive only for its historical significance.

Joseph of Arimethea (the man who gave his tomb for Christ's burial) reportedly came to Glastonbury with twelve of his followers. Thursting his staff into Wyrall Hill, it took root and became a Holy Thorn tree which bloomed only in Spring (Easter) and at Christmas. The original tree was destroyed by the Puritans but its descendants survive.

## Leaving London Continued from Inside

We visited the ruins of Glastonbury Abbey which dates back to around 1200 and is built on the site of the original Abbey. <http://www-students.biola.edu/~williams/Travel/glastonbury.html>

From Glastonbury we rode to the City of Bath named after the Roman Baths, though in Roman times it was known as Aquae Sulis. Bath was designated as a World Heritage site in 1987. I wonder what took them so long. This is the place Evan really started regretting the attitude he had in ancient history class in high school. He paid so little attention and remembered not much more than the name Roman Empire and Julius Caesar. The large number and scale of Roman ruins in England was a surprise.

The baths were built around 65 AD and are the centerpiece of Bath 1900 years later. We toured them and were im-

pressed by the good condition they're in. The spring which yields the hot, steaming water still delivers 250,000 gallons of water a day. The Romans were quite advanced in their hygiene. Something which was lost for many years after they left. (We later saw one queen's bathhouse where she took her semi-annual bath.) The Roman troops were all withdrawn to Rome by 410 AD and the baths were left to decay.

### Lunar Eclipse

A total lunar eclipse will occur on Thursday, Sept. 26. When the moon first comes up in Port Orford, the eclipse will already have begun. It will be fully in shadow by 7:19pm and will begin its return to visibility at 8:29pm PDT. This will be the last full eclipse until the year 2000. This one is special because it is a Harvest Moon!
