### Dredging Bid Scrapped By Evan Kramer

The Port of Port Orford received news this week that the Army Corpse of Engineers (AOEC) received one bid for the summer dredging of the Ports of Coos Bay, Winchester Bay and Port Orford. The first time they put the bid out no one bid on it. According to Port Manager Gary Anderson the contractor bid \$1.6 million for the job but only \$940,000 is available for the three ports. The Corps has scrapped the bid and is looking at other options including hiring Nehalem Dredging to do the job with their boat and portable dredge. Meanwhile over in another side of town the Department of Environmental Quality is meeting to determine if the disposal site in Port Orford can be expanded to take the 30,000 – 45,000 cubic yards of sand that will be dredged out of the harbor. The near shore placement area as the disposal site is called is located 200 feet from the edge of the breakwater. The last time the clam shell dredging was done here was 2003 and at that time the disposal site was 400 by 400 feet. DEQ is doing an environmental assessment and recommending expansion of the disposal site to 800 by 800 feet. The money for the summer dredging has to be spent in this year's federal budget year which ends on September 30.

There will be a salmon season in Port Orford this year. It is known as the Elk River Bubble Fishery. The season for Fall Chinook salmon begins on September 15 and runs through December 15. The Elk River "Bubble" or Terminal Area as it is also known is defined by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife as the area between Humbug Mountain and Cape Blanco and to a distance of three nautical miles from the shoreline. The minimum length for salmon this year has been increased from 26 inches to 28 inches. All salmon caught in the Port Orford bubble must be landed at the Port of Port Orford. Last year this fishery opened on October 1 but has been moved up 15 days this year. ODF&W has listed no quota for this fishery. According to ODF&W these bubble or terminal fisheries target returning stocks of local fall Chinook while minimizing the taking of non-local salmon.

### Public Safety Meeting

The Port Orford City Council public safety subcommittee held their monthly meeting on Tuesday, August 8, in the council chambers. Members Jim Campbell and Steve Abbott were present along with Police Chief Mark Creighton and sitting in for the fun of it councilor Milton Finch and Mayor Jim Auburn.

Chief Creighton talked about the pedestrian enforcement program being conducted and said there would be other ones on August 11 and on Friday August 18. The way it works is Creighton or someone else walks into the street to cross it and, if drivers violate the new law for stopping for pedestrians, they are pulled over. Most motorists are given warnings but some of the more serious offenders have been ticketed. The purpose of these pedestrian enforcement days is to get the driving public more aware that people are crossing the street and when they must stop for people crossing the street.

Creighton said that Officer John Fink would be going to the police academy in Salem on September 11 to begin his Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST) training to become a certified police officer. This is a ten week course that is being raised to 16 weeks in the future.

Creighton said there are now six reserves in the department including two, Derwin Boggs and Tom Forgatsch who can do the work of regular police officers.

There was discussion of traffic calming methods to combat the number of excessive speeders going through Port Orford.

### Dredging Bid Scrapped Continued from Front Cover

Some of the ideas that have been suggested by a variety of people include painting the speed limit into the street (30 MPH), flashing lights at either end of town, more use of the speed reader board, speed bumps (just kidding) and visually narrowing the street through use of bike lanes, fog lines and bump-outs. City Administrator Mike Murphy said that the Oregon Department of Transportation wants to raise the speed limit on the north end of town. No one was happy about that idea. He also made it clear that Highway 101 is ODOT's jurisdiction and they decide matters like signage, where to place crosswalks, speed limits, and whether or not to install traffic lights. Creighton told the committee that the department had issued 200 tickets during the "counting" month which goes from the middle of the month to the middle of the month.

Mike Murphy said the city hoped to test the Tsunami warning sirens soon but the electrical work needs to be finished. Murphy also serves as the city's emer-

gency services coordinator. The public will be notified in advance of the tests.

## Sleeper Fires Out

Two “sleeper” fires that came to life two days after Monday afternoon’s statewide lightning bust have been put to rest for good by wildland firefighters.

