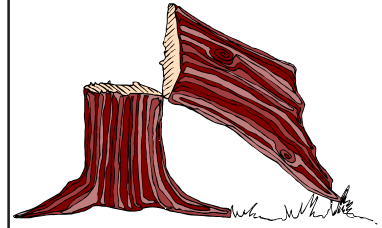

Felony Tree Slaying in Buffington Park

Buffington Park Vandalized By Evan Kramer



Residents of Port Orford are very upset by the newest twist in vandalism in town. On Thursday night, February 10, a person or persons entered Buffington Park in an area adjacent

to the skateboard park. They sawed down six trees by hand and damaged four others. One of the damaged trees will have to be cut down. Some of the trees were in the 20-25 year age range. The City of Port Orford Parks Commission is responding quickly to this assault against the park and the citizens of Port Orford by holding a special meeting on Tuesday, February 14 to discuss the vandalism. They want to meet before the next city council meeting on February 22, so as to give them a report. The trees remain downed in the park for the time being.

The park has been vandalized in the past, mainly with graffiti and recently with a broken window at the A Frame cabin but this represents a different sort of problem and one that has deeply unsettled many people. Since the city won't be able to replace a 25 year old tree as easily as you replace a broken window or paint over graffiti.

Police Chief George Simon said on Monday morning that the trees averaged 10-12 inches in diameter at the base and that all were over 25 feet in height. Simon said he has been talking to people in the neighborhood of the park but so far no one had seen or heard anything. Simon said the tree felling had no sense or logic to it. He estimated the replacement value for each of the seven destroyed trees at \$1,000 and that the crime committed is a felony. The Chamber of Commerce and other business and individuals are putting together a reward for apprehension of the people involved with cutting down the trees. The Chamber of Commerce pledged at their Monday afternoon board meeting to contribute up to \$250 for the reward unless the City can get Crimestoppers to offer a reward.

Police Chief Search

Applications for the position of Port Orford Police Chief were due back to the City by Friday, February 11, 5:00pm. The City had received eight applications for the job as of Friday morning, February 11.

The next regular session of the city council is on Tuesday, February 22, 7:00pm. City Hall is closed for President' Day on February 21. The council will meet before the February 22 meeting to rank the

police chief candidates and decide which ones to interview. The interviews will be conducted by two panels – one a citizen panel and the other consisting of law enforcement officers. The interviews are tentatively scheduled for Monday, February 28. The two panels will make a recommendation to the city administrator after interviewing the candidates and then the administrator will make a recommendation to the city council.

Fair Board News

The Curry County Commissioners did not reappoint long-time Fair Board member Viola Cuatt to that board at the commissioners January meeting. Cuatt has been on the fair board for 36 years and volunteered at the fairgrounds since 1952. She will continue to serve the fair as superintendent of the floral department at this year's fair and has been named grand marshal for this year's Curry County Fair.

The County Commissioners are looking for someone to fill out the vacancy on the board and are looking for someone who lives in North Curry County. Fair board member terms are for three years. There are seven members on the Fair Board and at this time Bill Dooley is the only one from the northern part of the county. The fair is the last week of July this year.

**Port Manager's Report

I attended the quarterly Ports Group in Salem on January 21. This was attended by most of the ports in Oregon, as well as the Ports lobbyist Peter Freidman who is funded by the ports and OECDD. There were others from OECDD, legislative people, the Army Corps of Engineers and a fisheries representative. I talked with Brookings Port Manager Russ Crabtree about a trip to Washington D.C.

I turned in the appropriations request for \$723,000 for Operation and Maintenance dredging and \$500,000 for our own dredge system. There was an OCZMA reception that evening to meet newly elected coast representatives as well as department heads from coast related departments of the state.

I attended the Oregon State Marine Board grant workshop in Oregon City on February 1.

The Curry County commissioners put our Federal Appropriation request on their agenda. The state revoked several hagfish permits that did not deliver their requirements but we should have three that fish out of here. I attended the Rural Investment Board meeting where our two grant requests were reviewed. We were awarded \$2,200 for shipping and installation of the ice machine but the Library had their initial \$20,000 grant changed to allow them to use it for the survey. We will pay them \$2,500 when we need it. Kim Swiggs has spent several hours collecting addresses for the income survey.

We tore the stairway from the front entrance of the cannery, as it was a danger. Jim Laskaris has agreed to cut the wheels off from the axles on top of the hill in exchange for the scrap iron. The part on the fuel system was replaced and is working.

Next month each of the commissioners will be receiving a questionnaire from the Oregon State Standards and Practices Commission that will need to be filled out and returned by April. 15.

Fair Grand Marshal

Viola Cuatt of Port Orford has been elected the grand marshal for the Curry County Fair being held on July 28-31. She will be participating in the annual parade on Saturday, July 30, and will be recognized at the rodeos on Friday and Saturday evenings at 7:00pm as a part of the Rodeo Court Grand Entry, riding in a 2005 Dodge truck, donated by Coast Auto Sales, our local NPRADodge rodeo participant.

