Wildlife Images By Evan Kramer

It's always time for a trip in our house – any excuse not to get the lawnmower out and coax it into starting. This past Sunday Valerie and I headed out early in the morning for Wildlife Images, a wildlife rehabilitation center near Merlin and Grants Pass. We headed south on Highway 101 to 199 with a breakfast stop at Fely's at the Port of Brookings-Harbor. We've tried her "quarter pound" cheeseburgers so wanted to try bacon and eggs before heading to 199 and then over to Merlin.

Wildlife Images is open to the public on a limited basis. They take people on tours every two hours and try and limit them to 25 people at a time. They prefer that people make reservations in advance which we didn't but there was room on the 11:30am tour so everyone was happy. The purpose of Wildlife Images is to rehabilitate wild animals that have been injured or mistreated or abandoned and get them back in the woods. It's not a zoo per se but has become a de facto type zoo. This is mainly because of human intervention. There are two grizzly bears in residence at Wildlife Images who are brother and sister from Alaska. The daddy bear killed the mamma bear and one her

three cubs. The two surviving cubs were rescued and brought to Wildlife Images but the deal was they would return to Alaska in two years. When their return time came up the state of Alaska refused to readmit them back home. The brother and sister grizzlies must spend the rest of their lives in a fenced in compound. They are fed and treated very well but can not live out the life of a typical wild Grizzly.

Other animals which are permanent residents are a pair of African hedgehogs which obviously can't be let loose in Oregon but were rescued from a wild animal breeder and puppy mill in Texas. There is a cougar who resides at Wildlife Images because its human owner had the tendons in its paws cut so they will no longer retract. One of the two bobcats is there because he got taken home by some young person while he was a kitten and turned into an unsuccessful pet.

The animals that can and will be sent back into the woods are not on display. The reasoning is to not get them acclimated to people. The main purpose of Wildlife Images remains the behind the scene rehabilitation of wild animals so they can go back into the forest or the desert. Money raised from the tours and donations goes to support all the

animals and pay for medical care and some employees.

There are several bald eagles in residence at Wildlife Images; three of which are in an aviary with two turkey vultures. Why an eagle with such an impressive group of white feathers on its head is called a bald eagle is a question worth asking. We were told it is because the bald eagles white mane reminded people of the "balds" which is the name for the wigs the judges in the colonial American time period wore. On the other hand turkey vultures don't have feathers on their heads as they use that part of their anatomy to hammer their way into the carrion they eat as they are scavenger birds

We left Wildlife Images after an informative two hour tour of the permanent residents and headed back to The Redwood Highway for the trip back to Cave Junction. We stopped in at Taylor Sausage Meat Market and Restaurant for lunch. Between being Father's Day and the day before the first day of summer it was very crowded. The tourists are out there and everyone is looking for a way to entice them to stop with festivals and music events, roadside attractions and free water for bicyclists. Next week it's Port Orford's

Smith Requests Recount

Curry County Candidate for Commissioner David Brock Smith filed a request

on June 11 with the state for a recount of the May 18 primary. Smith came in third in that election finishing 33 votes behind second place finisher David Itzen in the non partisan race for commissioner. The recount board at the Curry County Elections Department did their work on June 16 and found two ballots which they changed. Candidate Lucie La Bonte got one more vote and David Smith lost one vote on one ballot while on the second ballot David Itzen gained one vote. La Bonte ended up with 2,468 votes, Itzen received 2,128 and Smith 2,082 in this close election.

There were 417 "under votes" for county commissioner. This means that 417 voters in the county failed to mark the box for any of the three candidates. Smith had to pay a deposit of \$15 per precinct of which there are 27 in Curry County for a cost of \$405. Total cost for the recount of the votes was \$412.01 with him owing an additional \$7.01. The Curry County Elections Department has now certified the results of the primary election with La Bonte and Itzen facing off in the November general election.

