Labor Day Weekend is here and that means the members of Team Continental, their support crews and families have assembled at Cape Blanco State Airport for three days of "world class sports car racing" sponsored by them and the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce. The public is welcome to attend any or all three days of racing for the low admission price of \$4 for adults per day or \$2 for children. A souvenir program and spectator guide will be included with the admission price. Cape Blanco Airport is located at the end

of Airport Road, two miles west of Highway 101. Airport Road is adjacent to the entrance of Pacific High School.

This is the fifth year Team Continental and the Chamber of Commerce have sponsored sports car racing at the airport. Team Continental has been in existence for over 40 years. They were founded in the mid-fifties by two men who worked together at Continental Motors in Portland. The International Conference of Northwest Sports Car Clubs (ICSCC) was founded in 1957. Team Continental belongs to the ICSCC. Team Continental sponsors a race every year and Port Orford has become their home for the last five years.

I spoke with Lion's Club President Clara McMullen and she told me their club would be selling a variety of foods all three days of racing. The Lion's Club food booth will be located in back of the grandstands. The bill of fare will feature hamburgers, hot dogs and child dogs, french fries, nachos, cotton candy, hot chocolate and Oregon Pacific bottled water. I can just smell those delicious grilled onions now.

Full Time Workers

Congratulations to the Teamster's Union in their recent strike action against United Parcel Service. The consensus about the

recently settled strike is that an unusual thing occurred with the union achieving more than management. The Teamster's Union went to bat on behalf of their part time workers in an effort to convert thousands of them to full time positions with the company. They won that point in their settlement with management.

The United States Postal Service, Federal Express and other companies picked up the slack while the brown trucks stood idle. Our local Port Orford post office recorded as high as a 130% gain in parcel business some days and handled the extra load in their usual efficient and courteous ways during the fifteen-day strike.

Monday is Labor Day and for once labor has something to celebrate. I appreciate the contributions of labor and unions in this country as a former postal service clerk and letter carrier for nearly 14 years and a letter carrier union representative for five years. I'm happy to welcome my friend Ron Cohen to Port Orford. We worked at the Burbank Post Office together for nearly 13 years. Ron served as president of our local for one year while I was vice-president. I learned a lot from Ron during that year about filing grievances. Ron served most of his active time in the union as our health benefit representative and was the most conscientious union officer I've known.

Water/Sewer rates increase by 100%

The City of Port Orford's Council held a workshop on August 21, 1997 at 6pm. This meeting was to discuss water and sewer rates, and the future water and sewer rates of this city. It would seem that this meeting would have been standing room only with all the concern about water and sewer rates and the realism that an increase is coming. But to say a handful of citizens appeared would be an over statement. Five is the actual number. To say the least, I was very surprised.

I worked as this cities utility clerk for close to two years. During this time I was subject to hearing concerns many of you had about the water and sewer rate structure of this city. Some pleasant, some not so pleasant, but they were your concerns, and they all had merit. At this meeting I was sure I would see you all, and hear from you all. But this was not so. Of the few people who did show up, two spoke their concerns, and shared their ideas, but they stood alone. No backup, nor support from the community.

The Port Orford Parks Commission will host a meeting to discuss forming a "Friends of the Parks" organization on Wednesday, September 3rd, at 7pm in the Council Chambers at City Hall. In June,

Port Orford adopted its first Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan. One of the key issues in the Plan is Citizen Involvement. The Plan recommends establishing a "Friends of the Parks" organization in Port Orford to serve as a formal vehicle for grassroots support and community-building around parks, recreation and open space.

Similar groups in other cities have formed into private, non-profit organizations. As a private, non-profit organization separate from the City or Parks Commission, a "Friends of the Parks" group would be free to accept donations, apply for grants, make land purchases for new parks, host events, etc. If such a group does forms in Port Orford, it will determine its own goals and where to focus its energy. If parks, recreation and open space opportunities in Port Orford are important to you, then you should attend this meeting.

