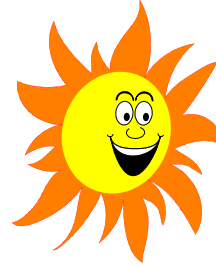

Garrison Lake Breach

The Port Orford City Council met on Monday night and held an unusually short meeting compared to years past, clocking in at 25 minutes.

Mayor Gary Doran noted the passing away of police reserve officer Brian Coady. He said there was a real nice service for him earlier in the day.

Councilor Emily Francona asked about the Eleventh Street mess. Police Chief Bill Rush said he had given the people a courtesy notice and they had ten days to abate the problem. Rush said he was going by the city ordinances. He said the situation should be resolved by the next council meeting.

Councilor Jim Auburn said he had attended the dedication of the Freedom Tree in Buffington Park. It was planted in the hummingbird garden area. Auburn said the mess at the tennis courts had been cleaned up.

City attorney John Trew said he had received a letter from county counsel Jerry Herbage. It regarded the conservation easement in the city watershed on the 140 acres on North Fork Hubbard

Creek. Trew said the county would be holding a public hearing in Port Orford on Monday, July 7, at 2:30pm in the city hall council chambers. The purpose of the meeting is to take public comment on the conservation easement. Trew recommended the city council support the purchase by the county of the conservation easement. When the deal is complete the county will sign over the conservation easement to the city.

Frank Cramer was the only person speaking under citizen's concerns. Cramer said the public works department has treated 5.918 millions of gallons of water in May and that 4.037 millions of gallons of water had been treated at the wastewater plant. Cramer said we were paying for water we weren't getting. Public works superintendent Dave Pace said he had contacted a company about testing the water lines and looking for leaks. He talked about replacing some of the old water meters. Pace said some of the water had been used flushing the water lines. He said the department was constantly working on tightening the system.

The population on the "Entering Port Orford" sign at the south end of town has been updated to 1,200.

The police department was given a digital camera by councilor Jim Auburn. It will save the department hundreds of dollars a year in not having to process film.

Port Orford City Administrator Erna Barnett wrote about the status of the Garrison Lake breach in her monthly report. In her own words:


The City is presently talking with our insurance company regarding recovering costs for the reconstruction of Arizona Street including the new sewer collection pipeline, which needs to be installed. We are also discussing the possibility of recovering the losses via a civil suit. Prior to the breach, the City received a grant from the Rural Investment Board for improvements to Arizona Street. Additional monies may be available from ODOT. A diver will be assessing the sand at the projected site of the outfall; it is a possibility that the breaching of the lake in May resulted in that canyon being filled with sand. The total loss from the breach could be as high as \$100,000.

There were 772 visitors at the Battle Rock Park visitor center in May. New volunteers include Mark Murray and Jeri Thurkow.

I Need Your Help

I need your help in keeping the funeral home in Port Orford open. Since 1994, I have been owner/manager of Myrtle Grove Funeral Service in Coquille (Coos County) and Port Orford Funeral Service (Curry County). Recently I received a phone call from the State Board informing me that I needed to make a request to the Board for authorization to manage multiple facilities. I had recently opened Myrtle Grove Funeral Service – Bay Area in Coos Bay (Coos County) and transferred my license from managing Coquille and Port Orford facilities to managing Coos Bay and Port Orford facilities. OAR 830-030-0000(9) states, “the Board may authorize a funeral service practitioner to manage more than one funeral establishment or immediate disposition company the Board, in its sole discretion, determines that the management of more than one funeral establishment or immediate disposition company by a single funeral service practitioner is in the public interest.”

If I did not have written permission over the past nine years to manage more than

one facility, why did the state issue me licenses year after year and cash my checks for all of the license fees. There are licensees all across Oregon who presently manage more than one facility. The Oregon State Mortuary and Cemetery Board denied my request to manage more than one facility saying that it is “not in the best interest of the public.” I do not understand how they can believe having no funeral home in Port Orford would be “in the best interest of the public.” After nine years of operating more than one facility, the board has said that I either have to hire another licensee to manage one of them or close the doors of one of the facilities. Port Orford does not have a large enough volume of business (due to low population base) to justify the expense of hiring a licensed manager solely to operate Port Orford Funeral Service. So this solution is not financially feasible. This does not mean that Port Orford, and its surround area, does not deserve to have a funeral home. Should Curry County be limited to only one funeral home located at the most southern tip of the county in Brookings?

After speaking with Representative Wayne Krieger’s office, it has been suggested that I send the Board another

request to allow me to simultaneously manage Coos Bay and Port Orford. I need to include with my request, letters from the community stating why this “is in the best interest of the public.” Keep in mind that the funeral home does bring in business to motels, restaurants, stores, florist, attorneys, etc. I firmly believe that the people of Port Orford have more knowledge of what the needs of the community are than the Board sitting in Portland. The Board has given me until July 14, 2003 to resolve this. They have informed me “failure to comply with this deadline may result in disciplinary action.” If the Board will not allow this exception for Port Orford I have no choice but to close. I have served families in the Port Orford area for many years and “I Do Not Want to Quit Now.”

