Flu Season Preparation

Flu season is upon us and the Oregon Medical Insurance Pool (OMIP) has sent out a timely newsletter entitled "Be Prepared for the Cold and Flu Season."

Their definition of flu is as follows: The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. While most healthy people recover from the flu without complications, some people, such as older people, young children, and people with certain health conditions are at high risk for serious complications from the flu."

Flu symptoms include fever (usually high), headache, tiredness (can be extreme), cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, diarrhea and vomiting also can occur but are most common in children.

According to the OMIP newsletter the number one way to protect against getting the flu is to get vaccinated each fall (NOW!) Other ways to prevent the flu are washing your hands frequently, covering your nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing – with a tissue or arms –

Not with your hands, not putting your hands around your eyes, mouth or nose until you have washed your hands, and avoiding people who cough and sneeze (not easy in my opinion, unless you go into hiding).

OMIP defines those at high risk of getting the flu as people 65 years or older, children ages six months to 23 months, residents of long-term care facilities, people ages 2-64 with chronic illnesses, pregnant women, health care personnel who provide direct patient care, and household contacts and out-of-home caregivers of children under six months old.

The OMIP newsletter says there are no drugs that your doctor can prescribe to cure the flu or a cold. They recommend as much bed rest as possible, taking aspirin, acetaminophen or ibuprofen every four hours as relief for fever and muscle aches. They recommend giving children ibuprofen or acetaminophen but not to give aspirin to a child without a doctor's direction. It is recommended to drink lots of fluids with emphasis on water and fruit juices and to eat a proper diet. Also recommended is drinking hot tea with honey and eating, you guessed it, chicken soup. OMIP admits no one knows why chicken soup works but according to their newsletter, steaming

chicken soup clears the mucus out of the nasal passages very effectively.

Port Orford Flu Clinic

You have a second chance to get a flu shot. (The Health Department ran out of flu shots at their October flu clinic in Port Orford.) Another shipment of the influenza vaccine has been received and the Health Department will offer a second flu clinic in Port Orford on Tuesday, November 15 (property tax due date), at the Port Orford Health Department, 1403 N. Oregon Street (the "blue building.") Doors open at 9:00am through 11:30am for the morning session. They reopen at 1:00pm for the afternoon flu clinic and close at 4:00pm. Cost for the flu shot is \$25. The Curry County Health Department can bill Medicare, Regency Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Oregon, and the Oregon Health Plan. Every person getting a flu shot will be given a receipt which you can submit to your insurance company (if you have one).

Mark Twain Reappears by Evan Kramer

Mark Twain came into this world with Haley's Comet in 1835 and died the same year the comet made it's next appearance in 1910. The most famous of American authors left his mark with dozens of books that are still in print, being read, and will remain so for the readable future. Ernest Hemingway said of Twain, "All modern American literature comes from one book by Mark Twain called Huckleberry Finn."

Mark Twain made an appearance in Gold Beach a couple of weeks ago on Saturday night at the Gold Beach Bookstore. Twain appeared in the form of actor Robert Scheppler, a 68 year old resident of Brookings who sometimes plays the part of Mark Twain. He looked the part with his long wavy white hair, full mustache, and white linen suit.

Scheppler presented material from several of Twain's writings including the "Advantage of Accident Insurance", a lengthy selection from Huckleberry Finn and the "Begum of Bengal". He didn't do dry readings from Twain's book but became Twain, speaking in a Missouri twang to us the audience and meandering around the stage for his "talk."

Scheppler's Mark Twain was presented in the Biscuit Showroom on the second floor of Gold Beach Books. It's a small intimate room lined with rare books and seats about 40 people comfortably. At intermission as part of the dessert theater, as the evening was called, those attending were treated to a large selection of desserts, fruit and gourmet coffees, all as part of the \$12 admission.

Gold Beach Books is worth the drive to go visit if you haven't been down there

yet. The large two-story store has over 50,000 books for sale. This is quite impressive for a city of 2,000 people. They have a selection of new books, a large selection of books by local authors, and shelves and shelves of used books. The store has a comfortable coffee bar with a nice selection of pastries and plenty of tables to spread out and read a variety of newspapers from around the country.

Ted Watkins, the owner of the bookstore, introduced Robert Scheppler. He explained how Samuel Clemens, a boy from Missouri, came to change his name to Mark Twain (had to do with Clemens' days on the Mississippi River and the depth measurements of the river ("mark twain" = 2 fathoms deep). You can see when you visit Ted Watkins's bookstore that for him it is a labor of love and a gift to the south coast.

Christmas Boxes

May thanks to the volunteers of the Port Orford Senior Center for putting on the "Fifth Sunday Breakfast" on October 30 to benefit the Common Good. It was a huge success with more than \$300 raised toward keeping food on the shelves to help those who come up short at the end of the month and have to choose between food on the table or paying rent or utilities.

It may seem early, but the preparations for the Christmas boxes are underway already. Recent catastrophic events in the south and around the globe have caused the government food subsidies that normally go to food pantries around the state to be routed for these emergencies elsewhere. The Oregon Food Bank sends food donations from grocery chain stores and private individuals in the Portland area to fill the gaps. It's still a good deal but shipping costs must still be paid by the Common Good.

So here is the problem faced by the volunteers of the Common Good. Some items for the Christmas boxes can usually be filled from full pantry shelves, but they aren't very full this year. If Christ-

mas box food items are not donated, they will have to be purchased. Some items such as: cake mixes and icing, canned vegetables and fruits, stuffing mix for the turkeys, pudding mix, margarine, cranberry sauce, pie crust mix and baking mix are non-existent or at best in short supply on our shelves. Donations of these food items or cash to buy them would help fill the Christmas boxes that help bring holiday cheer to needy members of our community.

Last year 87 holiday boxes were provided so needy families could have a festive meal. Until applications for boxes are completed, we won't know how many to plan to fill this year, but it's possible that twice that many families are eligible for assistance. Please help make the holiday a memorable one for the needy of Port Orford.

Baskets to drop off food donations will be at Chetco Federal Credit Union and Sterling Bank. Checks should be mailed to the Common Good, Inc., PO Box 564, Port Orford, OR 97465.

Curry Family Medical Clinic collected \$325,403 in revenue for 2004-2005 accounting year. The clinic was allotted 23% of the taxes the district collects which came to \$110,550 making a total of \$435,953. Curry Family Medical Clinic's **direct operating expenses** were \$431,912 for the 2004-2005 fiscal year.
