What Price, Accounting

All Present and Accounted For By Evan Kramer

Our Port Orford City Council met last Thursday night and I can't help but think things were funnier at the Savoy Theater where they had live comedy acts that night. First off the city council held two legally mandated public hearings on Ordinance 2009-05 – Stormwater and Surface Water Management and then on Ordinance 2009-04 and 06 Flood Damage Prevention and Maps. Hearing no testimony from the assembled citizenry the hearings were opened and closed almost immediately.

Citizens concerns took up several minutes with one subject of concern being the Jefferson Street right of way (ROW) usage for use by the Hawthorne Galley and RedFish Restaurant. That subject had been previously decided and the council took no further action.

Michelle Wagner, a mother of two children in the Port Orford-Langlois School District speaking for the first time in public in front of the council asked them to seriously consider the proposal submitted by the School District for the new bus way and drop off spot adjacent to the main entrance to the school. The issue was discussed in depth later on in the meeting. Jack Pruitt asked the

council if we had a drug problem in our wastewater system. One thing city administrator Mike Murphy explained to one and all is that because of the constant water pressure in the water delivery lines there is no "inflow" so that wastewater and treated water Do Not Mix.

Carline Armi was disgusted with the situation with the Jefferson Street ROW, told the council they should be working for us, and then said she would be firing all of the councilors except for Councilor Caroline Clancy. She said the Hawthorne development needed to provide 13 parking places and told the council they should have protected our land and that the park was not for personal gain.

City Administrator Mike Murphy told the council that they had gotten news just that day of approval of a grant for a study of raising the Hubbard Creek impound, which would allow the city to store more water at the reservoir. Reporting on the City's search for a new police chief Murphy said eleven applications had been turned in with five people selected to be interviewed with two of those five dropping out before the interview. At this point three people will be interviewed for the police chief position by an interview panel not consisting of city councilors but by private

citizens. Murphy will make the decision on who gets the job.

City Councilor and Port Commissioner Scott Luhr gave an update on Port business saying that Commissioner Bob Mielenz had been working with OECDD to restructure the \$500,000 loan the Port is saddled with as part of the payment for building the new dock. Paperwork has been filed to restructure the loan which Luhr referred to as an "upside down loan" meaning the payments getting higher and much higher towards the end of the loan.

The City Parks Commission recently recommended designating Battle Rock as a historic site and cemetery. Councilor David Smith offered a motion that the council approves the application for designating Battle Rock as a historic site and cemetery with "public access to Battle Rock not restricted to the public and that all efforts be made to include the tribes and the vote was 6-0. Wendy Thomas has been working on this issue and told the council she wanted permission from the tribes to do this.

The front office staff has been researching new accounting software and the committee working on it recommended to the council that they replace the

current software with the most current "dot" net software from Tyler Technologies. The cost of the Tyler software for the first year is \$68,647 with five years of maintenance and training costs coming out to \$34,808 with a total cost of \$103,455.00. Councilor David Smith made a motion the city enter into a contract with Tyler Technologies for an amount not to exceed \$68,647.00 for purchase of the software and it passed 5-1 with Councilor Caroline Clancy voting no.

The council then considered another Parks Commission recommendation -


this one to lease the A-Frame cabin in Buffington Park to the Port Orford Arts Council. The NCFCC has given up their use of the building and it was available. The arts council has offered to pay all utilities and in lieu of paying rent the first year of use they will make a series of improvements to the building including paint, new floor, ramps, etc. The city's attorney Frederick Carleton told the council they needed to approve the specific improvements which will be made to the building. Councilor John Hewitt made a motion to approve use of the building by the Arts Council for one month pending complication of a formal lease agreement and they vote was 5-1 in favor with Caroline Clancy voting no saying the council was rushing everything. Councilor Smith then made a motion to approve the list of Port Orford Arts Council improvements and that vote was unanimous.

Councilor Smith made a motion to approve Resolution 2020-02 endorsing efforts to achieve funding for the Oregon Way Project aka "Sustainable Fisheries; Sustainable Ports: The Port Orford Eco-

nomie Recovery Plan" and it quickly passed a 6-0 muster.

