**Rates Going Up**

### Rates Going Up

Electric rates for Coos Curry Electric Co-op consumers go up on October 1 of this year. The overall increase is 7.5% but it's not the same for the three classifications of electric consumers. Residential rates will increase by 8.25% while irrigation and industrial users' rates go up 3.6% and all other classes including commercial go up 7.5%. The Co-op board and management are forecasting another rate increase of 7.5% on April 1, 2010.

Coos Curry Electric last raised their rates on September 1 and October 1 of 2004. They decreased the rates by 5% on January 1, 2007.

The monthly minimum or basic rate for residential users stays the same at \$22.75 per month. The monthly basic charge for commercial users is \$35. The kilowatt rate for residential users goes from \$0.063/kwh to \$0.069/kwh. According to the Co-op's figures the average cost increase to a residential consumer will be \$6.79 in summer and \$8.10 in winter per month based on an average use of 1,131 KWH's per month. One big change the board has affected with this rate increase is to do away with what is known as the

declining block rate. What that means in English is that for the months of December through April the kilowatt rate went from \$0.063/kwh to \$0.053/kwh for usage over 1,000 kilowatts a month. By using over 1,000 kilowatts a month you got a lower electricity rate but that disappears on October 1 and it is hoped that it will encourage consumers to conserve their electric use. Conservation is the big word now.

There are many reasons for the increase in electric rates with the main one being the increase in wholesale power costs from the Bonneville Power Administration (see their press release elsewhere in this paper), the fact the federal hydropower system on the Columbia and Snake rivers is tapped out and also CCEC's costs are increasing (fuel, salaries, health benefits, etc.). The Co-op looks at future increases being caused by salmon restoration efforts and climate change initiatives like the Cap and Trade bill which recently passed the House of Representatives though it has not gone through the Senate. Coos Curry Electric's sales are down 7.5% from last year because of the economic conditions yet their overhead remains fairly fixed. One of the statistics that CCEC General Manager and CEO Roger Meader shared with me is that salmon restora-

tion efforts on the rivers now amounts to 30% of your monthly power bills or \$17.00 for the average residential user. 50% of the cost of doing business for CCEC is purchasing power mainly from Bonneville. The Co-op gets a small percentage of its power from the Coffin Butte Resource Project which takes methane gas from the Coffin Butte landfill and generates electricity.

Some of the costs CCEC is incurring include finishing the transmission line upgrade from Gold Beach to Brookings. They received numerous bids on the various parts of the project and felt they did particularly well since many contractors are looking for work now thanks to the slowdown in construction. The Co-op is going to spend \$1.9 million dollars on a new office and warehouse in Coquille which will not only replace the current office but the warehouse located in Norway which has been repeatedly vandalized.

The Co-op is holding a series of town hall meetings to discuss the upcoming rate increases. This Thursday night they will hold one in Gold Beach at the Event Center Showcase Building starting at 6:00pm with food followed by a town hall meeting at 6:30pm. The town hall meeting in Port Orford will be held

on Thursday night, August 27, starting at 6:00pm, at the headquarters building. Several board members will be present along with Roger Meador and other employees of the Co-op to answer questions and hear comments and concerns.

I brought up the closed door board meetings that the Board established a few years ago and Meador replied that out of 39 electric utility Co-ops in Washington, Idaho and Oregon only four have open board meetings. He also pointed out that there were two agendas – the one for the public and the more important business one for the board. As it is there is more information given out at the town hall meetings by far than was divvied out when the board meetings were semi-public.

Water and sewer rates went up for City of Port Orford residents and businesses with the current bill which was mailed last week. The water base rate went from \$24.35 a month to \$25.69 while the sewer base rate went from \$34.89 to

\$36.28 a month for a total increase of \$2.73 a month. The base rate includes 2,000 gallons of water but does not include free sewage rates. 1990 gallons of water translates into a sewer rate of \$12.07. The high base rate of \$61.97 a month negates small users' conservation efforts since no matter how little they use they're going to pay over \$60 a month.

