File Now for City Council

Time to File By Evan Kramer

Interested in taking an active part in our little town? The Port Orford City Council has three positions up for election this November. Councilors Ed Beck, Jim Campbell and Jerry Steinhorst have chosen not to run for another four year term throwing those three spots up for grabs. Their terms of office come to a close on the last day of the year. Council positions are open only to residents within the city limits and those people must have been city residents the past six months. The filing deadline for people running for city council is **Tuesday, August 15, at 4:00pm**. Signature petitions are available at the city hall front desk. It takes the valid signatures of 25 city residents on the petition to qualify to run. The council election will be held concurrently with the state and federal election on November 7. So far two candidates have turned in their signature petitions and they are John Hewitt and Mark Murray and several others have taken out the petition forms and are gathering signatures.

The city council meets in regular session once a month on the third Monday night of the month at 7:00pm. Other meetings include the annual budget sessions in spring and special and executive session meetings depending on the situation.

Council members served on various council committees like the public safety, public works and ordinance committees which hold regular meetings. Council members also serve as liaisons to the Port Commission, Planning Commission, Watershed Council, Curry County Recycling Committee, Parks Commission, and the police and fire departments.

There are seven members of the city council including six councilors and an elected mayor. Besides the three retiring council members Milton Finch, Carl Eskelson and Steve Abbott serve on the council alongside Mayor Jim Auburn.

Voters will have other things to decide in November including who will replace retiring Curry County Commissioner Ralph Brown. T.V. Skinner and Georgia Nowlin are the two candidates on the ballot for that spot. State Representative Wayne Krieger will be on the ballot but faces no Democratic Party opposition. Voters will also decide on who will be the chief executive as incumbent governor Ted Kulongoski faces Republican challenger Ron Saxton.

Common Good News

August Art Classes



07-30 Police were contacted by Curry County Dispatch that someone had thrown an object at a vehicle near Elk River Road on Highway 101, and at a person on a bicycle near Madrona Street, hitting both. The vehicle was described as a black stretch limousine traveling south on Highway 101. The limousine driver thinking he could blend into traffic was stopped by police at the south end

Information was obtained from the complainants, and the two juveniles were cited to appear in Curry County Juvenile Court for Criminal Mischief.

The truck driver and suspect had already left, and after police located the suspect it was determined that no assault had occurred, and the suspect was counseled.

Circuit Court for menacing. Other charges are pending review by the Curry County District Attorney.

Art and Iron

Dozens of abstract, whimsical metal sculptures and 100s of two-dimensional works on paper and canvas will be offered for sale in a celebration and exhibit of late Pistol River artist, Lewis Lytal. Lytal, known to his friends and community as "Lewie," died of liver cancer in April 2001. A masonry contractor by trade, he spent all of his free time making art. While a few of his works were exhibited during his lifetime, the majority of pieces never have been shown.

His remaining sculptures are garden-sized pieces that reflect his sense of humor and wry outlook on the world. Some are painted surfaces, but the majority are rusted metal.

Most of his paintings are abstract explosions of color that seem to "grow" on the viewer. While the majority are standard sized, a hidden cache of giant canvas abstracts was found hiding in his studio

attic about two years ago. The canvas works range in dimension from very large to mural-size.

Chili cheeseburger crudites will be served during the sale as a tribute to the artist.

"Lewie used to have several funny mantras that he would launch into when times were trying or to when he wanted to make a comment on society. 'Chili cheeseburgers' was one of those mantras," says Frann Grossman, the artist's wife of 22 years.

A portion of the proceeds will be donated to a Curry Health Foundation fund earmarked for an inpatient family room in Curry General Hospital where loved ones and friends could comfortably stay overnight with gravely ill patients.

Heart disease #1

Statistics from the Oregon Office of Health and Policy Research show cardiovascular disease clearly as the number one hospital discharge diagnosis for Curry County residents.

Nicholas Dienel, M.D., cardiologist with Medford's Cardiology Consultants, currently sees Curry patients in Brookings and Gold Beach. He states, "Over 70 percent of Curry County residents, 45 and older, are at risk for cardiac disease and would benefit from an educational program aimed at decreasing risk for cardiac disease."

