Councilors Retire By Evan Kramer



The Port Orford City Council met Monday night with Mayor Gary Doran wishing everyone a merry holiday. Doran thanked the public works crew for their efforts during the recent flooding of Garison Lake.

Public Works Director Jerry McNurlin said regarding the lake salinity level it has gone up - just below the surface of the water all over the lake.

The fire department reported one house fire and George Gehrke has replaced Frank Barrows as fire chief because of Barrow's illness.

Police Chief Bill Rush went over his report and said he needs 4-5 advisors to help form and run an Explorer Post in Port Orford. He asked the council permission to advertise to fill the police position left vacant when Jody Conn resigned.

Rick Cook is the interim parks commission chairperson. There is one vacancy on the commission due to the resignation of Ernie Gordon.

The council moved into citizen's comments where Alice Pfand spoke to them

about the sewer spill on Arizona Street. She said she had witnessed the sewer spill going directly into the lake. She said a little gully had formed where the spill was running into the lake. Pfand said she wanted it on the record that the spill had gone into the lake.

The council heard a motion from councilor Ralph Donaldson "authorizing the City go ahead with the Wetlands Interpretive Center program as planned and authorize City Administrator Johnny Alexander to negotiate with Oregonians in Action (OIC) to make the center a reality." The motion passed unanimously. The property is owned by OIC and is located between 16th and 17th Streets on the west side of Highway 101.

Mayor Doran recommended the appointment of Justin Bauman for another two-year term on the Planning Commission. He also recommended appointment of Rick Francona to fill one of two vacant positions on the planning commission. The council unanimously concurred with the Mayor's recommendations. There is still one vacancy on the planning commission. If you're interested in serving on it write a letter to Mayor Doran and turn it in at the city office.

Councilor Norm Leeling asked a big question referring to the KCM study of efflu-

ent outfall alternatives. He asked where are we going and how are we going to proceed. Councilor Donaldson suggested Johnny Alexander contact DEQ and ask them what they want and are willing to fund. Councilor Robert Warring said he hated to see the City panic into doing something that doesn't work out again. He wants more information from ocean scientist Bill McDougall. Councilor elect Nathaniel Wander suggested KCM look at a couple of ocean outfall alternatives and where else besides Congress we can go for money for the project. Warring pointed out no research had been done in the KCM report and he was concerned about the health hazards of using Tichenor Cove as an outfall alternative. Donaldson spoke against council procrastination and said the first time around on the drain field procrastination had cost the city hundreds of thousands of dollars. Al Affonso asked what it would cost to maintain the new system. He said he didn't see that information in the KCM report. Outgoing councilor Carl Eskelson said there should be a maintenance impact statement with the report. Leeling said he has no valid information to base a decision on. He said he was reluctant to give up the idea of a land treatment system. Donaldson reminded the council they're

**Curry General Hospital

The district continues bond-funded repairs and upgrades, improving service and patient care. This is a column to keep tax payers up to date.

- Architects are finalizing remodel plans and requesting contractor bids for "Phase 1" including nursing station and patient rooms, heating/air flow.
- CGH has requested contractor bids to complete the roof. Work to date was completed by in-house maintenance crews.
- The CT scanner will receive a major upgrade to increase the speed and diagnostic capabilities.
- The hospital signed a purchase contract for a refurbished modern radio-fluoroscopy unit to replace the current x-ray machine. Cost for the equipment is about

\$125,000. It will require about \$4,000 in remodel costs.

- The hospital purchased and delivered a new training manikin to the Port Orford Community ambulance.
- Two new physicians will begin staffing Curry Family Medical Monday, January 4th, in Port Orford. Vicki Webb, M.D., family practice doctor; and Don Venes, M.D., internal medicine specialist, will share a full-time position providing coverage with the current family practice doctor on staff, Tom Pitchford, M.D.
- Curry General announces the opening of a new Coumadin blood testing clinic in Brookings and Gold Beach to benefit cardiac patients. Watch for the opening date and ribbon cutting in mid January.
- The search continues for an eligible candidate to participate in the district's Gift of Sight program co-sponsored with

the area Lions clubs. Anyone unable to pay for cataract surgery can contact a Lions club representative in Curry County, or phone (541) 247-3187.

- Revenues decreased in November to \$487,000 down from \$536,000 in October. Operating room activity remained strong, however, with a total of 40 surgeries in November, compared to an average monthly figure for 1998 of 27 surgeries per month.
- The public is invited to attend the next Curry Health District board meeting at 2:30pm, Wednesday, January 20, in Port Orford City Hall.

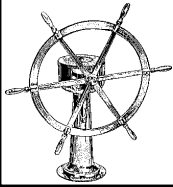

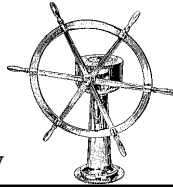

Services for Ellen Warring

A memorial service was held for Ellen Warring on Saturday at the Port Orford Christian Center with her, and Bob's, longtime friend John Jones leading the service. Many people included relatives and friends shared their memories and feelings about Ellen.

When Valerie and I moved to Port Orford 8 ½ years ago some of the first people I met were Ellen and Bob Warring. I was enchanted by the way the two of them have landscaped and designed their basket studio and still marvel at its natural "Oregon coastal town" feeling. Valerie was doing some typesetting for the Kalmiopsis Audubon Society and took me over to their basket studio. Ellen and Bob had a black Labrador named Jacob as well as another dog and a couple of cats. Ellen graciously took care of my black Labrador Myrtle a couple of times when Valerie and I went on trips. Ellen had a wonderful way with animals and, as I was to learn, with people.