Gas prices has risen 16 cents a gallon in Port Orford over the past two weeks so as we can see many of the basics of life are costing more and more and as for health insurance the premiums for those that can afford it are way outstripping the rate of inflation or salary increases. Let's work together in the Congress and public and get something done in this area.

You may have noticed two other changes but at least these won't cost you anything. We've changed the dateline of this paper on the front cover from a Thursday date to a Wednesday date. Since we start distributing papers about 3pm Wednesday and, in fact, deliver about half of the papers on Wednesday,

we felt it made more sense to change the date than to continue explaining how it carried a Thursday date but was actually delivered on Wednesday.

The second change is in the tides shown on this page. In the past we listed Thursday through Thursday but this will now be just Thursday through Wednesday. The good news is this allows us to use a larger font so they should be easier to read.

### Four Charged with Theft

Four men were charged by Curry County District Attorney Everett Dial with one class "C" felony, three class "A" misdemeanors and two criminal trespass in the second degree in the theft of a falcon from a property in Port Orford. The four men charged are Wayne Skankey, Clinton Rand, Zaynes Lees, and Burt Loesberg. The charges were filed on July 21, 2009 in the circuit court of the State of Oregon in Curry County and will now go the Curry County Grand Jury. The Grand Jury is convened to hear the evidence as presented by the District Attorney. If they agree with the felony charge as presented by the DA then it will go back to the DA for an indictment of the defendants and then a trial where guilt or innocence will be proven.

Count 1 is the charge of theft in the First Degree; a class "C" felony ORS 164.055; ORS 497.308(2)(c) All four defendants are charged as follows: "On or about May 30, 2009, in the County of Curry and State of Oregon, (the defendants) did unlawfully and knowingly commit theft of a peregrine falcon, a wild animal removed from habitat.

Count 2 is removal of wildlife in violation of a permit which is a class "A" misdemeanor. The defendants are charged with unlawfully and with criminal negligence removing from its natural habitat, wildlife to-wit a Peregrine Falcon, in violation of wildlife laws and administrative rules, by violating conditions of a Wildlife Removal from Habitat Permit.

Count 3 is failure to make timely notice to the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife of intent to make nest entry attempt which is a class "A" misdemeanor. Count 4 is harassing wildlife, a class "A" misdemeanor.

Count 5 is a charge of criminal trespass in the second degree. The defendants are charged with unlawfully and with criminal negligence entering and remaining

in and upon the premises located at 725 King Street.

Count 6 is a charge of criminal trespass in the second degree that the defendants did unlawfully and with criminal negligence enter and remain upon the premises located adjacent to 725 King Street.

### BPA Rate Changes

The Bonneville Power Administration announced on July 21, 2009 numerous rate changes that are expected to take effect on October 1, 2009.

Rates for customers that buy power and transmission will increase on average by six percent. Transmission rates will stay the same. Power rates will increase by an average of 7 percent. This is the first power rate increase since 2002 by Bonneville and it's driven by both rising costs and decreasing surplus revenues.

The new rates cover the agency's fiscal years 2010-11. Under the rates, the average priority firm rate for wholesale power is \$28.77 per megawatt hour. That compares to the previous rate of \$26.90 per megawatt hour.

The primary causes of rising costs are actions to improve safety and reliability of the Columbia Generating Station nuclear plant and actions to protect threatened and endangered salmon. BPA does not own or operate the nuclear plant, located in Hanford, Washington, but markets the power produced by the plant.

The power rate increase is down from the initial proposal of 9.4 percent in February, and it is considerably lower than the potential 15 to 20 percent increase that looked likely in early April. At that time, BPA's financial picture had deteriorated significantly due to below average water and the poor economy.

The BPA is a not-for-profit federal electric utility that markets more than a third of the electricity consumed in the Pacific Northwest. The power is produced at 31 federal dams owned and operated by the United States Corps of Engineers and Bureau of Reclamation and one nuclear power plant in the Northwest and is sold to more than 140 Northwest utilities.

Editor's note: The BPA rate increase directly affects the upcoming Coos Curry Electric Co-op rate increases.

No law enforcement, no hassles! Free reign to make and export drugs without risk!"


The town has possibly become a manufacturing and export center.


