The Port Orford Community Theater concluded a three-day run of "Zorro's Back in Town"

by Tim Kelley last weekend to a large, enthusiastic crowd at Sunday's

matinee performance. The play was presented at the Port Orford Community Building but it really took place at the Cucaracha Hotel in Old New Mexico. The audience booed the villain Buck Badum played by Travis Robertson and cheered the hero Zorro played by Ian Ranney who, as Zorro's alter ego, also played the part of the meek Henry.

Ian continues in the long tradition of playing Zorro made famous by Reed Hadley in the Republic Pictures serial Zorro's Fighting Legion, Tyrone Power in The Mark of Zorro and later by Guy Williams, George Hamilton and most recently on the silver screen by Antonio Banderas. However, Ian may be the first red headed Zorro.

Other actors in the play include Buck Badum's cohorts Shane Rangel as Sheriff Toady and Valerie Kramer as the fabulous Conchita. Meara Fleming played Alice Sweepup, inheritor of the Tottering

Mine Shaft gold mine, Kathy Allen as Aunt Victoria, Autumn Anderson as Lucinda, Sonja Mason as Widder Jones, Chris Humphreys as Don Alfredo and Shalene Robertson as his wife, Senorita de la Guitar.

The bad Buck Badum tried to steal the mine claim from Alice Sweepup but in the end with the help of Zorro – Avenger! Alice got the deed to the mine.

Four of the cast members are students in local schools including Ian Ranney – a senior at Pacific High School, Shane Rangel who is a junior at Pacific High, and Meara Fleming and Autumn Anderson – both eighth graders at Blanco School. The play was a comedy/melodrama and that meant the audience was part of the play. They laughed, they cheered, they booed the villain and shouted words of encouragement to the cast. All in all everyone had a great time.

Colleen Harrison directed Zorro's Back in Town. This is the fourth play she has directed for the Port Orford Community Theater. This was a bit of a tough one for her as the cast only had four weeks of rehearsal and, in the beginning stages, didn't have all the roles filled. Colleen deserves a lot of credit because in four weeks she put together a heck of funny and well-acted play. Thank you Colleen.


If this play got your appetite whetted for live performances and plays there are plenty more in our area coming up. This Friday night, May 11, the Bandon Playhouse Production of Arsenic and Old Lace opens at the Sprague Theater in City Park. The play is scheduled for a three week run at the Sprague and includes performances on Saturday, May 12 and Sunday May 13 as well as May 18, 19, 20 and 25, 26, and 27. Curtain rises on the evening performances at 8:00pm and 2:00pm on the Sunday matinees. Ticket prices are \$10.00 for evening performances and \$7.00 for seniors and children at the matinee performances. Arsenic and Old Lace is directed by Wolf Daniel Braun and produced by Bobbie Aasen.

Wheels of Hope

Once again Highway 101 watching paid off and this time it was on Monday afternoon around 5:00pm.

Looking out the window across the street toward the AuFranc Law Office a person could spot two interesting vehicles. One was a low slung enclosed bicycle pulling a small trailer and the other a 1961 Dodge. Delbert Richardson was pedaling the three-wheeled bicycle. He began his cross-country bicycle trip in Seattle, Washington on April 9 and was on his way to Washington, DC. Richardson was heading south possibility towards Barstow and then expected to head east on Interstate 40 where he wanted to arrive at 4 corners where the states of Arizona, Utah, New Mexico and Colorado come together.

Richardson, who was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis three years ago, has three purposes for his bicycle ride. One

was to overcome his own limitations from having MS. A second goal of Richardson, who is black, is to raise awareness that there are more and more ethnics being diagnosed with MS. His third goal is to encourage other people with MS to do more for themselves and be more active.

Richardson's recumbent bicycle is painted blue and white. It is enclosed with a body made of metal and Plexiglas and looks like an old time racecar. His goal is to reach Washington DC on or about July 20, 2001. Richardson's cross-country 2001 tour is called Wheels of Hope - Champions of Courage. People can follow his progress via the Internet. His web page address is www.cc2001.bizland.com.

The 1961 Dodge was being driven by Dan Price and his is also an interesting story. Price is driving around the country putting out a journal he calls the Moonlight Chronicles about his travels. Price calls it

a "wandering artists journal" which he began in 1992. His journals, which are available both on the Internet and in book form, are a delightful mix of drawings, photos and words with a lot of the emphasis on drawings. You can access the Moonlight Chronicles on the Internet at www.moonlightchronicles.com. Price's first book with Ten Speed Press is called "How to Make a Journal of Your Life." He has followed that up with a full-length book in color called "The Moonlight Chronicles" which follows his adventures in Hell's Canyon, the Sierras and New York City as well as time at home with his two teenage children.

Price was headed south to Northern California but planned on coming back to the Oregon Coast and doing some stories. He's welcome in Port Orford anytime and we'll give him an adventure or two to write about.

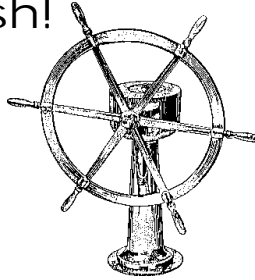

Parable from my Teacher. by Graeme Graydon



Once upon a time, there were two businessmen, partners, who had each asked their secretary to do some special task. The secretary, for whatever reason, had not completed either assignment. The first man was enraged. He stomped and screamed at her till he was quite out of breath. She became defensive, and it was all he could do to give her a new deadline to finish the job as he stormed off to his office where he flung himself down in his chair, totally drained and out of breath. He promptly had an excruciating ulcer attack which debilitated him for the rest of the day – he got nothing done.

The second man was angry, very angry when he found the task not done, but he took a deep breath and then another and breathed his anger in, till it was contained. He forgot all about the secretary and became completely absorbed in his own inner process of turning

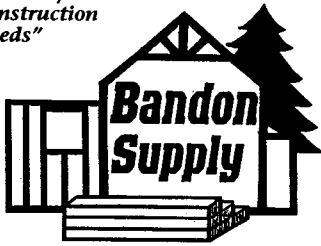

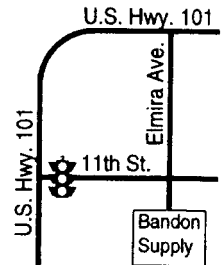