Crews from the Siskiyou National Forest and Coos Forest Protective Association walked about two miles through steep, rugged terrain, Wednesday to locate and douse a one-acre fire that had been smoldering since Monday in the Sixes River area 20 miles southeast of Bandon. The firefighters were assisted by two fire suppression helicopters. A U.S. Forest Service Lookout spotted the fire late Wednesday afternoon. The fire was contained early Wednesday evening with crews continuing mop up procedures throughout the night and into Thursday morning.

Firefighters also suppressed a small lightning caused fire Tuesday on Floras Creek, about six miles north of the Sixes River Fire.

“We will continue to monitor the area that the thunderstorm passed through for several days,” said CFPA spokesman Tom Fields. “Sleeper fires can smolder for extended periods of time until the

conditions become just right for them to flare up and start to spread.”

CFPA protects 1.5 million acres of private, county, state and Bureau of Land Management lands in Coos, Curry and western Douglas counties.

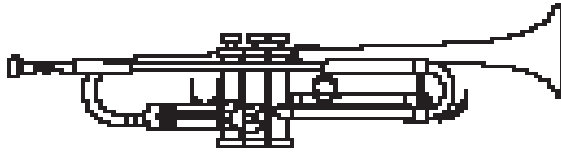

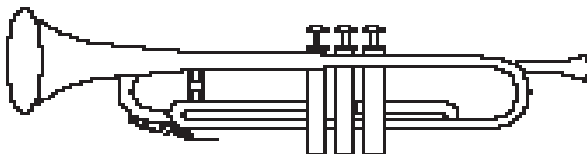

### **Pheasants Forever**

On August 15, U.S. Agriculture Secretary Mike Johanns announced the results of a study demonstrating the impact lands enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) have on pheasant populations. In a follow-up to that announcement, Pheasants Forever (PF) estimates that the 25.5 million acres of CRP located in the pheasant range produce an estimated 13.5 million pheasants annually.

“There has never been any doubt that CRP acres have been responsible for doubling and tripling pheasant populations in many regions across the pheasant range,” explained PF President and Chief Executive Officer Howard Vincent. “However, this USDA study gives us absolute statistical proof of CRP’s impact on pheasants. When it comes to the construction of the 2007 Farm Bill, there is no question about CRP’s impact on wildlife, our hunting heritage, and the hunting-based economy of many rural areas across the pheasant range.”

Researchers from Western EcoSystems Technology of Cheyenne, Wyoming conducted the pheasant study for the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Pheasants Forever was intentionally excluded from the survey to maintain the study’s integrity. The researchers evaluated CRP’s impact on pheasants by observing Breeding Bird Survey counts

along 388 nationwide routes.

According to Secretary Johanns, the report estimates a 22-percent increase in counts of ring-necked pheasants for every four percent increase in CRP enrolled acres within large units of pheasant habitat.

To further demonstrate CRP’s impact on pheasant populations, PF created an equation taking into account the number of pheasant nests per acre of CRP, eggs per nest, nest success, and brood survival.

Using that multiplier, PF estimates that the 25.5 million CRP acres within the U.S. pheasant range are responsible for 13.5 million pheasants annually. PF acknowledges that their 13.5 million pheasant estimate can go up or down dramatically depending upon various weather conditions.

“Pheasants Forever applauds the thousands of landowners enrolled in CRP for helping make a difference for pheasants, wildlife habitat, soil resources and water quality. Landowners enrolled in CRP can feel a great deal of gratification in their conservation decision with today’s announced research,” remarked PF’s

Vice President of Governmental Affairs Dave Nomsen, who is also a trained wildlife biologist and researcher. “This study’s findings also reinforce the record harvests seen in many states the last few pheasant hunting seasons. Those record harvests are a direct result of CRP acres, PF habitat projects, mild winters, and favorable spring nesting conditions. CRP equals more pheasants. It is that simple.”

Originally established in 1985, CRP offers annual payments for 10-15 year contracts to participants who establish grass, shrub, and/or tree cover on environmentally sensitive lands. Not only have these CRP lands been shown to improve pheasant populations, but CRP is also responsible for improvements in water quality, soil erosion prevention, and the creation of critical habitat for a variety of other wildlife species. CRP also helps stabilize farmer’s incomes through annual payments and contribute billions of dollars to the economy annually from hunting expenditures; much of which benefits rural communities. CRP is part of the Federal Farm Bill, which the current version of expires at the end of next year.
