Council Supports Ambulance By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council met on Monday night and heard from Public Works Director Jerry McNurlin first. He said work on the Deady Street pump station had been completed and there was more pressure for the residents now. He said a new sewer line had been completed and connected to a property on Washington Street. McNurlin spoke about the ongoing grease problem in the sewer lines and said it is the worst he has seen.

Port Orford police officer Lou Ball handled the police report. He told the council the department had issued 51 citations in January. He said the police have worked on several criminal cases lately. He described the police department relationship with the Oregon State Police and Curry County Sheriff's Department as "outstanding". He said the our police department has responded to some calls outside the city while the state police and sheriff have helped out on city problems.

Fire Chief George Gehrke gave a report on the fire department. He told the council in 1996 the department responded to 25 car wrecks of which 3 were car fires, 4 chimney fires, 4 residential fires, 2 mutual aid standbys and 6 brush fires and 2 false alarms.

Support For Port Orford Ambulance

Councilor Tim Sparks gave a report on the Port Orford Ambulance. Sparks, who is an Emergency Medical Technician with them said applications for the service area contract are due back to the county commissioners by March 3. The State of Oregon has mandated ambulance service areas. Port Orford Ambulance serves an area from Arizona Beach to just north of the county line and east to the county line. They have been providing continuing ambulance service since April 8, 1952. Sparks said they are solely funded by those who use the service and memberships and not do not rely on city funds. He said Port Orford Ambulance meets all state requirements.

Sparks asked for support from the City, members of the public and civic organizations. He asked that they send letters of support to the **Curry County Commissioners, PO Box 746, Gold Beach, OR 97444**. He asked for city manager Dotti Myers to write a letter of support to the commissioners. The consensus of the council was for her to write the letter.

Other Business

Resources Assistance for Rural Environments (RARE) intern Jason Seivers gave a report on the two bid proposals for

redesign and renovation of the Port Orford Community Building. He said the ad hoc committee recommended the architectural firm of Jim Tronson. Tronson's proposal was the low bid as well as the only one not requiring office space. Later in the meeting under new business the council unanimously approved the selection of Tronson.

Mayor Gary Doran appointed Nancy Philips and Linda Houck to the bed tax review committee to fill two vacancies. They were the only two applicants.

The council approved by a 5-1 margin a five page document entitled "Requirements of the City of Port Orford for the Port Orford Visitor and Information Center" This regards requirements of the group or person who will lease and operate the visitor center from the City. The one controversy on this issue settled on paragraph 7.(f)7. referring to moneys paid to the sub-contractor. They will be paid \$9,000 or 30% of the Transient Lodging Tax (whichever is greater). Robert Warring expressed concern that voting this section in was in conflict with the way the revised bed tax ordinance is written.

The council by a 4-2 margin passed sidewalk ordinance #97-02. After some discussion, the council unanimously adopted a noise ordinance #97-05.

Wayfinding Point By Ed and Nancy Dowdy

Officials of the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) met with more than 30 community representatives in Port Orford on Thursday, February 6, to begin working out details of a Wayfinding Point to be located in Port Orford. According to Terry Cole, U.S. 101 Planning Coordinator for ODOT, community support is very important for Wayfinding Points, and the decision to put one here was strongly influenced by the fourteen letters of support he received from the city and local organizations.

Wayfinding points are places where travelers on Highway 101 can pull off to get information on things to see and do in the local area and attractions coming up on the way to the next Wayfinding Point. The first, and so far only, Oregon Wayfinding Point is located at Winchester Bay. It offers a panoramic view of the ocean and attractive, low rock walls and interpretive signs that do not obstruct the view. Joe Paiva, the designer of the Wayfinder Points, said the design for Port Orford will be similar to the one for Winchester Bay but tailored to the specific site and the desires of the commu-

nity. The favored location is approximately \$185,000.

The work will include two parallel tasks: the physical design of the Wayfinder Point and the development of the interpretive material. ODOT plans to work with the community through the Community Response Team (CRT) to ensure that both the design and the interpretive information are what the community wants. Mem-

bers of the community will have an opportunity at the CRT meetings on March 13 and April 10 to be informed about the plans and provide feedback. Construction will begin by the end of summer and be completed before winter, according to Cole and Paiva. Accompanying Cole and Paiva were two representatives of the ODOT Environmental Program, who will also work on the project. They are Gary Larson, a geologist, and Randy Floyd, a wildlife biologist.

CRT members are working to ensure that the Port Orford area retains and improves its quality of life through the changes that are bound to occur in the next fifteen years. The CRT meets on the second Thursday of the month at the Senior Center from 7 to 9pm with an informal discussion from 6 to 7pm. The next meeting will be on February 13. All interested members of the community are encouraged to attend.







Would you know what to do if your child, student, or co-worker suddenly stopped breathing? Are you a child care provider who needs to update your CPR certification? Southwestern Oregon Community College is offering an American Heart Association Heart Saver and Basic Life Support Health Care Provider CPR course Saturday, Feb. 22 from 8-2pm at the Brookings SWOCC Center.

Adult and/or Pediatric CPR certification can be earned in this six-hour workshop. Health care workers will be able to get Basic Life Support Health Care Provider CPR certification. The first 2 ½ to 3 hours will cover Adult CPR. The remainder of the time will be devoted to Pediatric and Infant CPR. Take just the section that fills your need or stay for the full course.

The council unanimously approved a list of additional charges by the engineering firm of H.G.E. for \$4,000 related to work they have done on the city water system improvements.

The City is seeking a new attorney and the council has narrowed down the search to three candidates. The personal committee will review these applicants and make a recommendation to the full council who will vote on the matter.

The council approved resolution 97-02 for a supplemental budget. This will among other things make the bed tax money to the groups who had applied for it and whose proposals were accepted.

Councilor Carl Eskelson said he will be part of a patrol monitoring handicapped parking spaces, making sure only properly licensed vehicles are parked in those spaces. He asked the public to observe

those spaces and leave them for those who need them.

City Recorder Norma House spoke about the non-cooperative attitude of Wells Fargo Bank which the city does business with. She said the city may have to go outside the city to Bandon or Gold Beach for a new bank since they cannot do business with Chetco Credit Union.

The next council meeting is scheduled for Monday, March 10, at 7:00pm. A workshop session will proceed this meeting at 6:00pm.
