### Public Works

The Port Orford City Council met on Thursday, September 17, with Mayor Auburn and City Councilor Scott Luhr absent. Council president John Hewitt filled in for the Mayor and ran the meeting which lasted a bit over one hour.

The Public Hearing on Ordinance 2009-05, Stormwater & surface water management was carried over until the Thursday, October 15 council meeting. It is still with the city planning commission.

Wendy Thomas spoke under citizen's concerns about the problems with accumulations of junk at a few houses and empty lots around town. She said city officials had avoided the issue but now it was time to step in and deal with it. The council is still working on its Nuisance Ordinance and when it is in place will have the teeth to deal with these situations. On a more positive note, Thomas expressed her support for the Hawthorne project at Battle Rock Park.

The council heard from Public Works Director Allan Wagner. He asked them to approve a bid he had received from Pacific Power to repair the generator at the Wastewater Treatment Plan. This is a 150 KW generator and the bid Al-

lan received that he wanted to accept was for \$10,650.39. He reported to the council that the Jefferson Street Manhole Project went well and is complete. Johnson Rock out of Coos Bay was the contractor on this project. Wagner made a point to thank the Public Works crew for their efforts. Thank you Allan for coming back to the City Public Works Department after several years with the Ophir Water District.

Wagner gives the city council a monthly public works report with the figures from the water treatment plant. For the month of August the amount of treated water produced at the plant was 5,852,000 gallons of water. The City metered 2,984,000 of that amount for a loss of 2,867,350 gallons of water or a loss rate of 49%. The water treatment plant was pressure washed and will be painted next. According to Wagner's report 2,423,000 million gallons of waste water was treated at the wastewater treatment plant and according to Wagner it is operating "well".

Each city councilor is assigned as a liaison to various committees and organization and David Smith is the liaison to the North Curry and Port Orford Chamber of Commerce as well as being its president. He reported that 132 people attended the Chamber's Labor Day pic-

nic at Buffington Park. He also reported that on September 29 the Oregon Coast Visitor's Association traveling writer's conference will be in Port Orford touring the town. They will stay at the Port Authority Lodge. The Chamber will hold its annual Masquerade Ball dance and dinner fundraiser on Halloween this year at the Community Building. It will be an over 21 years of age event and the money raised will go to the Chamber Scholarship Fund.

City Councilor Bill McArdle is the liaison to the Watershed and Garrison Lake committees. He described the Garrison Lake committee as having plateaued out and that they wouldn't be meeting very often in the future. The watershed council is not very active at this time as well. McArdle said the possible purchase by the city of the 140 acres on the North Fork Hubbard creek watershed was not discussed. City Administrator Mike Murphy said the City is still looking for a funding source to purchase the property and needs \$19,000.

Under new business councilor Smith made to a motion to enter in a contract agreement with Pacific Power to fix the generator for \$10,650.39 and it passed unanimously. When the job is complete the city public works crew will build an

8' by 16' shed in order to keep a roof over the generator.

The council met in executive session under ORS 192.660(2)(h) consultation with Counsel concerning legal rights and duties regarding current litigation or litigation to be filed. They then returned to regular session.

The council allows for citizen input at the beginning and end of the meeting. Wendy Thomas spoke again this time about all the litter around or near the lake. Jack Pruitt thanked Wendy Thomas for bringing up the trash problem. The council explained that in order for the city to act on a trash or other nuisance type problem a citizen complaint has to be filed with the city.

Work began last week on the bioswale project at Battle Rock Park adjacent to the visitor center and bathrooms. The work is being done by eight inmates from the Oregon Department of Corrections Shutter Creek facility under supervision of a corrections officer from

that facility. The stated purpose of the bioswale is to prevent erosion, purify the water going into Gold Run Creek and direct the flow of water coming out of the parking lot at Battle Rock Park into a catch basin and then down into the creek. The project will include numerous plantings, placement of hay bales, and rock placement with the goal of eliminating the erosion problem in back of the visitor center as well as trapping some of the runoff pollutants before they reach the ocean.

The bioswale project was in large part funded by the Ford Family Foundation. Liza Ehle, who works at By-the-Sea Gardens in Bandon, is the hands on supervisor for the project. She is working for the Ford Family Foundation, the South Coast Watershed Council and the City of Port Orford. On Tuesday morning Ehle was busy working with the inmates on the rock placement and advising them on how to correctly wedge the large rocks together. Everybody was in a good mood and the park will be a better place for their efforts.

## Rotary Club News

“Growing government during a recession is not wise,” warned Representative Wayne Krieger as he addressed the Port Orford Rotary Club on Thursday, September 17. “Emphasis should be on job creation, not increased bureaucracy and taxes.” According to Krieger, 1,500 new State jobs have been added.

Representative Krieger informed Rotarians that although education should be the top State priority, support for K-12 schools was cut 4%. He regretted the closure of the School for the Blind: Krieger acknowledged that it was not accredited, but suggested that fixing the accreditation problem would be better than closure.

In this time of recession, Human Resources case loads have risen, and the new budget shows 29% growth. In fact, the Department of Human Services budget is as large as the State general fund due to supporting Federal monies.

Although Oregon has the highest percentage of veterans per capita, veteran services have been cut 17.4%. State agencies dealing with natural resources and the environment have been cut 12.6%.

The Representative also warned that the Legislature must not count on total recovery of the economy within this budget period. He said that the new taxes which will go to the electorate might be voted down.

Krieger is participating with two high powered, non partisan study groups to recommend legislation for solution of difficult State problems. One concerns foster children, the other concerns avian predator control to enhance salmon smolt survival.

In all, Representative Krieger said it was the worst legislative session for business that he has seen. Our State ranks 50th in the nation in terms of providing a business-friendly environment.

### DEQ Issues \$4,500 Penalty

The Oregon Department of Environmental Quality has issued a \$4,500 penalty to Knapp Ranches, Inc. of Langlois, Oregon for illegally burning prohibited materials at 92361 Knapp Road in Port Orford, Oregon in June 2009.

In May 2009, Knapp Ranches allowed Port Orford resident Jeremy Wayne Engdahl to transport demolition debris from a tear down of two buildings in Port Orford onto property owned by Knapp Ranches.

Engdahl transported at least 180 cubic yards of demolition debris to the Knapp

Road location and then placed the debris in 11 piles encircling a smoldering pile of waste wood. David Knapp, secretary for Knapp Ranches, had earlier ignited the pile of waste wood. At least nine of the piles then caught fire after being placed in close proximity to the smoldering pile of waste wood. Engdahl has also been assessed a civil penalty totaling \$4,250.

The burned debris in the eleven piles included asphaltic roofing, tar paper, carpet, vinyl and vinyl tile flooring, PVC piping, insulation, drywall and glass wool insulation. These materials normally emit dense and noxious plumes of

smoke when burned. Burning of these materials is prohibited by Oregon law as their burning poses a threat to the environment and public health. Particularly at risk from this type pollution are children, the elderly and those with respiratory conditions.

Knapp Ranches has until Sept. 29 to appeal the penalty.
