Off and Running

2004 had hardly begun before things got interesting on the south coast. A major power outage occurred at 2:00 am on Friday morning, January 2, when trees fell on a major Bonneville

Transmission line near the rural community of Fairview. Coos Bay and North Bend went dark and didn't get power restored for over 26 hours. Many of the major businesses in Coos Bay and North Bend were open on Friday only because they had generators. Fred Meyer, Bi-Mart, and the Mill Casino were open for business with auxiliary power but gas stations and many other businesses were shuttered. The power outage had a big effect on Bandon and to a lesser extent in Port Orford as Bay Area residents and tourists drove south in search of gasoline and supplies. Some people waited as long as half an hour to get gas in Bandon and the motels were full. Other people seeking to escape the cold and lack of electric power came down to Port Orford and checked into motels for the night. The Chevron station in Port Orford had one of the busiest days in its history on Friday.

The power in the City of Port Orford stayed on during the major disruption but some outlying areas including parts of Elk River and Sixes River were blacked out by the electric co-op to keep other areas up and running. There was an area wide power outage on Thursday morning around 2:00am, which affected the entire area but it didn't last long.

Marty Curtis, Port Orford district manager for Coos-Curry Electric said sections of Brookings and Harbor were without power for 12-14 hours on Friday. As they were put back on line other areas were taken off circuit including the Langlois substation, which affected customers from Elk River to Bandon. The Elk River substation was also taken off circuit. Curtis described what went on as rationing and said everyone had learned a lot about the weaknesses of the electricity transmission system.

Elk River Fish Hatchery manager Robin Crissler said that on Friday morning at 11:00am the hatchery had voluntarily gone off the power grid. The hatchery stayed in operation with the use of their generators. Crissler mentioned that the rainfall total for the Hatchery in December was 29.69".

The Curry County Commissioners decided to close the county offices at noon

on Friday and send the employees home. Don't worry they didn't close the jail and send everyone home, nor did the sheriff's department close. The commissioners took this action voluntarily as the electric co-op had been asking people to close down to conserve power. Commissioner Lucie La Bonte said that both McKay's and Ray's Place Market in Gold Beach also turned off their electricity but continued to operate with generators. La Bonte said the power was out in the Brookings-Harbor area for 12 hours on Friday but Gold Beach didn't go down.

Power was restored to different areas at different times but we at the Fun Zone felt that things were pretty well back to normal when the Carroll's Web Internet service was restored just before noon on Saturday. Because it is routed through Coos Bay, it had been down since the power went out there on Friday morning.

The County Commissioners met on Monday, January 5 and elected Marlyn Schafer chair and Ralph Brown as vice-chair for 2004. The County welcomed new sheriff Mark Metcalf who was sworn in the previous Friday, replacing Kent Owens who had retired.

Garrison Lake continues to rise and on Tuesday morning the lake level stood at

Cheaper Voters' Pamphlet

Secretary of State Bill Bradbury is excited to reveal a new format for the 75 arguments filed in favor and against Measure 30. By reducing the amount of unused white space in each argument, the size of the pamphlet was reduced by 12 full pages. This saves the state an estimated \$21,000 in costs to the Emergency Fund, or 8.4% of the projected total Voters' Pamphlet cost of \$249,000. "I'm thrilled that we could conserve precious tax dollars while still allowing all voices to be fully heard in the debate over Measure 30," said Bradbury.

Delivery of the Voters' Pamphlet for the February 3, 2004, Special State Election, will begin tomorrow. All Oregon residences will receive their official state guide to Measure 30 beginning on January 7 and continuing through January 9.

The cover of the Voters' Pamphlet features the monumental Leo Friedlander

sculpture of Meriwether Lewis, William Clark and Sacagawea that stands in front of the 1938 Oregon State Capitol. 2004 marks the beginning of the Bicentennial of the Corps of Discovery Expedition. "As we celebrate this Bicentennial," said Bradbury, "I hope all Oregonians learn as much about the purposes and effects of Measure 30 as they can, register to vote if they are not now registered, and cast an informed vote to decide our state's future."

The pamphlet is also available online, in both English and Spanish, and audiotapes are available for free to the visually impaired. Ballots will be mailed January 16 to 20. New voter registrations must be mailed no later than January 13 in order to receive ballots for the February 3 election.

Klamath First Bank is no longer as of January 1, 2004. The bank, based in Klamath Falls, merged with Sterling Savings Bank of Spokane, Washington as of the first of the year. Glaucoma's effects on the eyes are slow and usually painless, but the vision loss that occurs is permanent—irreversible.

It is estimated that three million Americans have glaucoma and one-half of that population is not aware they have it. Those at high risk for glaucoma include African Americans over age 40, every-

one over age 60, and individuals with a family history of glaucoma.

A cure does not exist; however, early detection is the key to controlling the disease. Regular eye examinations are important in early detection.

If you or a loved one have not had a comprehensive eye exam in over a year, or are at high risk for developing glaucoma, make an appointment with your eye care professional today. It could be the most important appointment you put on your new calendar.

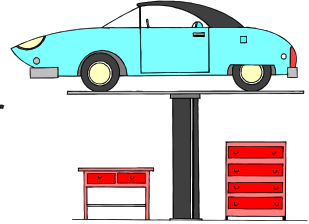

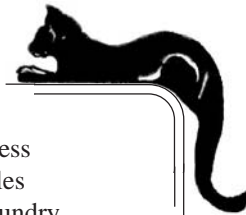

Shellfish Licenses

It's now the law in Oregon that any person 14 years of age or older who harvests any shellfish, including but not limited to crabs, clams, mussels, abalone, oysters, paddocks, shrimp, or scallops must have in their possession a valid recreational shellfish license. Any person harvesting crayfish or freshwater clams does not need a license. The new law went into effect on January 1, 2004.

The fee for an annual resident license is \$6.50. The fee for an annual non-resident license is \$16.50 and the fee for a three-day non-resident license will be \$9.00. All revenue collected from the

recreational shellfish license will be dedicated to shellfish-related programs operated by the Oregon Department of Agriculture, Oregon State Police and the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife. The standard bail for not having a valid license is \$75.

Recreational shellfish licenses can be purchased in Port Orford at McNair True Value Hardware.

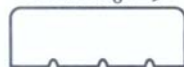

In Curry County, the Edson Creek and Sixes River Recreation sites will have slightly increased fees. According to the BLM all fees collected will be used to help improve and maintain the sites. Fees are as follows:

- Day use \$2.00 per vehicle
- Group use \$30.00 per site
- Camping \$8.00 per site
- Extra vehicle \$4.00 per vehicle

Changes are also in store for BLM's very popular Loon Lake Recreation Area. Beginning January 12, reservations for the Loon Lake campsites can be made online at www.ReserveUSA.com or over the phone at 1-877-444-6777 (toll free). Most campsites at Loon Lake can now be reserved ahead of time, eliminating the long-standing practice of the waiting list at the gate that sometimes had potential campers waiting in line overnight for a campsite.
