DeFazio Town Hall Meeting By Evan Kramer



United States Representative Peter DeFazio held a town hall meeting in Port Orford at city hall on September as part of a series of meetings held on the coast to meet with his constituents.

DeFazio thanked people for attending the meeting which had been postponed from August 16 and then August 17 because he went back to Washington D.C. for the 9-11 Commission Report. DeFazio recommended reading the report, which he said, is available for \$10. He said one of the main conclusions, which came out of the report, was that the intelligence services aren't serving us well.

DeFazio was asked what is being done to dredge our Ports. He said the President had recommended in his budget not funding dredging small ports for the second year in a row. The House recently passed a bill to restore \$2.5 million for dredging small ports but the bill hasn't passed the Senate yet. He said many small ports wouldn't get any money.

The Congressman was asked about laws for double hulled oil tankers and if Exxon had paid the fines for the Exxon-Valdez accident. DeFazio said he has advocated disallowing ships from coming into this country which aren't double hulled.

DeFazio was asked why regular unleaded gasoline cost \$1.79 on July 15, 2004 in Cottage Grove while the same day it cost \$2.19 in Port Orford. He said we were being gouged. He continued that as the oil companies have merged they have closed refineries and that there are only three gasoline distributors in Oregon now, down from 12. He urged people to look at the profits of the oil companies and said they made huge profits last quarter.

DeFazio was asked if the election was at risk because of voting machines and there isn't a paper trail for many of them. DeFazio said voting standards were up to the individual states. He said some states claim they don't need a paper trail but he advocated there should be a verifiable paper trail. He was asked what can be done to verify honest election results and was told not much but said Oregon has no problem.

DeFazio encouraged people to vote. He said the election was turning on 19% of the population since only 38% of the people eligible to vote are voting.

School is Back in Session

Curry County Commissioner Lucie La Bonte asked DeFazio about the County reauthorization coming up in 2006 (federal money in lieu of timber receipts). He said he wanted permanent reauthorization for the school monies. He said we weren't going back to the old days of big timber harvests so said the school money guarantee was the best way to go.

DeFazio spoke about the neglect of public infrastructure. He said a billion dollars in infrastructure money creates 47,000 jobs. He said the priority by the current administration is to favor tax cuts over infrastructure. DeFazio said the Army Corps of Engineers was woefully underfunded. He didn't seem pleased when he said we could fund infrastructure in Iraq but not in the United States.

DeFazio was asked about USRDA grants/loans by Port Orford city administrator Ken Knight who also said they used to be weighted heavier towards grants over loans. DeFazio, who is a member of the House Water Resources Subcommittee, said that committee had come up with a bill with \$20 billion worth of grants and no and low interest loans for distressed communities. However, House Majority leader Tom DeLay, wouldn't let the bill be voted on by the full House because it

included a clause for the Davis-Bacon (prevailing wage clause) Act.

DeFazio was asked about the Copper-Salmon Wilderness proposal. DeFazio said the bill wasn't going anywhere and reiterated there weren't going to be any wilderness bills coming out of the House. He gave negative credit to that situation to California Congressman Richard Pombo who is the Chairman of the Committee on Resources in the House. He said Pombo doesn't like wilderness. When Senator Ron Wyden visited Port Orford last year for his town hall meeting he told people he would get on the Copper Salmon Wilderness right away and implied it would get done.

DeFazio was asked about what Congress has done to tighten up the borders against illegal entry. He replied we were only

checking 3 percent of the truck traffic coming into the United States and four percent of the ocean shipping containers.

DeFazio said the deficit figures needed to include the amount of money we're borrowing from the Social Security trust funds and that we now owe that account \$600 billion. He then concluded his meeting, shook a few hands and continued on his way to Coos Bay for the next in a series of four meetings.


Click It or Ticket

The Port Orford Police Department will join other police agencies by participating in the Click It or Ticket Campaign along with the Three Flags Campaign to be conducted on Monday, September 13 through Sunday, September 26. Focus will be on proper use of safety belts, child restraints and watching out for speeders and DUII drivers.

