### Viva Las Vegas!

On Saturday morning, November 14, we left Port Orford and headed out to the unique town of Las Vegas for their annual Computer Dealers' Exposition (COMDEX).

Our trip down was mostly pleasant. We spent our first night on Highway 99 in Turlock. It was just as well we didn't go any farther. Although we didn't know it at the time, dense fog lay ahead and there was a 74 car crash that closed the freeway for 12 hours. Meanwhile in nearby Merced a multiple murder went down. We slept peacefully through it all.

The next morning, Valerie managed to make about 55mph in a 70mph zone for more than 2 hours as she peered through the dense fog. She just found a car or truck to follow then kept a safe distance behind them. We finally got past the fog and found ourselves in Mojave ahead of schedule despite the slowdown. Once again we learned we had missed trouble as we heard on the radio about additional car crashes behind us, this time with fatalities.

We had planned to spend the night in Barstow or State Line (now Primm, NV)

but we were way ahead of our schedule and lucky enough to be able to get our room a day early so we went on in to downtown Las Vegas.

We walked around downtown a bit on Sunday but went to bed early to be ready for the convention. We started Monday morning with a great buffet breakfast at the Golden Nugget. We then hopped the free shuttle bus to COMDEX. I never did figure out the shuttle buses. The first day it took us to the Sands Expo Center. The next two days it took us to the main site at the Las Vegas Convention Center but by different routes. We got there too early and had to wait for about an hour sitting on hard concrete steps with the thousands of other eager beavers.

Finally, the show opened! This is the biggest computer show in the country. Articles in the Las Vegas Review-Journal estimated attendance at 220,000 visitors and 2,400 vendor booths.

To put this in perspective, if you spent 8 hours a day for all five days of the convention and visited every booth, you could only spend an average of one minute at any given booth! Another way to look at this is that there would be an average of about 92 visitors at each booth!

Actually it wasn't quite that bad. Not all 220,000 attendees are there for the whole

week. Still, some booths, such as Microsoft's, are suited only for sardines! While we didn't even see every booth, it is easy to walk quickly by many booths in which you have little interest and spend more time at those that may be worthwhile. In fact, we were satisfied we'd seen enough at the end of two days. (Our feet were satisfied much sooner!)

We thought the big things at the convention this year would be Internet-related and things connected to the Universal Serial Bus (USB). However, the Internet wasn't as omnipresent as we assumed it would be at the convention. The largest online bookseller Amazon.com wasn't even represented with a booth though the online stockbroker, E\*trade, made themselves very visible. (\$14.95 to buy or sell NYSE listed securities, \$19.95 for NASDAQ. See [www.etrade.com](http://www.etrade.com))

Some of the highlights were displays of the new high definition television sets (HDTV) and a HDTV video player. The HDTV screen can best be described as "widescreen," shaped more like a business card than current television sets. Its also interesting to note that all we saw were monitors – none of the units included a tuner. HDTV displays will probably accelerate the trend to merge computers and TV's since the same box can



**Recognition  
By Graeme Graydon**



I spent five years gaining a “good general education” at Wellington College – a boys-only high school. A notable feature was the morning assembly with a thousand boys in the great Memorial Hall and all our Masters facing us from the platform. But, they were uncertain years for me. Math, algebra, trig and chemistry were a struggle, geometry was alright. I just squeaked by in French, Latin was a disaster and I wasn’t allowed to take art, my strongest talent, because my IQ was too high. I failed my way year after year – until a very simple happening that changed everything. My English Master was a bluff, stocky man of Scottish Lineage, Jack Griffin. As part of our normal two and a half-hours of homework each day, he set us the task of writing about the Memorial Hall – anything we liked. It was left open – a very unusual latitude.

My essay began in the Hall, I turned my attention to the great bronze plaque that named the hundreds of Old Boys who had

died in the First World War. I seemed to pass through it and found myself a spectator in the horrible stench, din and filth of trench warfare. I saw men with their bodies torn open – still alive. I saw terror, fear, shock, and numbness in their faces. I saw tears, anger, defiance and calm – and I wrote down all that I saw.

The next day, as usual, we didn’t just hand our essays in, we placed them in the out-stretched, pudgy hand of Jack Griffin as he moved methodically up and down the rows of desks, his faded black gown brushing against us like a dark angel wing.

Days later the marked essay was distributed in the same formal manner, placed into our hands with results marked in heavy red pencil, 1 to 10. When he got to me he stopped and muttered – “Ah, Graydon, (we didn’t have first names), I gave you an eleven, I don’t have your essay, it is being published in an Educational Journal,” and he moved on. I sat there in shock. Eleven out of ten? Then I felt a delicious surge of something tingling through me. Never did see my essay again and no one said “Well done,” but in that moment my school life changed. My new grades took me to second place in

English and all my other subjects improved. It was a magical, effortless effect.