Landscape: wetlands

On Thursday, February 17, at 7:00pm at Port Orford City Hall, the Kalmiopsis Audubon Society will host local author Ann Vileisis for a slide-show based on her award-winning book, "Discovering the Unknown Landscape: A History of America's Wetlands." In this presentation, Vileisis will explore how Americans have used, understood, and conserved wetlands through time and reflect on some key lessons the past can teach us about stewarding these ecosystems today.

Vileisis spent over six years researching and writing her book, traveling to wetlands, studying at libraries, and talking with wetland experts all over the country, from New England to Florida to North Dakota and California. Her book won two national awards for excellence, including one from the American Historical Association.

This presentation will be the second in a series of speakers that the Kalmiopsis Audubon Society will be hosting in Port Orford this year. On March 9, Vicki Kaplan of Defenders of Wildlife will speak about the Endangered Species Act. On April 13, Lisa Shelton of the Siskiyou Project will speak about what has been happening in the Biscuit Fire burn area. Everyone in the community is invited to attend these interesting talks.

Senior Center News

The Port Orford Senior Center is in the process of building a fence between their upper and lower parking lots for safety reasons. They received a donation of labor and materials for the project from Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative. The Coop donated ten wooden poles for the backbone of the new fence. The Coop also donated the labor of two of their linemen, Randy Foster and Hap Flynn on Friday, February 11. They used Coop equipment to dig the holes and place the

poles and get them tamped down in place solidly. Senior Center president Owen Miller was on hand on Friday and member Jack Pruitt was there to lend Coos-Curry a hand. The next step to complete the fence is installing 2" by 6" cross-beams across the poles. Western Builders Supply has generously donated 16 pieces of twenty foot long 2' by 6" treated Douglas fir to complete the fence.

The Center volunteer staff served eggs Florentine, crepes with strawberries, sausage, bacon, coffee and orange juice. The Center holds it's monthly dinner this Saturday night from 5:00-6:30pm. DeFazio Gets New Post

Democrats on the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee have elected Representative Peter DeFazio, ranking Democrat on the Highways, Transit and Pipelines Subcommittee for the 109 Congress. In his first action at the new post, DeFazio joined his colleagues to introduce the bipartisan "Transportation Equity Act – A Legacy for Users" (TEA-LU). TEA-LU is a six-year, \$284 billion federal highway and transit-funding bill.

As a ranking member, DeFazio will have a unique opportunity to play a leading role in crafting and passing the vital highway-funding bill. It has been nearly a decade since a member of Congress from Oregon has occupied a principal spot with significant influence over such an immense amount of spending.

"Oregon has a unique transportation situation," said DeFazio. "Interstate 5 is a

critical commercial corridor route, one of the busiest trade routes in the nation, and is recognized as a high priority corridor. Safe and efficient travel on I-5 is crucial to the nation's economic vitality. But the roads and bridges along the corridor are beginning to wear and tear, and the State faces a \$4 billion-plus backlog in repairs and reconstruction. Oregon has done its part to raise revenue and prepare for investment, and under TEA-LU, the federal government can provide significant funding in partnership with the State to maintain and improve critical highways and byways in Oregon."

Citizens Express Outrage

A special emergency Parks Commission meeting was held on Tuesday night at the Visitor's Center to address the acts of felonious vandalism in regard to the chopping down of six, 30-foot tall Douglas Fir trees in Buffington Park last Thursday night-Friday morning. In addition, another tree was damaged so badly it had to also be taken down. The estimated damage exceeds \$7,000.

An unusually outspoken group of nearly 20 citizens including Mayor Jim Auburn, City Administrator Ken Knight, Interim Police Chief George Simon, the Parks Commission, several Chamber Board members and a Planning Commissioner, spent over an hour trying to get a handle on the issues of using a reward system to catch the vandals, and expressing some fundamental outrage over the "unacceptable" acts.

Parks Commission member Millie North expressed sorrow and anger about the fallen trees and said she thought vandalism was escalating in the city. Brenda Foster said it was "scary to have someone so soul-less among us." Paula Cracas said that while serious, we should not

let this frighten us. Erna Barnett commented that who ever did the tree chopping was venting a tremendous amount of anger. Interim Chief Simon said that those with this type of anger are likely to strike again. Ken Knight said there were "social and legal consequences for this act" and the sense of community disapproval has been rendered in the court of public opinion.

Interim Police Chief George Simon said he had made arrangements with Curry County Crime Stoppers to pay up to \$1,000 for tips that lead to an arrest to call their 24-hour toll free number at 1-888-974-0000. Tips can be anonymous. Simon also said that the Port Orford police department was doing an investigation and was requesting the assistance of the public. The crime is a class C felony mischief.

Possible preventive measures to Park vandalism that were brought up might be in having an on-site park host and improved, but dark sky friendly, lighting in the Park. The group in general made it abundantly clear that this crime was not acceptable and that there are repercussions from society.
