Board Members Elected By Evan Kramer



Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative held their annual meeting on Saturday, June 12 in Myrtle Point at the Fairgrounds. The item of most interest besides the barbecued chicken

lunch was the election for three board members and the owner-members of Coos-Curry Electric elected two new ones. Jean Shank was elected board member in Port Orford Zone 5, defeating Richard AuFranc and incumbent board member Robert McKenzie. Pete Radabaugh defeated incumbent board member Wanda Kaspar in Bandon Zone 8. David Itzen was elected unopposed to the Brookings seat. This will be his second three-year term of office.

I called the Coos Curry office on Monday morning and again on Tuesday morning trying to get the election results (the numbers) but was unsuccessful. A private citizen who didn't want his name used provided me with the results for the Port Orford position and some other figures. There were a total of 1,479 votes cast out of 13,479 ballots mailed out to the owner/members. Jean Shank received 639 votes, Robert McKenzie 463 and

Richard AuFranc 377. Eleven percent of the members voted in the board election. We don't know what the vote count was in the Bandon position, which Pete Radabaugh won by a narrow margin.

Radabaugh and Shank stated that as a result of the recent NRECA Business Audit, Coos-Curry Electric "has made a great start in identifying needs and has begun making suggested improvements to continue to bring positive changes to our Co-op. All of our resources plan to work together as a team: owner/members, employees and the Board." Both Radabaugh and Shank said they were grateful to have been elected to the Board and were looking forward to working with every team member. They thanked everyone for their support.


search for terrorists, and of not going to war against a sovereign nation. The leader did not listen.)

Fire Season Alert By Gayle Wilcox POVED Chief

All citizens should be well prepared for our fire season. If we plan and prepare as a community; we will be more able to escape the fire season with **no** damage or loss of life.

The first step is to remember to immediately phone 911 if you see fire, think you see fire or smell unexplained smoke. We would rather respond to a false alarm than to an out of control fire that was phoned in late.

You need to make your property and home as safe from fire as possible.

- Follow all burn permit rules and regulations. Permits <u>are required</u> for all burn barrels and open burns. Call 332-5383 for permit info.
- Remove overhanging limbs especially dead ones and ones close to flue outlets.
- 3. Remove all flammable material from against buildings, under foundations and in eaves. Remove leaves, moss and needles from gutters and between shingles.

- 4. Outdoor fireplaces and barbecues should be maintained in good working order, screened when appropriate, be clear of surrounding debris and overhanging limbs. Extreme caution should be used in disposing of brickets. Have a method of extinguishing fire close at hand.
- 5. Make sure you road is clear for our fire apparatus. We will be happy to inspect your road for access if you call us. (Daytime 332-0445). The current County driveway specifications require a 16-foot wide clearance and must include a vehicle turnaround if your driveway is longer than 150 feet. For additional details, please consult the County Planning Department.
- 6. Wood piles should be uphill and at a safe distance from your home.
- 7. Rake leaves and twigs away from your home.
- Keep hoses attached to your outside hose bibs.
- 9. Keep grass mowed, especially when dry.

- Remove accumulations of dead wood, limbs and shrubs from under trees.
- 11. Have an escape plan from your home and your property.
- 12. Make sure your home has smoke detectors and that they are working.
- Be aware of fire dangers and potential dangers wherever you are. Lend a hand to a neighbor or friend if they cannot accomplish these tasks themselves.
- 14. Call us (Port Orford Volunteer Fire Department at 332-0445) if you have any questions or concerns.
- 15. Call 911 for a fire emergency.
- 16. You must post your address so it is clear and visible from the road. The ambulance and fire crews need a visible address on your house and/ or pointing to your house. This saves valuable time in locating your residence. The City of Port Orford has an ordinance requiring your street address be visible.

With wildland fires burning and the potential for one to start in our community – Please make your property fire safe!

Tincup Trail Hike

Experienced hikers are invited to join Al Collinet when he leads the Muscle Busters hiking group to a remote part of the Chetco River at Boulder Creek, Saturday, June 19. The group will meet at the Tincup Trailhead in Siskiyou National Forest, at 9:15 a.m. Those wishing to carpool can meet at 7:20 a.m. at the Gold Beach Event Center; or at 8 a.m. at The Brookings Clinic. The trail is six miles round-trip with a total elevation gain of 1,600 feet divided up into sections, Collinet reports, "so it will not seem like a lot."

