Wyden Brings Home Bacon By Evan Kramer

Oregon's senior United States Senator Ron Wyden held a town hall meeting in Port Orford on Sunday before a full house at city hall. People came from all parts of Curry County to hear Wyden speak and ask him questions.

Wyden told people it was great to be in Port Orford. He made a vow when he was first elected to the Senate in 1996 that he would hold a town hall meeting in every county in Oregon every year and to date he has met that promise and held over 470 town hall meetings. He is no stranger to Port Orford or Curry County. Wyden took some time to talk about the county payments which were included in the just-passed \$700 billion bailout bill. The Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008 extends the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self Determination Act of 2000 through 2012. Wyden emphasized that starting on Monday of this week we all have to assume we won't be getting the county payments again in 4 years. They were extended for 4 years in the bailout bill.


Wyden said he wanted to get serious about getting a tree thinning program going extracting merchantable timber. Wyden gave an overview of the county

payments plans which began in 1908 when the federal government made sure counties had money for essential services by tying the payments to timber cuts. Over the years various environmental rules came in as well as court cases which cut back the amount of timber being harvested and thus the revenue to counties. In many rural counties the majority of land is owned by the federal government.

Wyden co-wrote the Secure Rural Schools Act of 2000 which provided the rural counties with payments in lieu of timber cutting. (These not only include Oregon's rural counties but several other western states). He said with the new bill that we have secured four years of breathing space but that funding won't continue any longer. He made that point several times. Oregon will receive \$740 million over the next four years because of passage of this bill and Curry County will continue to function at a level above the absolute minimum.

Wyden took time out to note the several fine elected officials at the town hall meeting including Commissioners Lucie La Bonte and Georgia Nowlin. La Bonte, who is not running for reelection, thanked Wyden for the positive spirit that this funding was going to get done and called him an incredible person.

Later on Wyden got back to the tree thinning concept and said there wasn't going to be any more fighting about cutting old growth forests which he said would be protected. The thinning focus is on second growth forests only and he pointed out there is merchantable timber among the second growth forests.

The \$700 billion plus bailout of Wall Street was on people's minds with Wyden saying no one wins with the bill and that both sides lost. Wyden was one of 25 senators who voted no on the bailout bill. He said he was for a bailout but done differently and quickly with less money involved. He was for a plan where the federal government would have made capital available to the banks using that to recapitalize them with the government taking an equity position in the loans. The Wyden plan was not the one that passed in the Congress. Wyden said what passed was in effect giving Treasury Secretary Henry Paulsen unbridled discretion to "buy up toxic loans." Wyden promised he would do all he could to make the bailout work and said oversight hearings would begin this week in Congress regarding the bill. He emphasized the need to watchdog the bill. He said by buying the toxic loans the treasury department will clear the bank books of these loans but then

questioned that the banks may just sit on the money.

Wyden said the agencies in charge of overseeing the banks and Wall Street were missing in action the past several years. He complimented many small banks for what he called "sticking to their knitting" also known as sticking to their fundamentals and said many of them are not in trouble.

Wyden said what swung him against the bailout bill were the actions leading up to the run up to the Iraq War where Congress was pressured to move too quickly and in too much of a hurry in funding the war. Wyden voted no in 2002 on the Senate Resolution to authorize use of force against Iraq.

Wyden is a Democrat but didn't use Sunday's gathering to campaign for his party's nominees for office. He did say the next president would have a big overflowing inbox of problems to solve.

Possibly the biggest issue to Senator Wyden is the matter of health care

for all Americans and health insurance in this country. He is the author of the Healthy American's Act (HAA). He has 17 co-sponsors for this bill from both sides of the aisle including Oregon's junior Senator Gordon Smith. Wyden said the country currently spends 2.3 trillion dollars on health care for its 300 million residents. He said using those figures enough money is spent and available to provide a doctor for every seven families in this country. Wyden suggested we take the subsidies for "Cadillac health care" as he referred to it and move that money to the middle class. He said under the HAA he would tell private health insurers their inhumane system is over noting how the health insurance companies try to shed sick people from being covered while picking healthy people to insure.

The Healthy Americans Act would guarantee private health care to all Americans, provide health benefits equal to those members of Congress receive, and be fully paid for with the \$2.2 trillion currently spent on health care in America today.


Clean Drinking Water

Q: What do white elephants have to do with Toba Indians in Argentina?

A: They will help raise funds to bring clean drinking water to 36 Toba families in San Martin, northeastern Argentina.

During my Rotary-sponsored group study exchange to Argentina in May I

visited with the Rotary club of San Martin and was impressed with their plans for a community service project to drill 18 wells for 36 Toba Indian families in the area. Since women and children now walk long distances to the nearest well, others simply draw water from a nearby polluted river, this project will bring safe drinking water to these families. Our Rotary club has decided to partner with the club of San Martin in this effort and needs to raise \$4,500 by October 25 in order to qualify for matching funds from our Rotary district. Club members have already made some contributions, but more is needed to reach the necessary level. As part of this fundraising effort, we will hold a white elephant sale on Saturday, October 11, 8am-1pm, at the American Legion Hall, with the proceeds dedicated exclusively to this project. Some of the many hits songs associated with the Kingston Trio include "Tom Dooley", "A Worried Man", "MTA" and "Tijuana Jail." The group had thirteen albums reach the Top 10 in the record charts. Nick Reynolds moved to Port Orford in the late 1960's where he owned a home on Elk River Road. He was involved with the local Cub Scout program with his son. Reynolds and his wife owned and operated the Savoy Theater (then the Star Theater) for a time before selling it to Pete Lenihan. Reynolds performed as late as 1999 with the reformed Kingston Trio.

cocorahs.org. If you want to submit records you'll need an official rain gauge that records hundredths of an inch which they'll mail to you for about \$24. In your application to be an observer you need to provide the exact Latitude and Longitude of the rain gauge location which I can help you with if you don't have a GPS recorder.

I find it quite enjoyable to submit my rainfall record at 7:00 a.m. along with a few words about the local temperature and weather, and then look up the rainfall from other parts of the state. I've discovered that Curry County is a wet place.