I will put input from the public directly into my packet with my request. I will also forward copies to our elected officials to keep them informed of the situation with the Board. If you wish to communicate directly with the Board, please feel free to do so.

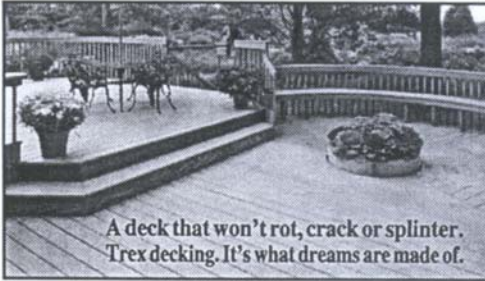

Iron Mountain Hike

Walking and hiking enthusiasts are invited to join Curry Family Medical's guided hiking program, "Exploring Our Backyard," when coordinator Cathy Boden leads a group 4,026 feet above the coast to botanically diverse Iron Mountain, Saturday, June 28.

Walkers can meet to arrange carpools at 8:30 a.m., at the Family Adventure Center

in Buffington Park, at 14th and Arizona, Port Orford. Alternately, walkers can meet the group at the Elk River Fish Hatchery at 9 a.m.

Besides good shoes and a wind jacket, participants can bring a day pack, sack lunch, water, map, compass and camera.

Iron Mountain is located 33 miles up the Elk River on a ridge of serpentine soils that drastically influences what lives there, Boden says. Hikers will look for the rare Siskiyou iris, Brewer's Spruce, Cat's Ears and other interesting wild flowers. Although steep and rocky in places, the trail mostly follows an old road and is rated for all abilities. Hikers can choose to diverge up a short steep spur to the summit for unending views of the Siskiyou Range.

"Come join us for a unique view of what lies in our own backyard," Boden says. For details, phone Boden at (541) 332-1042.

Elk River Road Repairs

Starting on or around July 15 this summer the Federal Highway Administration will begin repairs on damaged sections of Elk River Road above the Fish Hatchery. They have hired a contractor to complete this \$1.5 million job. The road will be closed through October 31 and the contractor must stop work by the time the salmon run begins this fall. Elk River Road is actually Forest Service Road 5325 above the hatchery. It will be closed at milepost 3.2 though milepost 7.8. There are 13 locations along the road pinpointed for repairs, which will mainly include building retaining walls. The city received five Permit Clearance requests for building permits in May.

Councilor Jim Campbell made a motion the council approves Resolution 2003-30 and it passed unanimously. This Resolution extends the contract between the City of Port Orford and the Port Orford Rural Fire District through October 31, 2003 while the two parties negotiate a new contract. The District will pay the city a prorated amount of \$1,250 per month.

Councilor Jim Auburn made a motion the council approves Resolution 2003-31 and it passed 5-0. This Resolution is for a Special City Allotment Grant for \$25,000 to help repair the damage on Arizona Street. The grant would come from the Oregon Department of Transportation. The City estimates it will take \$50,000 to bring Arizona Street back on line as one lane street (northbound).

Jim Auburn made a motion to approve the consent calendar (items which are voted on in mass and not discussed). It passed 5-0 and included in it were two liquor license applications, the minutes of three meetings and Resolution 2003-29 declaring the city's election to receive state revenue.

The next regular session is July 21.

Jerry Can Race July 5

The Point Orford Heritage Society will host the second running of the annual Jerry Can races at the Port Orford Lifeboat Station museum located in the Port Orford Heads State Park on July 5, 2003 as part of the Port Orford Jubilee celebrations. The races kick off at 1:00pm.

Jerry Cans are military fuel cans. Why are they called “jerry cans?” During World War II, British soldiers serving in the deserts of North Africa noted that the German military fuel cans were superior to their own – they did not split when

falling off a truck. The British adopted the German design and called them “Jerry cans.” “Jerry” was the nickname used by the British to refer to German soldiers.

During the early days of the Port Orford Lifeboat Station, the Coast Guardsmen - the “Coasties” - had to carry fuel from the main station area down to the boat-house located in Nellies Cove, 280 feet down a staircase of over 530 steps. They carried the fuel in five-gallon cans, the Jerry cans, one in each hand. Each can weighs about 42 pounds when loaded with diesel fuel.

To appreciate the effort made by the Coasties, the Point Orford Heritage Society welcome you to the Jerry Can Races. Two person relay teams will carry two Jerry cans - one in each hand - over a 50-yard course. Winners will be determined by the fastest times in each class. Classes are determined by the combined ages of the team members, in a men's (42-pound cans) and women's division (20-pound cans). All participants will receive a commemorative photo of themselves. Contestants must be at least 16 years of age. Overall winners' names will be added to the perpetual trophy on display in the museum.