The Click It or Ticket is a nation wide campaign conducted to raise awareness of safety belt and child restraint use. The campaign seeks to reduce the number of motor vehicle-related deaths and injuries by educating the public regarding proper use of safety belts, child safety seats and booster seats. Officers will pay special attention to increasing booster seat use and awareness of a new law that prohibits minors under age 18 from riding in the open bed of a pickup truck.


The Three Flags Campaign is an international selective traffic enforcement program and involves hundreds of law enforcement agencies in Oregon, Washington and British Columbia. The campaign has sought to reduce the number of motor vehicle related deaths and injuries by increasing public awareness of laws regarding safety belt use and other traffic issues including DUII and speed.

Senior Center Meeting By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford Senior Center held their monthly membership meeting on Tuesday, August 31. Secretary Jackie Sellon read the meeting minutes for July. President Owen Miller had one correction for the minutes and that is the total cost for the new (used) dishwasher was \$2,265.

Treasurer Bill Nelson said the Center had brought in \$2,876.98 in July with expenses of \$1,139.42 for a gain of \$1,737.56. Nelson said he had sent the IRS a letter from the Center for a continuation of their tax exemption. He said all bills had been paid and that the balance in the checking account, CDs, and savings account as of July 31 was \$13,050.58 with no outstanding liabilities.

Office manager Dolores Care said the monthly calendar was printed and ready to be mailed and that the dues are due (\$5 a year).

President Miller noted that the Center rummage sale program was flourishing. The rummage program brought in \$530 in July.

Nutrition chairperson Sonja Mason said attendance at the last breakfast was down a little bit at 80 people and the Center brought in \$389. The dinner attendance was also down at 21 paid dinners but was competing with three weddings in town that weekend.

The next Senior Center breakfast will be on Sunday, September 12 followed by the dinner on Saturday, September 18 with roast beef as the main course.

Owen Miller reported that the Center's water/sewer bill had jumped from an average of 6,000 gallons of water used to 26,000 gallons. They went looking for a water leak and found it in the back bathroom. Miller said new siding had been installed on the outside wall by Ken Breuer construction.

Jane Black has replaced Mary Yoder as the Port Orford Today columnist for the Center. Mary Yoder has stepped aside because of health reasons. She wrote for the paper for ten years and we thank you more than we can express.

Owen Miller then brought up what he called the Lou Mincer controversy. Mincer writes a column for the Center on Medicare and Social Security issues

which as been printed on the back of the calendar the past several months. Miller said some people (mostly anonymous) had threatened to leave the Center over Mincer's articles because they are too partisan. Miller said that he thought Mincer's articles were "very informative" and that he didn't want to cease these articles. There were several comments both pro and con about the Mincer articles and then Dolores Care suggested to president Miller that they should put an article in the calendar asking members if they want these articles as part of the calendar/newsletter. Miller requested that Mincer's articles be shortened. Mincer responded that he was trying to explain your (the members) **lifeline** by writing about and explaining Social Security and Medicare issues. The members will be asked for their input on whether to continue with the articles but anonymous responses won't be counted.

Vice president Bev Dunlap spoke about the recent Center trip to the Honeybear campground for dinner and entertainment. 21 people went. The next two trips in the planning stage are one to Newport to visit the Oregon Coast Aquarium and dinner at Bandon Dunes followed by a trip to Shore Acres.

Members discussed the issue of raising the dues, which have been \$5 since 1992. Someone will look into what other Senior Centers charge for their dues. It was suggested people make a life payment in lieu of yearly dues.

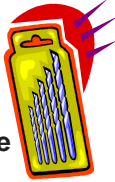
Run to the Rogue

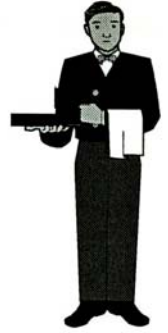
