## **Traveling the Oregon Coast By Evan Kramer**



A group of us took a trip up to Newport on Sunday to visit the Oregon Coast Aquarium. We also wanted to see if my new used 1995 Buick LeSabre was up to a 300 mile round trip from

Port Orford. We had planned to eat at Mo's Seafood on the waterfront in Newport. We drove down the main street where Mo's is located and kept driving and driving and couldn't find a parking place. That part of Newport was wall-to-wall cars and people. So we gave up on that idea and drove over to Highway 101 and ate at the Courthouse Café. Then we drove over to the Oregon Coast Aquarium and paid our admission (a bit steep at \$11.25 but a 10% discount is available if someone in your party is a member of the Triple A auto club).

This month the special exhibit features not creatures that live under water but bats, mammals that hang upside down above the ground or water. The emphasis of the exhibits was partly to debunk the myths about bats and partly to point out the many benefits that bats are responsible for like eating flying insects all night long.

From there we visited the enclosed aviary and were captivated by the numerous tufted puffins. They put on a quite a show swimming under water and with their bright orange beak and blond tufts are a very distinctive bird. They are found off the Oregon coast but few people have seen them this far south. They nest on offshore islands but because they burrow into the ground, need to find an island with enough soil to dig out a nest. From there we visited the three indoor aquariums known as Passages of the Deep where visitors walk in a tunnel through the aquarium. The most popular of the three areas contains the sharks and manta rays. The way the exhibit is built the fish and sharks are swimming under you, to the sides of you and over you.

From there we walked outside and went to the otter area to watch those playful funny animals. They were all active and putting on a good show, which was nice timing for those who were at the aquarium.

The most famous former resident of the Aquarium died last year at the age of 27. Keiko the killer whale and star of Free Willy and Free Willy II was living in Taknes Bay off the coast of Norway when he died of pneumonia on December 12, 2003. Keiko was the star attraction at the Aquarium between 1996 and

1998 and is fondly remembered to this day. He is commemorated in drawings done by school children, which are on display at the Aquarium.

Once we finished walking around the Aquarium we headed back to Coos Bay driving back through the classic Oregon coastal towns of Waldport and Yachats. As you can imagine they, just like Newport, were crawling with people and cars. This is the Oregon Coast and it is summer. We stopped the car at Stone Beach, north of the Sea Lion Caves and took a walk. It was fine if you don't mind getting sand blasted but to be honest the wind was blowing too hard and made it very cold.

My favorite thing to do while tooling up and down the coast whether as a passenger or as a driver is enjoying all the classic cars and trucks which are on the road this time of year. The ones we saw

Sunday tended heavily toward fully restored 1950's and 60's brightly painted vintage American cars. One advantage to this show is that since the cars will be parked you'll have a chance to leisurely take photos of them and talk with the owners. Remember the watchword these car owners live by – look but don't touch, and everyone will be happy.

**Honor Labor**

The first Labor Day holiday was observed on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City. This according to the United States Department of Labor website. This Labor Day holiday, which was organized by the Central Labor Union in

New York City, moved to the first Monday in September in 1884.

Oregon was the first state in the union to pass a bill recognizing the first Monday in September as Labor Day. The law was passed on February 21, 1887. In the years following state after state followed Oregon's lead until June 28, 1894 when the United States Congress enacted a law making the first Monday in September each year as a legal holiday known as Labor Day.

On this the one hundred and eleventh Labor Day celebration the nation observes it sporadically. Government offices, banks and the post offices are closed but most small businesses are open. Labor Day means back to school to many students including those in the Port Orford-Langlois 2CJ School District who go back to school on Tuesday, September 7. Labor Day marks the end of summer in the northeast when the area's

amusement parks close for the season, to reopen again on Memorial Day.

Here's what the Department of Labor web site had to say about the American worker. "The vital force of labor added materially to the highest standard of living and the greatest production the world has even known and has brought us closer to the realization of our traditional ideals of economic and political democracy. It is appropriate, therefore, that the nation pay tribute on Labor Day to the creator of so much of the nation's strength, freedom, and leadership – the American worker." Honor labor.

## Hospital Statistics

The number of patient visits around the Curry General Hospital Health Network approximately doubled in some instances, according to statistics comparing the first month of the current fiscal year with the same period last fiscal year.

At Curry General Hospital, medical-surgical patient days during July 2003 totaled 92. Patient days soared to 187 during July 2004.

Also at the hospital, the number of births increased from six in July 2003, to nine in July 2004, with nursery patient days climbing from seven to 21 during that same period. Emergency room visits increased from 249 to 300.

Patient visits increased similarly in the health network's outlying clinics. At Curry Family Medical in Port Orford, patient visits in July 2003 totaled 289. The total in July 2004 jumped to 463.

At The Brookings Clinic, total patient visits increased from 452 in July 2003, to 830 in July 2004.

At Chetco Medical Center in Brookings, patient visits went up from 410 visits in July 2003, to 800 in July 2004.

The statistical report was part of the regular Curry General Hospital management Council report presented during the districts regular board meeting, Wednesday, Aug. 25. Also during the meeting, Ginny Hochberg, chief executive director, announced the hospital's new Cardiac Health Center is preparing to open Sept. 7. Amy Keusink, P.T., is now working at a desk in the new facility 20 hours weekly. She is giving tours to potential donors who have expressed interest in funding vital equipment and supplies. State Inspector Mike McDermott inspected the new facility recently. "We passed with flying colors," Hochberg says.

Medicare will reimburse eligible patients for the rehabilitation services if they have had cardiac problems or surgery in the past 12-18 months, excluding stents, Hochberg adds. Meanwhile, Keusink plans to survey the public for interest in disease prevention classes that will be paid out-of-pocket.