The council discussed formation of a communications committee with two members from the council, two from the Port Commission and two from the Ocean Resource Team working together for the success of the Oregon Way Project. Councilor Luhr said somewhere along the way something of a rift had developed between the Port and the Ocean Resource Team. Luhr recommended making the Oregon Way Project a collective effort rather than everyone going their own independent way. Councilor Smith made a motion for the council to participate in the Communications Committee with two members appointed by Mayor Jim Auburn. The Mayor decided to make his appointments at the end of the meeting.

The council briefly discussed the policy of councilors contacting the city attorney, city planner, city engineer, etc. The policy is they not contact these people directly but instead go through city

administrator Mike Murphy with their questions.

The council approved a motion for an inmate work agreement with the Department of Corrections for several Shutter Creek inmates to work for the city on the bioswale project at Battle Rock Park. They also voted to approve an intergovernmental agreement with Curry County for the Juvenile Department to use office space within the Port Orford Police Department headquarters with the county paying \$50 a month for use of the space.

The council returned to the proposed new bus drop off and pick up route and School Superintendent Mick Lane's requesting the city's endorsement of the plan. The plan would bring school buses on to the school grounds off Washington and then west on Twelfth Street through the school where they would pick up and drop off students adjacent to the school's main entrance. Then the buses would exit right onto Highway 101 if the Oregon Department of Transportation approves of the plan to

add a driveway at that location. What is technically Twelfth Street as it runs through the school yard has never been developed but has existed as part of the playground/field area. Councilor Hewitt made a motion for the city council to endorse the new bus routing as submitted by the school district and it passed unanimously. Only school buses would be allowed to use the road through the school and it would be fenced off with a gate at Highway 101.


Mayor Auburn had put off naming the city council members to the Oregon Way Communications Committee. Councilor Clancy offered to serve on the committee and she recommended the mayor also appoint Councilor Tim Pogwizd. The Mayor decided to appoint Councilor Hewitt and Smith because of their previous involvement in the process. And then it was time to drift out into the night, talk about the meeting and go home.

Corps to Hold Gravel Meeting

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will hold an informational meeting in Brookings on Sept. 10 to update the public about its proposal to develop a regional general permit for gravel mining in the Chetco River. The meeting will be held at the Chetco Community Library, 405 Alder St., from 6:30pm to 8:30pm.

Jim O'Connor of the U.S. Geological Survey will summarize the results of the Chetco River Sediment Transport study, which the Corps commissioned to aid its assessment of the impacts of gravel mining on the river system.

The report is available on the USGS Web site at <http://pubs.usgs.gov/of/2009/1163/>.

Representatives from the Corps and the Oregon Department of State Lands also will provide an update on the status of the development of proposed federal and state general permits for commercial gravel mining on the Chetco.

Monthly Water Report

The City of Port Orford Public Works Department reported that they produced 6.463 million gallons of water in July minus 170,000 for utility use flushing the system which left them with 6.293 million gallons of water. The City metered 3.341 gallons of water with a loss rate of 47% or 2.951 million gallons of water.

The Public Works Department treated 2.598 million gallons of wastewater and achieved all their permit standards by a satisfactory manner. The standby generator at the wastewater treatment plant blew up and both the rotor and stator are destroyed. The repair bill for the damage is \$22,000.

Alleged Dog Killer Arrested

On August 20, at about 5:00pm, the Medford Police Department located and arrested Rachel Wilson-McCollough for the crime of aggravated animal abuse in the first degree. Medford Police acted based upon Curry County Sheriff's Deputies' investigation into allegations that Wilson-McCollough had intentionally drowned a six-month-old puppy.

Wilson-McCollough was transported to the Jackson County Jail, where custody was transferred to the Jackson County Sheriff's Office. Jackson County SO then transported Wilson-McCollough halfway to Gold Beach where they met with Curry County SO personnel who took custody of Wilson-McCollough and lodged her in the Curry County Jail.

The Curry County Sheriff's Office had been seeking the whereabouts of Wilson-McCollough since July 21, when it was reported by witnesses that she intentionally drowned a puppy and then pinned the puppy under water with rocks while near Elephant Rock on the Chetco River. The Curry County Sheriff's Office has spent many hours since the alleged crime looking for Wilson-

The Curry County Grand Jury met on Thursday, August 13, and returned indictments against Clinton Paul Rand, Bert J. Loessberg and Wayne A. Skankey for the following charges.