Gardening with Gary By Gary Carter

Well, needless to say, it's been a wet spring and a wet year. According to my friends Gary and Cheryl Wickham, who live east of me down by Hubbard Creek, we have had around 111" of rain so far this year. They were told this by Evan Kramer at the Fun Zone, who heard it from someone else, who probably heard it from someone else, etc. I did some checking. According to the Western Regional Climate Center the average rainfall in the Port Orford area from 1963 until 2005 was 71.80". According to the National Weather Service Center in Dreadford, at their weather station five miles east of PO, they have had 94.1 inches so far this year, and their "normal" year is around 118". That's almost ten feet of water, people. As far as I can tell this year's rainfall is unprecedented, and we may be having a record year. Sure seems like it, and a lot of the folks whose families came here with Captain Sebastian seem to agree. Any of you old timers want to weigh in on this please do.

All this rain is great for the local flora and the fish in our rivers, not to mention

the frogs, salamanders, mosquitoes and the extra nutrients washing out to sea, plus those of us on wells that should not have to worry so much, but, if you're a gardener, it's been pretty close to a disaster. Excessive rain will flush any fertilizers you may have applied to your plants out of the soil, so make sure you replenish on a regular basis for good plant health. Now that it's warming up plant diseases such as mildew, rust, black spot on roses, tomato blights and the like are probably going to make an appearance in your yard, if they haven't already. What to do?

There are several ways to save your plants from harmful fungi and the like. Experience has taught me that, with warm weather and high humidity, these diseases will probably show up if they haven't already, so it wouldn't hurt to use one of the above as a preventative. With that in mind and, as I write this with the rain coming down, don't give up. There's still plenty of time to plant and have a great garden this year, and don't forget to grow a few extra vegetables for the folks at the Common Good.

Oh, I almost forgot. The record rainfall for a single 24 hour period in Oregon

stands at 11.65 inches. Guess where that happened? You got it, right here in your backyard in our home town on the 19th of November, 1996. So now, when you are bragging on Port Orford as the westernmost town in the continental United States, or as the first settlement on the Oregon coast, you can throw in our record rainfall for good measure.

With the warmer weather lots of things are blooming in the nursery now, and they all do well on the coast, so c'mon up and take a look. Gary Carter

A gentleman presented a well thought-out proposal (including drawings) to help alleviate some of the safety and scenic problems caused by the Council giving away the use of the end of the Jefferson Street right-of-way to the gallery developer. This caused some interesting "hemming and hawing" among Councilors and Administration resulting in the suggestion that maybe it should be brought up to the developer for his "opinion". Dave Holman, Chairman of the Planning Commission, stated that he had shown the drawings to the gallery developer and discussed the matter with him only to be told that he would not consider it because it might "detract" from the view for his restaurant customers. Well, that seemed to take care of that for 5 heroic members of our Council. One Member tried to bring it up, but once again, she was overwhelmed 5 to 1. I distinctly remember the Council stating that they could rescind, or amend, the "right-of-way" usage anytime they wished. Well ... why don't they wish?

District Attorney's Report

On June 10, 2010 Timothy Maynard appeared in Circuit Court and was sentenced on the crimes arising out of the Burglary and fire at Pacific High School. Mr. Maynard was sentenced by Judge Jesse Margolis. On Count 1, Reckless Burning, he was sentenced to 180 days in jail and was given three years court probation. On Count 2, Aggravated Theft in the First Degree, he was sentenced to 20 days in jail, consecutive to counts 1 and 4 and concurrent to count 3, and he was given two years of supervised probation. On Count 3, Burglary in the Second Degree, he was sentenced to 10 days in jail

and 18 months formal probation. The Court was required to follow the felony sentencing guidelines on the felony sentences which specify the amount of jail time a defendant can get based on the defendant's prior criminal history and a crime seriousness ranking schedule. The court ordered the defendant to pay \$194,579.92 in restitution to Pacific High School. That financial obligation was also levied against the juvenile co-defendants. Defendant was ordered to pay restitution at the rate of \$250 per month. Defendant was also ordered to pay fines and assessments totaling \$628. Mr. Maynard was given credit for time served including the time he spent in custody when he was transported from Oklahoma back to Oregon to face the charges.



We have a book drop on the north side of the building for your returning convenience. You can even call and ask us to renew your items. Computer prints will be .20 a page, an increase that will help defray the high cost of printer cartridges and computer maintenance.

But always free for the asking at the Port Orford Library: cheerful front desk help, magazines and newspapers, books

in print, on CD and on tape, DVDs and videos, best collection of children's books on the Oregon coast, and lots and lots of programs.
