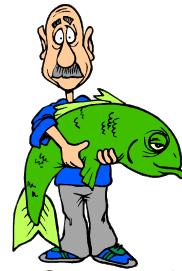

Finding Common Ground By Evan Kramer

This Friday night promises to be an interesting one in Port Orford so stick around. There will be a screening of the film "Common Ground: Oregon's Ocean" at the Savoy Theater. The film begins at 6:30pm and admission is free. The company which made the film, Green Fire Productions, is holding a reception at the Wild Wind Café next door before the movie starts at 5:30pm. You can meet and talk with the filmmakers and others involved with the production before going to the theater.

"Common Ground: Oregon's Ocean" is a 28 minute long documentary which according to the producers, Green Fire Productions, features "extraordinary underwater footage" of the ocean off the Oregon Coast. The film presents viewpoints of fishermen and marine scientists and others in the fishing industry on the issue of marine reserves. Common Ground is narrated by respected radio commentary and newspaper columnist Russell Sadler. The film will be followed by a panel discussion led by fishermen and marine scientists and questions from those in attendance.

For more information on the film Common Ground you can check out their web

site at www.oceansonline.org. It features an interview with the film's director and a history of the making of the movie.

The film deals with the Rockfish Conservation Area (RCA) closure which restricts fishing in thousands of miles of federal water off the Oregon, California and Washington coasts. The film "presents solutions for protecting and restoring the state's ocean ecosystems backed by commercial fishermen and scientists."

Rockfish is an important part of the Port Orford fishing catch. Last year fishermen working out of the Port of Port Orford caught 36,222 pounds of cabezon worth \$118,197.00; 23,655 pounds of greenling worth \$105,270, 79,974 pounds of black rockfish worth \$111,896 and 8,110 pounds of nearshore rockfish worth \$41,890.

There are many species of rockfish including 23 species of shelf rockfish, 11 species of slope rockfish and 6 species of nearshore rockfish (black rockfish and China rockfish).

Storm Watching in Port Orford

The wind was clocked at 92 miles per hour at Cape Blanco this past weekend. Sixes resident DeBoyd Smith said he recorded winds of 74 miles per hour on Sunday night, January 29. He lives sev-

eral miles up Sixes River Road and is also good about taking and providing rain statistics for the area.

Street closures for Port Orford continue at Arizona Street between Madrona and Geer Circle because of the high level of Garrison Lake. Twelfth Street at the Boat Ramp and fishing pier is closed because of high water and California between Twelfth and Agate Beach Road is closed because of the high water.

Tseriadun State Park is open as the lake remains at high level. Access to the public beach has been cut off as high water at Little Round Lake has inundated the trail which leads to Agate Beach. The main trail leading to the overlook is blocked by a fence and a lot of woody debris. Oregon State Parks is working on a dune stabilization project and wants to keep the public off the frontal dune at the State Park. The Garrison Lake Outlet is performing its role with water continuing to flow out of the lake and lots of sand building up in front of the outlet channel.

Rainfall totals for the City of Port Orford from January 17 through January 29 came in at 8.92 inches as recorded at the water treatment plant. This brings the January total to 22.68 inches of rain through Monday. It is wet out there and very

windy. Public Works Director Dave Pace said the city recorded winds of 70 miles per hour on Sunday night, January 29.

sometime before police arrived. Police assisted the Deputy in attempting to locate the suspect in and around the Port Orford area but could not find him.

CHIEFS NOTE: Port Orford Reserves John Fink and Randy Farr recently completed training, and are now certified in the use of Tasers which are employed by the Port Orford Police Department as an alternative to physical and deadly physical force. The Taser deploys two darts into the assailant, and introduces 50,000 volts of electrical current to render the subject temporarily incapacitated so they can be restrained. These Tasers are widely used among police agencies and have prevented injury to and saved the lives of many suspects, and police officers. During the training Reserve Fink volunteered to be shot with the Taser darts to demonstrate its effectiveness. Officer Fink took a five second cycle of 50,000 volts which gives him the bragging rights of "Riding the Bull" he will be given a special tee shirt, and the department will be given a video tape of the demonstration. If I get a copy of the video in time I will be showing it at the next council meeting. I'm looking forward to watching it. Good work John, and Randy.

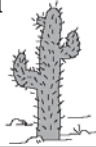

tion of the ocean. The film focuses in part on marine reserves as a tool to protect and restore ocean habitat and marine life, with an aim to have sustainable fisheries along the Oregon coast. Marine reserves are no-take zones that do not allow extractive activities, including oil and gas drilling, mining, fishing and ocean dumping. The film presents interesting insights from scientists and fishermen in Oregon – and around the world – about the need for this type of ocean protection. What becomes clear is that community involvement is critical.

A panel discussion will follow the film. The panel includes: Leesa Cobb of Port Orford; Dr. James Good, Professor Emeritus, Oregon State University and Vice-Chair of Oregon’s Ocean Policy Advisory Council; Jeff Miles, Port Orford Commercial Fisherman; Dr. Mark Hixon, Professor of Marine Ecology, Oregon State University; Ed Backus, Vice President of Fisheries at Ecotrust; and Caro-

short time later he and his wife Mary moved to Port Orford to enjoy the beauty of the lake and ocean. After Mary's death, Everett married Evelyn McDonald. She died a few years ago.

While in Port Orford, Everett served in the Rotary Club, his church and was active in the Masons where he served as Master of the Lodge. He also continued to run a couple of miles a day, 5 days a week, well into his late 80's. Perhaps this contributed to his long and active life.

Three Flags Campaign.

Three Flags is an international selective traffic enforcement program and involves hundreds of Law Enforcement agencies in Oregon, Washington, and British Columbia. Since 1993 the Campaign has sought to reduce the number of motor vehicle-related deaths and injuries by increasing public awareness of laws regarding safety belt use and other traffic

issues including DUII and speed. Port Orford Police have been awarded a federal overtime grant for the program. The grants allow Police Officers statewide to join together for two-week periods of intensive, high visibility enforcement. Port Orford Police will conduct the first two week enforcement blitz from Feb. 6-19. The emphases of enforcement will be "Child Passenger Safety". Oregon's crash fatality and injury rates have dropped 46% since passage of the adult belt law in 1989 making Oregon one of the top five belt-use states in the U.S.
