Blessing of the Fleet

Port Orford is a fishing village and on Saturday morning, August 6 the community came together for the annual Blessing of the Fleet. The ceremony and potluck were held at the Fishermen's Memorial and was well

attended as is usual by an area that supports its Port and fishermen. The ceremony began with Amazing Grace by Donna Barker on the bagpipes with the calm seas at the Port in the background.

Francie Macleod served as mistress of ceremonies and after her introductory remarks joined the Hensley Hill Hillbillies (Macleod, Paul Bodtke and Steve Abbott) in a couple of songs, one about Port Orford and the other about Cape Blanco, written by Paul Bodtke with music by Francie Macleod. Cecil Ashdown read a poem called the Nantucket Girls Song followed by a prayer written and spoken by Dash Curry.

The public was then treated to another couple of songs; this time sung by the Cronies consisting of Scott Parten, Jennifer Wilson and Kathleen Hunter. They sang Grab the Rope and Amazing Grace to an appreciative audience.

Heather Barton read a story she wrote about fishing on a black cod boat and then Pastor Doug Jamieson gave the Blessing of the Fleet as people stood and held hands in unity. Pastor Jamieson has been doing the Blessing of the Fleet for the past four years and said this one was the windiest of the four since it has caused the podium to fall over and break. It's very comforting to have Pastor Doug give the blessing for our fishing fleet. The blessing honors and remembers those who have died at sea and is also a prayer for a continued bountiful harvest from the sea.

Jamie Boyd movingly read an emotional poem by Joe Nelson entitled Why Are We Here. John MacRea singing two sea songs including The Fisherman's Song and Silver Sea followed her. MacRae said he was honored to be here singing for the fourth year.

The Blessing of the Fleet concluded with the reading of the names by Julie Steinmetz with the ringing of the bell by fisherman Darrel Cobb. Those whose memory was honored on Saturday with the reading of the names were Jim Cook, Royal Ostrander, Wayland Livermore, John Andy Belcher, Bob Houck Jr., and Linda C. Mack. Relatives or friends of these fishermen who lost their lives at sea were given red roses by Devon Ash-

down. Mike Ashdown closed the Blessing of the Fleet by thanking everyone for coming down and the people who brought food for the potluck, which got under way after Ashdown concluded his remarks.

The wreath in honor of the fishermen was to be taken out to sea by Port commissioner and fisherman Dave Rickel, F/V Tiburon.

Weir Being Raised

Last week ODOT employees were busy demolishing the Humbug Mountain Lodge including the main lodge building, which housed a restaurant and rooms. They also demolished a cabin and the former convenience store. By Sunday all buildings were gone except for the foundation walls and concrete floor of the lodge building. The Oregon Department of Transportation purchased a permanent "flood easement" from the owner of the 92-acre property, Chuck Landis. This property is just south of the Humbug Mountain State Park day use area and Myrtlewood Grove. The flood easement is for 9.62 acres of the property and was bought from Mr. Landis on a voluntary basis according to Steve Madison who works in the ODOT right of way pur-

chasing office. ODOT is also negotiating with an adjacent homeowner for a flow easement through their property.

Concurrently ODOT is raising the weir (looks like a dam to me) on the diversion channel for Brush Creek. They are raising the weir to accommodate a 15-year flood event. The weir is located upstream from the former Humbug Mountain Lodge and to the west of Highway 101. Brush Creek makes numerous twists and turns in this area and where it turns to go towards the Lodge there is a diversion channel leading off to the side. This diversion channel was controlled by a 5-year flood event weir. But in a recent wet year water and fish went over the top of the weir and continued over a steep sharp cliff to the rocks below. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration got involved working with

ODOT to raise the weir and reduce fish kills on the diversion channel. When completed water will only go over the raised weir in a 15 year flood event which means more water will be going down Brush Creek and less over the cliff. Fish that make Brush Creek their home include Coho salmon, Steelhead, cut-throat trout and lamprey.