My real strength, was my imagination. Jack Griffin gave me the opportunity and I uncovered it. Now I had a way to achieve. But far more importantly, I had received recognition.



### Curry General Hospital By Frann Grossman

The district continues repairs and upgrades, improving service and patient care, thanks to passage of the \$1.5 million bond issue last May. This column has been created to help keep taxpayers up to date. Because of space restrictions not all items have been listed here.

- Maintenance crews completed about a third of the new roof before the rains began. The rest will be completed in the spring.
- The new telephone system is installed.
- The district received word last week from the Avon Breast Health Fund that the Curry Breast Health Network will not receive the anticipated \$20,000 in grant funds requested this year. Staff is researching options to keep the successful five-

year protection and education program afloat.

- The district recently submitted a grant request to the Northwest Economic Adjustment Initiative for \$250,000 to supplement the ambulatory surgery expansion project. The money would cover the costs of expensive surgical tables and orthopedic equipment.
- Midwife Alice Taylor, C.N.M., has relocated her clinic to the Curry General Hospital annex. She begins seeing patients in December.
- Curry Catering, a new fund-raising project staffed by the hospital dietary department, is seeking private catering jobs for the holidays to pay for a \$3,600 surgical cabinet for the operating room.
- The public is invited to attend the next Curry Health district board meeting Wednesday, November 18th in the hospital boardroom.

The Curry Health District operates Curry Family Medical clinic in Port Orford and Curry General Hospital in Gold Beach. The district is supported by user fees (patients), third-party payers (health insurance, Medicare and Medicaid) and the citizens of the district ranging from Pistol River to Sixes.

Permits will also be sold in Powers at the Powers Market, Monday-Saturday 9am to 6pm., Sunday 12pm to 6pm, and in Port Orford at the Port Orford City Hall, Monday-Friday 8:30am to 12pm and 1pm to 5pm. Cost of the permit is \$5 each and will allow the bearer to cut one tree per family (for personal use only). No personal checks please. For more information, please call the Powers Ranger District at (541) 439-3011.

The Forest Service advises that when venturing into the Forest, the public should be prepared: wear warm clothing, carry tire chains in their vehicle, inform others of their destination, carry food, water, and a first aid kit, be aware of changing weather conditions, and have appropriate maps.





### **Sex Over 60**



be used for both Television and as a computer monitor. Although the HDTV picture was stunning, few of us will want to rush out and spend \$7000 for an HDTV monitor and VCR! Still, prices always come down quickly and perhaps it will be affordable by this time next year or the year after.

The new flat-screen displays were also seen in many booths and some of them looked very good but their price is also high and still puts them out of the reach of most of us.

One of the most exciting things we saw at the show was a new removable-media disk drive from ORB. It is similar to Iomega's Zip or Jaz drives. The difference is in price and capacity. The Zip disk holds 100Mb and costs \$13.95. A Jaz disk holds 1,000Mb and costs \$89.95. The Orb disk holds 2,200Mb and sells for only \$29.95 each! The drives sell for \$199.95 and come in three types – internal IDE, internal SCSI, or external parallel port. This should be very popular and could very well push Iomega into bank-

ruptcy (again.) Iomega, on the other hand announced a new Zip drive that holds 250Mb per cartridge. Whoopie.

We spent a bit of time looking at color laser printers. There are more and more available and the print quality can be great but, despite what you may see in the magazines, they are still pretty expensive. I've seen prices of \$1,995.00 but closer investigation shows the usual platitude still holds – you get what you pay for!

We saw lots of vendors offering machines to duplicate CD-ROM's, lots of DVD devices and just about everything else but there really wasn't any "theme" to this year's show nor were there many "knock your socks off" displays. Most booths were rather restrained and the freebies that used to be so exciting and so much a part of COMDEX were few and far apart. I thought I'd come home loaded with CD's of demo software and catalogs but in fact I brought home less than a dozen disks!

Many booths indicated further information could be found on their web sites but if you can get full details at the web site, why bother with the expense and pain of COMDEX? I won't be surprised if this

show dies out in a few years!

Next week Valerie will tell you about the one program she bought at the show and another that should have been at the show but wasn't!

COMDEX is only open during the day and we somehow found the energy to enjoy a bit of frolicking (not to mention gambling) in the evenings. Elvis Presley may have left the building permanently over twenty-one years ago but he still appears nightly at the Fremont Street Experience in downtown Las Vegas.

We stayed at what used to be known as the Union Plaza Hotel at the western end of Fremont Street. The hotel is now known as Jackie Gaughan's Plaza Hotel. Walk out the front door of the Plaza and across the street to the "Fremont Street Experience" and we'll tell you about it next week.