Based on the urgent need to help the growing number of local cardiac patients, Curry General Hospital created its Cardiac Health Center two years ago. The program started off small with funding support from the Rural Investment Board, Coos-Curry-Douglas Business Development, Curry Health Foundation and private donors. Prior to its offerings, cardiac patients were forced to make the long out-of-town trips to medical facilities three times a week for six to eight weeks. Most of the time, patients skipped that part of their

treatment because they could not afford the cost and time involved.

Last year, the Cardiac Health Center added another component — the health and fitness center — to help those wishing to counter warning signs of heart disease before experiencing expensive and possibly fatal complications.

Director Amy Keusink, MSPT, currently conducts standard medical cardiac rehabilitation courses for those with heart problems, as well as health and wellness classes for cardiac rehab grads and ordinary citizens with at-risk conditions. Those conditions include high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes, a sedentary lifestyle, extra pounds that won't come off, and orthopedic conditions that keep individuals from participating in regular exercise.

Limited Salmon Season

The Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission adopted temporary rules to provide additional ocean commercial salmon fishing opportunities in state waters to mitigate for federal commercial fishing closures. Due to poor forecasted returns of Klamath fall chinook, commercial fishermen will be allowed to fish in localized "bubble" fisheries in state waters off key Oregon coastal rivers that will help mitigate impacts of the ocean season closures.

The Commission set seasons off the mouths of the Nehalem, Tillamook, Nestucca, Yaquina, Alsea, Siuslaw, Umpqua, Coos, and Rogue rivers including an earlier opener for the Elk River. Most seasons begin Sept. 1 from the Coos River north.

Each commercial fishery will be managed for a chinook catch quota to assure that escapement goals are met. Additional details are available at their web site, www.dfw.state.or.us.

The Commission also voted to approve a petition that changed rules regarding limited entry sardine fishery permits. The new rules extend permits to all individuals that possessed a developmental fisheries permit in 2005.

Finally, the Commission approved the agency's 2007-2009 budget request.

HDL ratio, and triglycerides. A 12 to 16 hour fast is recommended for the lipid panel, but no fasting is required for the total cholesterol or HDL screening. The fee is \$35 for a lipid panel, \$25 for TC/HDL, \$15 for TC and \$5 for glucose for diabetes (2 hr fast suggested). ALT/AST testing for liver enzyme is \$20. We finally left Twin Falls, Idaho by driving across a magnificent bridge over the Snake River and getting a great view of the incredible river canyon. We got on Interstate 84 headed towards Boise but we drove right past Idaho's biggest city. By 2pm we were in Ontario, Oregon. We ate a wonderful BBQ lunch at Bagman's Bar-B-Q. Great food, lots of it, very reasonable price. It had been recommended to us at the visitor's center just before town and their recommendation was sound. Valerie had a barbecued beef sandwich and Evan had a half chicken. Evan complimented the owner on serving decent sized chickens. Leaving the restaurant, we drove through Ontario, stopping briefly for Evan to take a picture of the Pix theater, then we were on our way West again.

One of our main resources for the plant clinics we do at the OSU Extension office in Gold Beach is the internet. There are uncountable resources available at your fingertips. The trouble is finding the exact information you want when you have to check out so many websites.

Normally, one can type in a word or two and hit the search button and the list of articles and resources, often in the thousands, appears. Sifting through such a list is daunting at least, if not impossible, given pulls on our time to do research.

Recently, after attending the statewide Master Gardener conference in Corvallis, I finally found a better way. When it comes to resources available at Oregon State University, one can do a search at <http://extension.oregonstate.edu> and find much information that will be useful including online versions of our Pacific-Northwest plant disease, insect, and weed guides. But there's more—much, much more...

You may have already known about these lists but what you didn't know was that if you extended the search to <http://extension.oregonstate.edu/sorec/mg/links/links.htm> you will get an incredible resource specific list with a list of websites that will really help you out with your plant problems. This might be the plant 'Bible' you've been looking for.

was the first building constructed and work was begun on the boathouse. The station was commissioned in 1934 and was in service until it was de-commissioned in 1972. The brave men stationed there were responsible for many rescues.