Fire Department Keeps Busy **By Evan Kramer**

The Port Orford Volunteer Fire Department has been kept busy the last couple of weeks. On August 14 they responded to a totally involved house fire on 20th Street. Then on Tuesday afternoon, August 19, they responded to a fire at 42790 Myrtle Lane, one mile north of Port Orford. A fifth wheel recreational vehicle on that property was fully engulfed in flames when the first fire truck arrived. The Fire Department had one thing in their favor and that was the lack of wind. Gayle Wilcox, Jake Marshall and Keith Rowling were on board the first fire truck to arrive. Rowling served as engineer while Wilcox and Marshall attacked the fire from the perimeters. They made quick work of the fire and kept it from spreading to an adjacent wooden fence, motor home and boat as well as the numerous houses and trees in the neighborhood. Speaking as a resident of Myrtle Lane thank you, thank

you and thank you!

On Friday night, August 22, the Fire Department responded to a two-vehicle accident on Highway 101 and 13th Streets in Port Orford. A Chevy van heading southbound on 101 was hit by a GM pickup truck turning left onto 13th street. The fire department extricated two passengers from the Chevy van, assisted the ambulance crew with the two injured people, maintained traffic control and cleaned up the highway.

Early Saturday evening, August 23, the fire department responded to a tragic vehicle accident on Highway 101 south of Humbug Mountain at milepost 313. One woman was killed in the accident and died at the scene. The accident involved two cars in a head-on collision. The fire department used the Jaws of Life to extricate a victim from one of the vehicles and helped the ambulance crew prepare and load him for transport to the hospital.

On Tuesday afternoon, August 26, at 1:00pm, the fire department responded to a one car vehicle accident south of town in Humbug Canyon. It turned out that no one was hurt or needed assistance on this call and the fire department returned to the fire hall.

The main purpose of this article is not to recount many of the bad things that happen to people but to thank the volunteer fire department members for the time they spend responding to structure and brush fires as well as vehicle accidents. Remember most of these men and women are working people and have to leave their businesses and jobs to respond to the fire alarm. They don't get paid for their work on the department and if they did your property taxes would be so high you wouldn't be able to afford to live here.

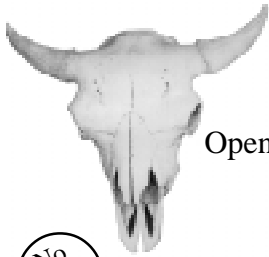

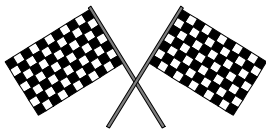

Software Hot Tips

It may not be obvious but "Street Atlas USA" by DeLorme makes a great tool for genealogists! It has such a complete picture of the US that it even has my driveway here in Port Orford! I've been using it extensively as I study my ancestors and the patterns of where they lived.

Just give it a place name, address, phone number or zip code and it will zoom to the spot if it still exists. I did have a bit of trouble locating Catfish Camp which is now known as Washington, Pa. but it easily found Captina Island, Dunkard's Creek, and Cresap's Bottom (no, I'm not

making those names up.) One can mark places of interest and print maps at a variety of scales. It's more convenient, useful, and fun than a standard map and it has much more detail.

Backups

I just read that Seagate's backup software is supposed to be included in Windows 98 planned for release sometime next year.

An increasingly popular backup method uses Iomega's ZIP Drives. A Zip disk can hold up to 100Mb. We're long past the era in which we could back up to floppy disks and tape drives tend to be slow,

cumbersome, and unreliable. The new digital tape systems are pretty interesting but are still pretty expensive too. Meanwhile the Zip system is convenient - as simple as copying files from one disk drive to another. You have direct access to the files - no waiting for a tape to wind from one end to the other. Best, you can use files directly off the zip disk - you don't have to copy them to your hard disk first as you must with tapes. Recently Zip drives with an IDE interface have become available. This makes installation easier and reduces the chance of an interrupt conflict. Drives sell for about \$150 and blank disks for \$15.95. However you do it, be sure you backup your data!