Ellen was very involved with community organizations during the time I knew her. When I first moved here she was the land

use conservation representative for the Audubon Society and represented them before the County Planning Commission month after month for at least three years. She also served at different times as the Kalmiopsis president and newsletter editor. Ellen was a charter member of the Port Orford Watershed Council, which formed in early 1994. She served as the Council's secretary and took thorough and complete minutes of the meetings. Only illness forced her off the Council. Ellen also served on the Port Orford Planning Commission and brought with her a thorough understanding of land use law. Ellen was extremely interested in things to do with water, for she also served on the governor's Ocean Policy Advisory Council and the Coastal Natural Hazards Policy Working Group. She also was a member of the New River Advisory Committee and has helped the Bureau of Land Management on their purchase of the Storm Ranch and land adjacent to New River.

Ellen was many other things besides being a community activist. She was a mother to three adopted children, a grandmother and a friend to almost everyone in Port Orford. She was a skilled musician

and played several instruments including the recorder, viola, cello, harpsichord and the piano. She played with the Kammeroque Ensemble for years. Three members of that group played a couple of musical selections at Ellen's memorial.

Ellen had a wonderful sense of humor and a great, hearty laugh. She preferred laughter to sitting around and bad mouthing people she disagreed with.

I feel that Port Orford has lost one of its most effective and giving residents. I can't help but think, with her expertise on ocean issues and excellent contacts in government, of the contribution she could have made to the City of Port Orford on their search for a new sewer outfall to the replace the one at Agate Beach. She is, and will be, missed.

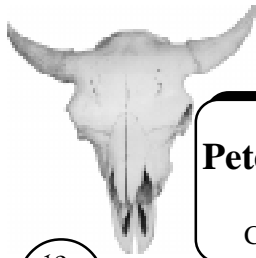

I have a friend in New Zealand who taught in a primary school near the city of Auckland. In the last week before Christmas, which marks the beginning of

the summer vacation, Chas learned that in his class for the following year would be a student who nobody had been able to do anything with. She was not a bright kid, had slipped behind somewhere in the process so that she was now older than her classmates and had the reputation of being difficult. Teachers had tried but hadn't been able to unlock this child from whatever it was that kept her back. Chas grabbed a piece of chalk, bent down in front of the girl and drew a wild circle on the floor at her feet. He dived his hand into his pocket and came up with a large silver coin. Waving this in her face he pointed to the circle on the floor and challenged her – "I bet you half-a-crown you can't cover it," meaning of course that she couldn't wet that large an area if she tried, not even for half-a-crown.

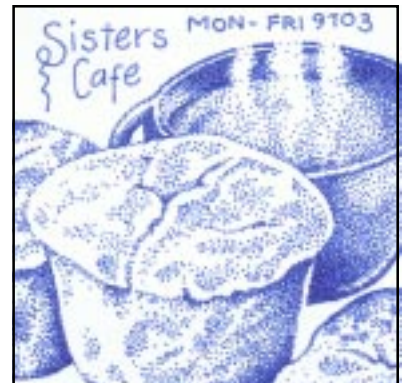

going to have to meet the Mutual Agreement and Order (MAO) deadline with DEQ for replacement of the outfall. He wanted to set a date for the vote on an outfall alternative. Mayor Doran asked Johnny Alexander to check with different agencies about funding and deadlines. Councilor elect Jane Cramer suggested the council take more time to find out what the councilors need in the way of information to make a decision. She suggested the City form a citizen committee to help research the issues. Leeling said it would be helpful to get information on offshore sand movements and cost estimates for alternative ocean outfalls. Mayor Doran asked Johnny Alexander to get a time frame from KCM on their updated report.

Ralph Donaldson made a motion authorizing the city administrator to send copies of all press releases to both newspapers and send notices of city vacancies to both papers and all legal notices to the Port Orford News. The motion passed 4-2.

Jim Campbell offered a motion, which passed authorizing Bill Rush to advertise

for the second police office position.

New Business

Jane Cramer spoke about a City party for people to do fun things and make it a dessert potluck. She recommended the first Sunday in February for the party and said if she had to she would do it herself. She asked if the City would sponsor the party and Norm Leeling responded by making a motion for the City to sponsor a community potluck dessert party on Sunday, February 7. The council voted 6-0 for the party.

The council passed Resolution 99-02 consenting to ownership changes in TCI Falcon Cable which is being merged with AT & T.

The council passed three motions based on recommendations from Johnny Alexander. The City will continue its insurance coverage with J.G. Newman; unused sick leave accrued by city employees will be paid to them, and employees will be allowed to carry over vacation time into the next year. The council authorized Johnny Alexander to serve on the Coos Curry Douglas Business Development Corporation.

Carl Eskelson gave his final report as City streets liaison. He said the streets are in good shape. He concluded by reminding whoever takes over his liaison position next year that he was expecting to see the streets in good shape.

Mayor Doran thanked outgoing councilors Carl Eskelson and Tim Sparks. Tim has served 9 ¾ years on the council and Carl has served 9 years. Doran led a standing ovation for these two dedicated public servants.

The council adjourned to an executive board meeting and came back into regular session with a couple of motions.

Councilor Campbell stated the following motion "instructing our attorney (Randall Tosh) to proceed with a letter of dismissal in the Mayea appeal (Mayea vs. City of Port Orford) from his attorney subject to approval of the city council and knowledge of the exact amount of money returned. It passed 6-0. It sounds like Mayea is withdrawing his appeal to LUBA concerning the Battle Rock Wayfinder Site.

Jim Campbell offered a motion to proceed with the contract and raises stipulated with Police Chief Bill Rush. It passed unanimously.

Mayor Doran set Monday, January 25 as the date for the new councilor workshop meeting. It had been scheduled for Saturday, December 12, but was cancelled.