ODOT public relations officer Jared Castle said that when ODOT bought the easement they bought the Lodge buildings also. He said the buildings were in a state of disrepair and some would have been flooded because of the raised weir. The main reason they demolished the buildings is that ODOT didn't want them sitting vacant attracting transients. Castle said another major concern was people setting up a methamphetamine lab in the abandoned buildings so down they went and the Humbug Mountain Lodge is now history.

Parks Commission News By Jay Stoler

The Port Orford Parks Commission got a lot accomplished in an hour and a half last Tuesday, August 2. All members of the Commission except Joanne Ruoff were present and there were a dozen interested citizens in the audience including Mayor Jim Auburn and wife Karen. Also in the audience was homeowner Dennis Miller who lives in the 1100 block of Lakeshore Drive. Miller had come to address the Commission about a weed encroachment problem in Garrison Lake that could potentially be very harmful in a relatively short period of time.

Miller said he had been on the phone all day with folks like Frank Burris of BLM, Cindy Meyers of the South Coast Watershed, Steve Mazur at ODFW in Gold Beach and even City Planning Director Chuck Nordstrom. The object of the calls was to let these various

agencies that something is happening in Garrison Lake and it isn't pretty.

Miller came with several large plastic bags filled with samples of the various weeds and plants that are overtaking and potentially choking the lake. In addition to the weeds there are two more problems that were pointed out; the infestation of a certain breed of snail, and the emergence of Purple Loosestrife, which was found around the lake.

Miller also said he is looking in to forming a Homeowners Association of residents around the lake so that there would be more clout to attack the problem.

Mayor Auburn commented that it would be wise to inform Oregon Parks and Recreation of this problem as they were overseers of the lake.

The Parks Commission asked Secretary Millie North to contact John Luethe, chair of the local Watershed Council and have an informal meeting so that all

involved can get on the same page and some direct action can be taken. That meeting will take place as soon as possible.

It was noted by Dave Pace that the billboard sign at the north end of town actually sits on property owned by C & K Markets and an easement would be necessary to do any work on the sign. Pace also said the electrical hookup for the proposed Buffington Park host would be \$2,977.00 and would be installed in the area by the new bathroom near the ball field.

The planned 154th Birthday Party and Pot Luck in Buffington Park on Labor Day was discussed with the Commission by Stacy Romele, Arts Council president and Jay Stoler Chamber president, the co-sponsors of the event. The event will take place on Monday, September 5 from Noon to 3pm, there will be free BBQ

Tuna and Birthday cake, and the community is invited to bring a pot-luck dish.

Romele also had some repair requests for the Community Building, which is managed by the Arts Council. She said there were cracks in the floor that were buckling in some places, leaking ceiling tiles, crumbling linoleum and a hole in the back of the building. Dave Pace promised to look into getting those things repaired.

There was a discussion on the fire rings that are in Buffington park and are sometimes used by people to build small cooking fires for a picnic. The safety factor in even allowing fires in the park was discussed. Commissioner Jodi Bulaich said there were safer units available and showed a spec sheet on a vertical grill. Councilor Jerry Steinhorst said he had a grill just like that one that he hardly ever used, so he donated it. The park will get two grills units for safer picnic fires and their use will only be permitted when a Park Host is on duty.

Chairman Jim Billings said there would be another bench dedication in Battle Rock Park, but no date had been set.

Finally, the Parks Commission agreed to meet on Wednesday, August 19 at 3pm to do a "walk through" of all Park domains. This is to help in updating the Parks Master Plan and create some grant requests.

Glare – the uncomfortable brightness of a light source when viewed against a darker background (causing squinting).

Light Trespass – the spillage of light beyond the boundary of the property upon which the source is located.

Shakespeare in Port Orford

Thirty-seven plays in ninety minutes (more or less) with only three actors? Now if you think *The Compleat Works of Wllm Shkspr (Abridged)*, is going to be a night of highbrow entertainment, stop thinking. A highlight of the Port Orford Arts and Seafood Festival, this user-friendly Elizabethan romp, performed by FoxWell Productions, embodies one of comedy's most essential impulses: the adolescent urge to take a baseball bat to the culturally revered.

