DSL Coming to Port Orford By Evan Kramer

Hold on to your hats folks but DSL (Digital Subscriber Line aka high-speed Internet) is coming to Port Orford in one month! Port Orford and North Curry County Chamber of Commerce President David Smith announced some of the details at Monday afternoon's Chamber meeting at the Paradise Café. He has been communicating with Verizon representative Renee Willer on the details of high speed service startup. Verizon employees will be in Port Orford on Friday September 5, Saturday September 6, Friday September 12 and Saturday September 13 signing up people at the new Port Orford Public library meeting room. They will be here all day on September 5 and 12 and part of the day on September 6 and 13.

How many years has this discussion been going on to no avail? Thanks to the efforts of key people like Ed McQuade, David Smith, and Renee Willer DSL will be available by September in Port Orford and it's one of the main things people want in our area besides political stability.

Not all of the details are available yet. President Smith said that DSL service will not cost more than \$40 per month.

He said you won't have to add a phone line to have this service as it uses the phone lines but a different frequency. So you can be on the Internet for hours at a time and still make and receive phone calls. Verizon has a substation in Port Orford on Ninth Street between Jackson and Washington where the service will originate. Here's one of the key points. High speed service will extend 18,000 cable feet from this building or about three and a half miles. Verizon employees will be able to tell you at the open houses in September whether you are within the range of service. You will also need to buy a modem from Verizon to start service at a cost of \$100.00. Speed is rated at 7mbps. Watch this paper and the Port Orford News in the coming weeks for more specific information and advertising about the high speed Internet service.

There was other business the Chamber meeting though none as dramatic as the news about Verizon high speed Internet service. Chamber board member Jim Billings said that during the recent Make a Difference Day in Port Orford that 200 yards of debris had been collected from the city's parks and taken to Curry Transfer and Recycle's transfer station where it will be burned. CTR donated the cost of accepting the debris.

Chamber webmaster Alicia Billings told the Chamber about a fundraiser for the old city jail. They have taken some of the ivy from the jail and dried it out and will make coasters and embed a piece of the ivy in each one. On the bottom of the coaster will be printed information about the jail. The first 100 coasters will be numbered with Chamber President Smith immediately offering to buy numbers one through sixteen. Each ivy embedded coaster will cost \$10 with the monies going to restore the jail.

Chamber board member Chuck Schaumburg reported that the Curry County Fair was extremely successful. Schaumburg manned the combined Chamber of Commerce and Wild Rivers Coast booth located in the commercial building for the four day run of the Fair. He said Curry County is getting a new extension agent who will help revitalize the 4-H program. Schaumburg said that the Wild Rivers Wool Factory in Langlois will be having classes. Call them for more information at 541-348-2550 or 2411. They are located directly across the street from the ever popular Langlois Market and Deli; home of the best hot dog on the Oregon Coast and one of the friendliest store owners you'll ever meet, Lee Pestana.

Four Mile Station Ready By Brice Wagner

During each year's fire season the Coos Forest Protective Association Four Mile Guard Station has been on duty to respond since 1946. Historically the Station's buildings are in part built by CCC's. The Four Mile Guard Station protects an area from the Coquille River to Prehistoric Gardens. They respond and protect all county, state, private, and BLM lands. They do not work structure fires but do respond and standby when a structure fire occurs in rural areas. Structure fires are the responsibility of individual fire districts as example locally by the Port Orford Rural, Sixes Rural and Langlois Rural Fire Districts. Coos Forest Protective Association has other branch guard stations but this article covers Four Mile as they are the ones that cover us locally concerning wildland events. Their mission is initial attack and knock down brush fires before they get too large to manager with their local resources which also include mutual aid from local Rural Fire district firefighters and equipment.

The Port Orford area is fortunate to have had and has presently an engine stationed here from Four Mile. Local fire warden Joann Ruoff has been with Coos Forest for 15 years and has had an engine here in the City of Port Orford for that time during each fire season. They have changed their smaller engines to dual rear wheeled one ton four wheel drive light trucks that serve the purpose much better than the conventional three quarter ton pickups of the past. The station has ready to roll 24/7 the following fire fighting equipment: one caterpillar D6C model cat (bulldozer) mounted on a lowboy truck, one chase pickup with fuel and extras for a dozer, three one ton attack engines, one 950 gallon attack engine, one 3,200 gallon tender and one three quarter ton supervisor's pickup truck with overheads and hand tools.

Back to School Shots

The Curry County Health Department will be holding an Immunization Clinic and Back to School shot clinic on Thursday, August 21, from 10:00am – noon and 1:00-3:00pm at the NCFCC (Blue Building), 1403 N. Highway 101 in Port Orford. Babies, children and adults will be able to update their immunizations.

Oregon law has added additional requirements for immunization. Hepatitis A will be required for all children entering preschool, child care, Head Start, and kindergarten. Tdap Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis will be required for all seventh graders.

Tdap offers adolescents and adults added protection against Pertussis (whooping cough). It may also prevent the transmission from adolescents and adults to infants. In 2004, Pertussis cases in Oregon reached an all time high with 6,125 cases; this was two times the national average. In the last several years four babies have died from Pertussis in Oregon. The most common source of Pertussis in children is from caregivers, loved ones patients, grandparents, siblings, daycare workers, health professionals and teachers.

Curry County Health Department is providing low-cost Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis) immunizations to anyone age 11 though 64. The cost is \$15, a savings of \$50. With the availability of low-cost Tdap immunizations provided by the Oregon Immunization Program, Public Health hopes to prevent further diseases and deaths. Special arrangements will be made for those who cannot afford to pay.

Please bring your immunization records, OHP card and insurance cards. Please call the Health Department if you have any questions at 247-3300.

The Port of Port Orford Commission meets on Tuesday, August 19, 7:00pm, in the city hall council chambers.

Letter to the Editor,

There appears to be some confusion surrounding the remodel of the “old library space” in City Hall.

On July 18, 2008 the Port Orford City Council voted unanimously to approve the remodel plans for moving the Police Department into the old library space. The plans called for remodeling the space into suitable secure offices for the Police Department, and for a publicly available meeting room. These plans envision the purchase of materials only, with the labor being donated by volunteers (Port Orford Police Reserve Officers), thus saving considerable money for the City.

After the July 18 Council meeting, the plans were modified, incorporating some additional offices, and rearranging some of the interior of the new Police Department space. The City Council held a special meeting on July 30, 2008 to discuss the new plans. Chief Creighton, who attended part of this meeting, and Reserve Officer Tyson Breuer (who attended the entire meeting) were there to answer questions from the City Council. Again, the City Council voted unani-

mously to approve the modified plans, and to authorize the construction of the new facilities. The plans are for the new Port Orford Police Department, and will be done with volunteer labor, again, saving the City considerable funds.

Funding for materials purchase is “on hold” pending the outcome of the recall petition signature gathering effort. These potential recall elections are an unanticipated, and unbudgeted expenditure, which would have to come out of the City's General Fund. Funds for materials purchase will be released as soon as the potential impact of these recall elections is known.

Chief Creighton asked for, and received, the building permit funds, so that materials donations could be accepted, and construction could begin with these donated materials.

As another note of clarification, the newspaper advertisement for the local option levy contains the statement “If the local option tax measure is not enacted, then the City will eliminate the Police Department, since there are insufficient property tax revenues to pay for general city operations and fund the Police De-