## Sport Fishery to Close

The sport fishery for major groundfish species will close in all saltwater areas (including fishing from shore, in estuaries and the ocean) starting Friday, September 3, 2004, much earlier than originally expected.

This is the first year the sport rockfish fishery will not be open the entire year.

This closure includes all rockfishes, lingcod and greenling. Fishing for cabezon closed in August. Retention of these species is prohibited by all methods of take.

"Landing data for the saltwater sport fishery show that we will meet our limit for the sport harvest of black rockfish and lingcod by the end of this week," said Don Bodenmiller, project leader for marine recreational groundfish fisheries for the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

The decision came after ODFW met informally with representatives of the sport and charter fishing fleet in an emergency meeting on Monday, August 30, in Newport. Others along the coast joined in the discussion through a conference call.

While the commercial nearshore groundfish fishery remains open, the trip limit of black rockfish was cut in half for that fishery in July to prevent an early closure. Other commercial fisheries are not affected by this action.

According to Patty Burke, manager of ODFW's Marine Resources Program, "This is only the second year the fisheries managers have used harvest caps to limit the take of black rockfish, cabezon, greenling and other nearshore groundfish."

Saltwater fishing opportunities, which remain open, include flounder, sole, sand dabs, perch, herring, anchovy, smelt,

sardine, striped bass and offshore pelagic species. Salmon continues to be an active sport fishery and some limited seasons are open for halibut.

### **Letter to the Editor,**

I grew up Republican. I even championed Barry Goldwater for president in 1964.

Back then, being a Republican meant being for a balanced budget and for an honest, Eisenhower-like approach to problems.

Those days are as distant as Ike in his grave.

Today, supporting our Republican President means supporting the largest budget deficits ever, engaging in preemptive wars without cause, and tax breaks for the rich. It means giving away anything that's publicly owned, from the U.S. Treasury on down. Look no further than the Enron boss who is Bush's close friend, and to Halliburton—Cheney's company.

I know there are plenty of Republicans who are great Americans, much of my family and many of my neighbors among them. But the party leadership has let us down in a betrayal of unprecedented proportions. Republican congressmen followed Bush in lockstep—lockstepping off a cliff that fell to places such as Abu Ghraib, taking us all in a freefall from which it will be very difficult to recover.

### Paradise Point Intersection

The latest news in the ongoing saga of building of a left turn lane at Paradise Point Road and Hwy 101 is, "next spring."

Oregon Department of Transportation Lee Sparks said on Monday in his car while traveling on 42 South that the project would be re-bid in Spring of 2005. ODOT had put the project out for bid earlier this summer but both of the two bids received were so far over budget they were rejected. Now ODOT has gone back to the drawing board and reduced the amount of work including less guard rail and re-use of some of the construction materials from one side of the road to the other. Sparks said the

money designated for the Paradise Point intersection has to be spent by July 1, 2005. Sparks said one thing that caused the bids to be so high is the contractors are very busy now. He said some parts of the project will be done in house including painting of the stripes on the road in an effort to save money.

When the project is put out to bid again and a winning bid is accepted Port Orford will get a much needed left turn lane at Highway 101 turning on to Paradise Point Road.


The Port Orford City Council and City Administrator are to be commended for bringing forth a new City Charter for citizen consideration at the November election. The present charter has several conflicting directives (a problem which often occurs when a charter attempts to be too specific), while the proposed charter is especially general and designed for cities of all sizes leaving the specifics to be implemented through the Rules of Council which are set by council resolution. In talking with the City Administrator, it is my understanding that the proposed charter is the "boiler plate" version provided by the League of Oregon Cities and that "the Port Orford version has fewer changes by the city than any other the League has previously provided."

As already explained at the August city council meeting, the major change is toward a manager-council form of government with the mayor no longer having direct powers by virtue of becoming a voting member. With much of the actual details needing to be delegated to the Rules of Council, the proposed charter is workable, but only if attention is paid to keeping power in the hands of the governing body.

The proposed city charter includes no process for calling a special meeting by members of the council and/or the mayor. This needs to be in place prior to times of conflict - whether that be among council members or between the council and administration - and can be included in the Rules of Council. Additionally, nothing is said about setting the council agenda or proposing names for consideration in filling elective vacancies on the council.

I would prefer to see serious consideration given to the title City Administrator as opposed to City Manager which is cited in the proposed charter. The title of "Manager" should not be awarded to the

administrative head of our government until such time as when Port Orford can attract, and pay for, the caliber of professional who can fill that position and all that is implied by the title. In a city the size of Port Orford, the power of the City's chief executive needs to be limited and governed by elected officials who represent the unique history and needs of our community. (There is no reason to change the title in the charter; there it is used merely to designate the chief executive officer.)

Considering the above points, specific changes to be made to the Rules of Council prior to the election for implementation with the new charter on January 1, 2005 include:

- The procedure for the mayor to call a special meeting.
- The procedure for the council to call a special meeting.
- Who proposes candidates to the council to fill empty council seats.
- Under whose auspices is the council agenda set.
- The specific title of the chief executive officer.

Additionally, in the future it might be well to change from setting the Rules of Council by resolution to setting them by ordinance, thus placing the rules within the municipal code as does Brookings who operates under a charter similar to that being proposed.

Although I'm sure that the City will make changes to the Rules of Council incorporating many guidelines from the present charter, without the above specific issues being addressed prior to the election by our well seasoned council I have definite reservations about voting for the proposed charter in spite of the very clear need for a new one. I'd rather sail with a shallow keel than without a rudder.



I don't know about you but I'm always amazed when Bush supporters bring up Kerry's military service. It only highlights Mr. Kerry's commendations and heroism. 


