tion for freshmen. The rest of the high school students return to the school on Wednesday, September 9. According to School Superintendent Mick Lane at this point 124 students are registered at the high school this year and 166 are registered at Driftwood. Blanco School in Langlois has been closed and the two student bodies combined at Driftwood School.

Mick Lane is a busy man these days but he took some time to show me around Driftwood School just a week before it reopens. We started out on the playground/field area where there is some rebuilt playground equipment and some that has been brought down from Blanco School and a new one called a funnel ball. The district is installing a running track on the grassy field at Blanco and the plan was for the Rotary Club to help put the material down for the running track on Tuesday afternoon. There is an area outside the east west hallway with picnic tables and some raised bed gardens. This area will be used at times for

an outdoor teaching location with emphasis on the foodshed and watersheds.

The former playshed has been nearly completely redone and is a sparkling looking new gymnasium now with a new floor, insulation, walls, a heating system and any day now the basketball backboards go up. The locker rooms are nearly completed for the boys and girls as well as a large storage area. The creosoted poles are gone from the old playshed.

The school's interior walls have been repainted as well as the classrooms and of course new windows have been installed in the classrooms facing Highway 101 and in the cafeteria. Mick Lane showed me the new computer lab at Driftwood which features 26 new monitors plus an equal number of computers brought down from Pacific High School. The school is fortunate to have Adam House as their computer and technical person and he's put together a state of the art computer system for the students.

The proposed bus routing through the school on Twelfth Street from Wash-

ington and then a driveway on to Highway 101 is still a work in progress. The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) is considering a request by the school district to create the new driveway and until they give the go ahead the project will remain on the school's wish list. The district has found a pro bono engineer to design the driveway to ODOT standards. If this happens soon buses will drop students off adjacent to the main entrance to the school where they will enter the building.. For now the school bus and parent drop off and pick up zone remains on Thirteenth Street just like it was last year.

The work done at Driftwood was partly done through paid contractors and partly through many volunteers who all came together and did a fantastic job. Remember starting next Tuesday morning it's 20 miles an hour through the school zone when the lights are flashing so pay attention and be careful.

### Former Officer Charged

Former Port Orford Police Officer John Fink has been charged with the following two misdemeanor counts by the Curry County District Attorney. Fink had been placed on unpaid administrative leave in May of this year by the City of Port Orford and recently resigned from the department.

Count 1: Official misconduct in the first degree (ORS 162.414, a Class A misdemeanor). The said defendant, on or between September 21, 2008, in the County of Curry and the State of Oregon, being a public servant, to-wit: police officer for the City of Port Orford, did unlawfully and knowingly perform an act, to-wit: take property for his personal use/benefit, which act constituted an unauthorized exercise of his official duties, with intent to obtain a benefit.

Count 2: Theft in the Second Degree (ORS 164.045 a Class A misdemeanor)

– the said defendant, on or about September 21, 2008, in the County of Curry and State of Oregon, did unlawfully and knowingly commit a theft of an ASP baton, of the value of \$50.00 or more, the property of Karl Flores.

The charges were filed on August 20, 2009 in the Circuit Court of Curry County by Robert E. Manske, Coos County Special District Attorney. John Fink will be arraigned on September 21, 9:00am, in the Curry County Circuit Court.

I guess I could really address this letter to the Port Orford City Council, except I’d like everyone to read it, not just them. As quoted in the Port Orford Today! paper, the cost of the Tyler Technologies software will total \$103,455.00 over 5 years. The motion to enter into a contract for \$68,647.00 for purchase of the software passed 5-1. 



### Young Man Seriously Injured

A 17 year old Bandon-area male was seriously injured on Friday morning, August 28, when he was struck by a van as he was attempting to run across Highway 101 in Port Orford. He was transported by air ambulance to Legacy Emanuel Hospital in Portland.

According to Oregon State Police Trooper Brandon Smithers, on August 28, at approximately 9:30am a 1991 Pontiac van driven by Douglas C. Cypert, age 51, from Lakeside, was northbound on Highway 101 near milepost 293 in the area of Pacific High School. As the van approached a pedestrian walking on the shoulder, the male pedestrian suddenly turned and started to run across the highway. Cypert was unsuccessful in trying to avoid the pedestrian and struck him.

The pedestrian, identified as Kyle Lawrence, age 17, from Bandon, was seriously injured and transferred to Legacy Emanuel Hospital. Cypert was not injured.

OSP troopers from the Gold Beach work site are continuing the investigation. Curry County Sheriff's Office, Port Orford Fire Department, and ODOT assisted at the scene. The northbound lane was closed about seven hours during the response and investigation.

### Herzog Escapes from Alcatraz

Port Orford's longtime United Parcel Service delivery man John Herzog doesn't just deliver packages and jog. He is also a twice elected member of the Coos Curry Electric Cooperative Board of Directors. And in his spare time he likes to swim.

On Saturday August 15 John and 900 other people attempted to swim from Alcatraz Island to Aquatic Park adjacent to Fishermen's Wharf in San Francisco. To be fair they were dropped off of a ferry boat for their swim just shy of the island. According to Herzog the swim is about one and a half miles from the island to the mainland. The water temperature that day was 62 degrees. Most swimmers including Herzog wore wet-suits but some chose just a bathing suit. 750 of the swimmers made it to Aquatic Park. The other 150 who dropped out along the way were picked up by a va-

riety of boats following the swimmers. They only had to raise their hands as a signal to be "rescued". Congratulations to John for "Escaping from Alcatraz!"