Starting off with Romeo and a not very feminine Juliet, the three actors sprint through all of Shakespeare with joyful

abandon. Try to imagine the Bard's history plays presented as a football game. Or Othello, rap style. If this doesn't seem possible, maybe they cheat just a little bit along the way, happily quoting and misquoting Shakespeare at breakneck speed with lots of slapstick, Pythonesque humor, and enforced audience participation.

"This is Shakespeare done the way the rest of the world thinks Americans do Shakespeare," says director/actor/actress Michael S. Fox. "All that's missing is a rubber chicken."

**Coast Guard Day

A standing room only crowd attended the Coast Guard Day observation held on Sunday, August 7 on the lawn of the Port Orford Lifeboat Station Museum. Coast Guard Day is actually August 4, but the Museum celebrates the day on the closest Sunday, in order that more people can attend. Retired Lt. Colonel, USAF, Rick Francona, in dress blues, was the moderator of the ceremony, which began with representatives from the Coast Guard Station in North Bend posting the colors, followed by Julie Watson leading the crowd in the National Anthem. The ceremony is also intended to recognize all

veterans; there were several from the Coast Guard present, along with many veterans from the other branches of the U.S. military services.

The guest of honor was long-time Coast Guardsman Warren Hulbert, now of Coos Bay. Hulbert never served at the Port Orford Lifeboat Station, but did train there while serving as a surfman. He began his career before World War II, initially working with a 26 foot pulling surfboat, which was brought down from Coquille to Battle Rock on a trailer for training sessions of 3-4 hours a day. Hulbert served at a number of Coast Guard Stations, including Yaquina, Tillamook Bay, Point Adams, Gray's Harbor, Seattle, and Tongue Point, as well as on two cutters, and retired as a Chief Warrant Officer. Because of his health, he had not chosen to speak, but to write about his career and have Francona read excerpts. The entire piece he wrote will be available on the Point Orford Heritage Society's web site at www.portorfordlifeboatstation.org.

Hulbert made and donated all the many dioramas and models now in the Port Orford Lifeboat Station Museum. They include ships, lighthouses, and rescue scenes. He is considered to be the primary benefactor of the Museum. Hulbert was accompanied by his wife and two sons. It was also his eighty seventh birthday, and he was presented with a birthday cake frosted in red, white, and blue and decorated with a life-saving ring.

The ceremony also included a rendition of "Amazing Grace" on bagpipes by Park Host Bob Leslie, and an impromptu rendition of the Coast Guard anthem by Jack Pruitt.

Inside the museum was a special display of paintings by Elaine Roeman, and photographs by Jim Coffee of Gold Beach. Outside the Museum's lifeboat was resplendent with a new coat of paint and new lettering and numbers. It is a type TRS, self-bailing, self-righting boat, with a heavy bronze keel.

Thanks go the members of the Point Orford Heritage Society for a wonderful event.

Seabird Dieoff on Coast

During the week of July 20 the number of dead and dying Common Murres washing ashore along Oregon's beaches has increased dramatically. Murres floating ashore near Newport are approaching record numbers according to Robert Loeffel and his assistants, who have been conducting a year-round beach mortality transect on 4.6 miles of beach just south of Newport for the past 28 years. On Tuesday July 19 they recovered 67 dead murres. Their total for the month of July stands at 114, just 11 birds shy of the July record of 125 recorded during the major El Nino event in 1983. The July record will likely be surpassed. U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Biologists conducted a boat survey between Newport and Depoe Bay on July 25, during which they observed numerous dead and stressed murres along the shore and out to 10-15 miles offshore. A report of dead Common Murres on the beach at Pacific City on Sunday, July 24, indicated a localized rate of approximately one dead Murre every 75 feet. Dead murres on the beach have also been reported at Cannon Beach.

The dieoff appears to involve adult birds and is likely the result of stress due to lack of food associated with unusually low oceanic productivity along the west coast this year. Unseasonable weather patterns in the spring and summer resulted in a general lack of coastal upwelling, which drives the food chain along the coast.