About ¾ of a mile into the hike and again on the return trip, hikers will cross Mislatnah Creek. Sturdy wading shoes and walking sticks are mandatory, Collinet says. He also advises wearing pants that can be rolled up. "Long pants will be helpful in warding off mosquitoes along the trail." The group will stop for lunch

on the river "where the mosquitoes disappear." Hikers also should wear appropriate hiking boots, hats and sunscreen. Bring drinking water, lunch and optional wildlife guides, cameras or binoculars. Be prepared for any weather.

Those driving their own vehicles can access the Tincup Trail from Brookings by driving up North Bank Chetco River Road to FS Road 1376, to spur road 360, to spur road 365 to the trailhead. Gravel road sections are in good shape. Allow at least an hour and 15 minutes to drive to the trailhead.

Following the hike, those who are interested can drive about a mile to view the Big Craggies in the Kalmiopsis Wilderness. The Muscles Busters tentatively plan an overnight hike to the Devil's Punchbowl, July 24. Those interested in scouting the area sometime this next month should contact Collinet for details at (541) 412-8444.

Are You The Problem? By Valerie Jean Kramer

According to CircleID (www.circle id.com/article/602 0 1 0 C/) about 80% of spam now originates from home computers just like yours. In fact, one of these much-detested computers might very well BE yours!

Spammers are feeling the heat and finding new ways to avoid it. Several spammers have recently been sued and at least one has been sentenced to jail. One way for spammers to avoid capture is to take over other people's computers, and send their spam from these "zombies" rather than send it directly from their own computer. This muddles the trail and makes the spammer harder to locate and prosecute. It also allows the spammer to send more messages more quickly. Just what we need. NOT! The exact number of machines that have been taken over (for all purposes) is unknown but very large. The whitehouse.gov web site had to change their IP address recently because at least 250,000 computers were believed to be infected with a worm that was set to attack their old one.

It is not difficult to take control of an unprotected computer and all computers are unprotected unless the owner takes significant steps to protect it. (1. Apply all critical Windows Updates. 2. Install Anti-Virus software. 3. Install firewall software. 4. Keep all of this software up-to-date. 5. Keep yourself up to date so you understand the current threats!) As I reported recently, a machine can be subverted in no more than 15 minutes and an unprotected computer on the Internet lasts only about 3 hours on average. (Note: that is 3 hours total connect time, not one threehour stretch!) http://www.cert.org/ tech tips/home networks.html#I-B is a good starter list of questions and answers about security.

You should be aware of your computer's online activity. You can monitor that easily by observing the little icon of two computer screens in the lower right hand corner of your monitor. Normally the screens of these two computers appear dim. When your computer is sending data, one of them will "light up". When receiving data, the other lights up. You will see a little activity from time to time

even when you aren't causing it. Normally that is ok. If you see a significant amount of activity that you cannot account for, then your computer may be under attack or may already be taken over. It's time to do some serious checking!

Note: This icon is displayed automatically when you connect to the Internet with a modem. If your connection is NOT through a modem, then you need to enable the icon. To do so, go to Control Panel / Network Connections and rightclick on your network then choose "Properties". Near the bottom you should see a check box that says something like "Show icon...". Make sure the box has a check mark in it. You should then have the icon showing at all times.

Attention City Water Users

The City of Port Orford is required to distribute a Consumer Confidence Report to the City's water users. The report was sent out to the water users in April. In the report a required table was left out by mistake. The table shows what contaminants are tested for in your water system and the levels detected for the 2003 year.

Contaminant	Violation	Level Detected	Unit of Measure	MCLG	MCL	Likely Source of Contamination

MCL (Maximum Contaminant Level) The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water.

MCLG ... (Maximum Contaminant Level Goal) The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health.

AL (Action Level) The concentration of a contaminant, which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements, which a water system must follow.

ppb..... (parts per billion)

In May of 2003 the City of Port Orford received a violation for not reporting enough routine Coliform tests. This violation was caused by the testing laboratory performing the wrong type of test for Fecal Coliform on a routine sample submitted for testing resulting in the State Drinking Water Program not accepting the test results. The results from the sample submitted were negative and at no time was the Public Health compromised. This matter was resolved with the State finally accepting the test results that were performed.


